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ECLIPSES IN 1861.

☉ Jan. 10th. ☉ July 7th. ☾ Dec. 17th. ☉ Dec. 31st.

There will be *four* Eclipses this year—three of the Sun and one of the Moon.

I. The *first* will be an annular Eclipse of the Sun, January, the 10th day, 10 o'clock and 36m. in the evening, *invisible* to any part of the United States. Moon's Lat. 9' 47, descending.

II. The *second* will also be an annular Eclipse of the Sun, July, the 7th day, 9h. 20m. in the evening, *invisible* to any part of North America.

III. The *third* will be a *partial* Eclipse of the Moon, December, 17th day, 3h. 24m. Apparent time, in the morning, and *visible*.

IV. The *fourth* and last during the year will be of the Sun, December the 31st, 9h. 6m. in the morning. Middle of the Eclipse, 8h. 13m.; end, 9h. 5m. Duration, 1h. 52m. Quantity eclipsed, 4 digits, and a fraction more on the southerly limb of the sun. This eclipse will be *central* and *total* in Long. 28° 44' W. of Greenwich and Lat. 8° 57' N.

LEGISLATIVE ACTS OF EARLY DATE IN NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

In this age of steam power printing presses and railroads, when a steam printing press is made capable of flinging off the enormous number of 25,000 impressions per hour, it would appear a slow process of preparing and circulating the laws to towns which might have been passed under Lieut. Gov. Usher, beginning March 1, 1692, in the Province of New-Hampshire. But the formidableness of the labor is very much reduced when it is to be considered that there were but four towns to be supplied at this time.

“ACTS AND LAWS

Passed by the Generall Assembly of the Maj.ties Province of New-Hampshire begun at Great Island the first of March, 1692² And continued by adiournment vnto Tuesday 25 July following.”†*

“An Act for the T^rreasurer to pay for the Coppies of the Lawes of this Province.

Be it enacted by the Lievt. Governer Councill and Representatives convened in Generall Assembly, And it

“Precedents and rules must be followed, even when they are flatly absurd and unjust, if they are agreeable to ancient principles. If an act of Parliament had been brought in at the close of a session, and passed on the last day, which made an innocent act criminal, or even a capital crime; and if no day was fixed for the commencement of its operation, it had the same efficacy as if it had been passed on the first day of the session; and all who, during a long session, had been doing an act, which at the time was legal and inoffensive, were liable to suffer the punishment prescribed by the statute.”—*Blackstone's Com., note by Christian.*

Some years since, in the examination of parts of old MS. books, bound in parchent, containing acts passed by the “Generall Assembly,” under the rule of Lieut. Gov. John Usher, in 1692 and after, I discovered an act passed to establish a *post-office* in Portsmouth, and *post routes* to other places.

After reading the act and examining it with some care, I came to the conclusion that in all probability it must be the *first post-office* and *post routes* established in the British Colonies in North-America through regal, and by colonial power.

The next thing was to establish this to be a fact. As the question had not been called up before to my knowledge, there were necessarily some difficulties to contend with in order to satisfactorily show to the public at this period, that New-Hampshire had the right of the first claim.

After examining the Colonial Records of Massachusetts, I sent the following *Query* to the “Historical Magazine and Notes and Queries,” which was published in volume 3, and answers to the same: “Which of the original thirteen States first established a post-office by an act of its Legislature, rates of postage, and routes connecting with other Colonies?”

The above claim as yet has not been refuted.

“*An act for Settling a Post office within this Province.*”

