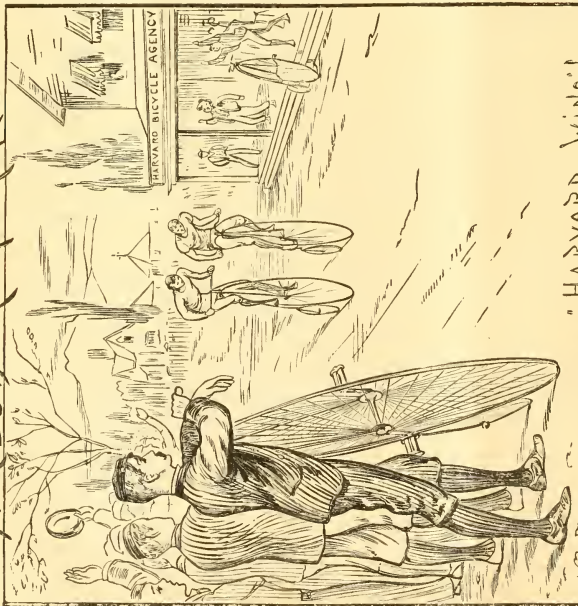

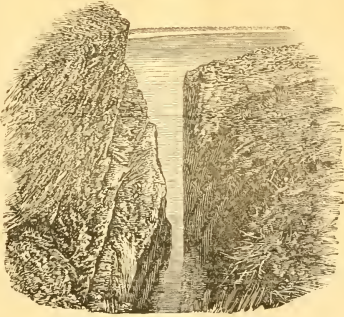
Newport, "The City by the Sea"

The haven of our land.

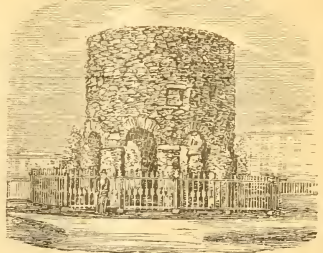