Whereas Thomas Neal Esq. for himselfe his Executer Adm.er and assignes hes obtained from their most Excel-

lent Majest.s full power and authority by Letters Pattents vnder the great Seale of England bearing date the seventeenth day of February 1691 to Erect Settle and establish within their Said Majest.s Colonies and Plantations in America an office or offices for the receiueing and dispatching of Letters and Packquetts according to direction vnder Such Rates and Sumes of money as the Planters Shall agree to give and forasmuch as application has been made to the Lievt. Govern.r Council and Representatives convened in Generall Assembly And it is hereby Enacted and ordained by the Authority of the same That a Post office and officer be henceforth appointed and Settled in Some convenient place within the Towne of Portsmouth for receiueing and dispatching away according to direction all Letters and Pacquetts that Shall be brought thereinto And no person or persons whatSoever Shall presume to carry or recarry any Letter or Letters for hire but only Such as belong to the Post Office deriueing their power and Authority from the afore S.d Thomas Neal Except Such Letters of Merchants and Masters which Shall be sent by any Masters of any Ship boat or other Vessell of Marchandize or by any other person Employed by them for the cartage of Such Letters afores.d according to the respectiue directuos and alsoe precept Letters to be sent by any private friend or friends in their way of Journey or Travell or by any Messenger or Messengers Sent on purpose for or concerning the private affaires of any person or persons And whoever offends against this Act Shall forfeit the Sume of Ten pounds one halfe to their Maj.ties Stowards the Support of the Govern.t of this Province the other halfe to the Post Master Generall * who Shall Sue and prosecute for the Same And it is hereby further Enacted by the Authority afore S.d that all Letters and Pacquetts brought Into this Port from beyond Sea (other then such Letters as are before Excepted) Shall by the Importer be forthwith delivered at the Post house or to the officer belonging thereunto which officer Shall pay a halfe

penney to the Importer for each Letter or Pacquett So delivered and for each Letters So brought in from beyond Sea Shall be payd by the person to whom directed Two pence and for a Pacquett quantity no lesse then Three Letters besides Bills of Ladeing Invoyses Gazetts per four Pence and for each Letter brought from Boston into this Province not exceeding sixpence and double for a Pacquett and So proporconably for Letters on this Side Boston and for all other Letters from beyond Boston Shall be paid what is the accoustomary allowance in the Govern.t from whence they come And it is hereby also further Enacted and ordained by the Authority afore S.d That in case any officer belonging to the Post office Shall omit their duty in keeping constant Posts for the carrying of Letters to the Severall places and Stages appointed or Shall neglect Seasonably and faithfully to deliver forth Letters according to the intent of this Act Such officer so offending Shall forfeit the Sume of five pounds ye one halfe to their Majesties the other halfe to the party agreued who Shall Sue for the Same And all Letters concerning their Maj.ies Service Shall be received and dispatched away with all possible Speed according to their direction free of all charge and without demanding pay for the Same any thing herein before contained to the contrary notwithstanding And it is further Enacted and ordained that the Officer of the Post house having Licence Granted to Retaile Bear Cyder and Ale within doors according to Law Shall have his Excise free and no officer of the Excise shall demand any thing of him for the Same and his person to be excused from watching and warding Provided alwayes that this Act nor any thing therein contained Shall continue in force any longer then Three years from and after the publication thereof.

The Legislature of New-Hampshire commenced their session for the political year 1860-61, on Wednesday, June 6, and closed the session July 4, making a session of thirty days; and passed sixty public acts and twenty-five public resolutions; thirty-six private acts, and twenty-one private resolutions.

APPROPRIATIONS.

One thousand dollars for educating the indigent blind and partially blind of this State at the Institution for the Blind at Boston; \$1,500 for the indigent deaf and dumb persons in this State at the Institution in Hartford; \$3,000 for the maintenance of indigent insane persons belonging to this State, at the Asylum, for such and so many as His Excellency the Governor shall elect and approve: *Provided*, that not less than two thirds of said sum shall be applied to the support of private patients, exclusive of paupers maintained at public charge; \$5,000 for the House of Reformation for the current expenses of the year and indebtedness, and for building a barn, woodshed, workshop, and furnishing mechanical tools; \$5,000 for the purpose of completing the new cabinet shop, and the net income of the State Prison shall be appropriated to liquidate the said sum borrowed by the authority of the State; \$600 for the purpose of repairing the steam engine at the Prison; \$100 for the purpose of cementing the cellar under the cabinet shop; \$100 for the purpose of purchasing books and stationery for the use of the prisoners; \$300 to pay the salary of the chaplain; \$200 in addition to the warden's present salary; \$1,000 for painting and making necessary repairs to the State House.

Nesmith was appointed Associate Justice in the Supreme Judicial Court, on and after January 2, 1860, *vice* Ira A. Eastman, resigned. July 3, 1860, Henry W. Blair was appointed Solicitor for Grafton County, *vice* Charles W. Rand, term of office expired; Josiah G. Dearborn, Register of Probate for Hillsborough County, *vice* Wm. Wetherbee, term of office expired; John M. Whipple, Register of Probate for Coös County, *vice* Albro L. Robinson, term of office expired. June 27, 1860, the following named persons were appointed Sheriffs, the predecessors of whom, the term of office having severally expired; Joseph B.

Adams, for the County of Rockingham; John Legro, for the County of Strafford; Daniel L. Stevens, for the County of Hillsborough; Bolivar Lovell (reappointed), for the County of Cheshire; Wyman Pattee, for the County of Grafton.

The citizens of Pittsfield organized a corps called Mechanics' Phalanx, which promises to be creditable to the militia. In Great Falls the Granite State Guards have been organized, and the commissions were recently issued. Another company in that place, the Bonner Guards, has been revived, and both will undoubtedly soon be, in every respect, thoroughly organized and drilled. Within a few weeks a new company, the Granite State Cadets, has been enlisted in Nashua, and the officers commissioned. This company is composed of some of the best and most energetic men of the city; and such is the character of the men, and such the system and energy with which it has been conducted thus far, as to induce the belief that it will not stand inferior to any military corps in the State.

* * * * *

The organization of the Governor's Horse Guards has been the marked event of the year in the militia of the State. The charter was obtained at the session of the legislature of 1859. Soon after the adjournment, movements

were commenced for enlisting the corps. A meeting of the grantees and others was held in Concord, to accept the charter and take the preliminary steps for enlistments. Committees were selected to attend to the various departments, who reported at a subsequent meeting. On the 11th of January those who had enlisted met, elected their officers and took all the steps necessary for a perfect organization.

* * * * *

In accordance with orders issued by the Commander-in-Chief, and the Colonel Commanding, the corps formed at the City Hall, in Concord, on the 7th inst. (June, 1860), at 11 o'clock A. M., under the command of Lieut. Col. Bellows (Col. Stark being unavoidably absent, on account of lameness caused by the kick of a horse, while parading in a squad at Nashua). They proceeded in column in front of the State House, where they formed in line and received a standard, presented to them by the Commander-in-Chief. They then proceeded to the south end of the city, where they received the Commander-in-Chief, on his arrival from Portsmouth, and escorted him through the principal streets of the city, to the capitol.

* * * * *

The intention of this corps and its design is to perform escort duty to the Governor, annually, on the day of his inauguration. It is probable that they will perform this duty for many succeeding years. The manner in which that duty was performed this year is deserving of the highest compliment and praise. In the ranks of the corps are men of nearly all occupations, and of the highest political, social and business positions of the State. They have united in this regiment for the purpose of testifying their respect to the office of Commander-in-Chief, and of making his inauguration an occasion worthy of the ancient and proud commonwealth of which they are citizens.

From the Warden's Annual Report for the year ending July 1, 1859, to June 1, 1860:

The whole number of convicts committed since the opening of the institution, in 1812, is 1,129; number discharged, 555; number pardoned, 368; number removed to the Insane Asylum, 4; number died, 64; number escaped, 15.

The number committed during the year, 35; number remaining in prison June 1, 1860, 110.

According to the Warden's Report there has been a net surplus over and above the current expenditures, \$3,261.90. This tells well for the new Warden, and bids fair in his efficiency soon to refund to the State the appropriations recently made for re-building a work-shop and making other necessary repairs.

The new shop is built of brick, 156 feet long by 40 wide, two stories high; the lower story is filled with machinery for making bedsteads from planks sawed the right thickness, and from which the work is all done by ingeniously constructed machines, driven by steam power. The second story, the south part, is used for a shoe manufactory, and the north part for the finishing, staining and varnishing the work done in the lower story. The steam engine is placed in a part of the old shop, and adjoining is a wash-room, and further on a tailor's shop; in the wash-room, steam is introduced as a co-worker wherever and whenever it is found to be economy, and the work done more effectually, and with greater facility.

For every letter or written communication of any description, the weight not over half of an ounce, any distance within the United States not over 3,000 miles, 3 cents, *prepaid*; over 3,000 miles, 10 cents, *prepaid*, and for *each* additional $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce or fraction of an ounce add one single rate.

Each letter placed in the office for delivery, only 1 cent, *prepayment* optional.

For advertised letters, add 1 cent to the above rates.

British North-American Provinces, any distance not over 3,000 miles from the line, 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce; over 3,000 miles, 15 cents, *prepayment* optional.

POSTAGE ON PRINTED MATTER.

Each newspaper, periodical, unsealed circular, or other article of printed matter, not weighing over three ounces, to any part of the United States, 1 cent; for each additional ounce or fraction of an ounce, add 1 cent.

For newspapers and periodicals, when postage is paid for quarterly or yearly, in advance, one half the above rates.

Newspapers and periodicals, not weighing over an ounce and a half each, when circulated in the State where published, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a cent.

Weekly newspapers sent free in the county where published.

Small newspapers, published monthly, or oftener, and pamphlets, not containing more than sixteen octavo pages each, when sent in single packages, weighing eight ounces to one address, prepaid, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a cent per ounce or fraction of an ounce.

Books, bound or unbound, 1 cent per ounce for any distance not over 3,000 miles, *prepaid*; over 3,000 miles, 2 cents per ounce. The weight of the book not to exceed 4 pounds.

OBITUARY NOTICES.

Hon. JAMES FARRINGTON, M. D., of Rochester, deceased October 29, 1859, aged 68 years. Dr. Farrington represented his town in the Legislature for the years 1828, '29, '30 and '31, and was chosen to the Senate 1832, '33 and '34. He was chosen Representative to Congress one term, beginning with 1837.

Rev. JACOB C. Goss, of Concord, April 22, aged 66 years.

Elder ——— GEORGE, of Franconia, June 19. Mr. George was riding on horseback near Franconia village, when an electric bolt struck him, and he was killed instantly. His horse was also instantly killed.

SAMUEL BUTTERFIELD, Esq., of Concord, July 3, aged 68 years. Mr. Butterfield was a lawyer, and in the practice of his profession in the town of Andover until a few years of his death; was also engaged in the mercantile business. He represented the town of Andover for the years 1847 and 1848 in the Legislature, and was Councillor for 1851 and 1852.

Hon. MILON C. McCLURE, of Claremont, September 1, aged 42 years. Mr. McClure was a lawyer, and in the practice of his profession from 1851 or 1852 to his death in Claremont. He was Councillor for the years 1855 and 1856. Mr. McClure was a man of strict integrity, and one who gained the good will of all who had his acquaintance. He stood well among his brethren as a man of sound judgment in matters of law.

Hon. JOHN S. WELLS, of Exeter, August 1, aged 56 years. Mr. Wells studied the profession of law in Vermont, and was admitted to the practice. In 1837 or 1838 he removed to Lancaster, N. H., and there practiced successfully in his chosen profession. From 1839 to 1842 inclusive he represented the town of Lancaster in the Legislature; the last year he was chosen Speaker of the House. He removed to Exeter, and was appointed Attorney-General January 17, 1848, and in August the same year resigned the office; was chosen Senator for 1851 and 1852, both of which he was chosen President; was nominee for Governor, 1856 and 1857. In January, 1855, he was appointed to fill out the term of the Hon. Moses Norris, deceased, in the Senate of the United States, January to March following. Mr. Wells was considered a sound lawyer and an eloquent orator. He was a self-made man, getting the means for paying his expenses of education by his industry in his trade, cabinet-maker, which he learned in the early part of his life.

JOHN T. COFFIN, Esq., Laconia, October 4, aged 63 years. Mr. Coffin held the office of cashier to the bank of that place some twenty years; was Treasurer of the Savings Bank, and held other offices of high responsibility. He was an upright and honest man.
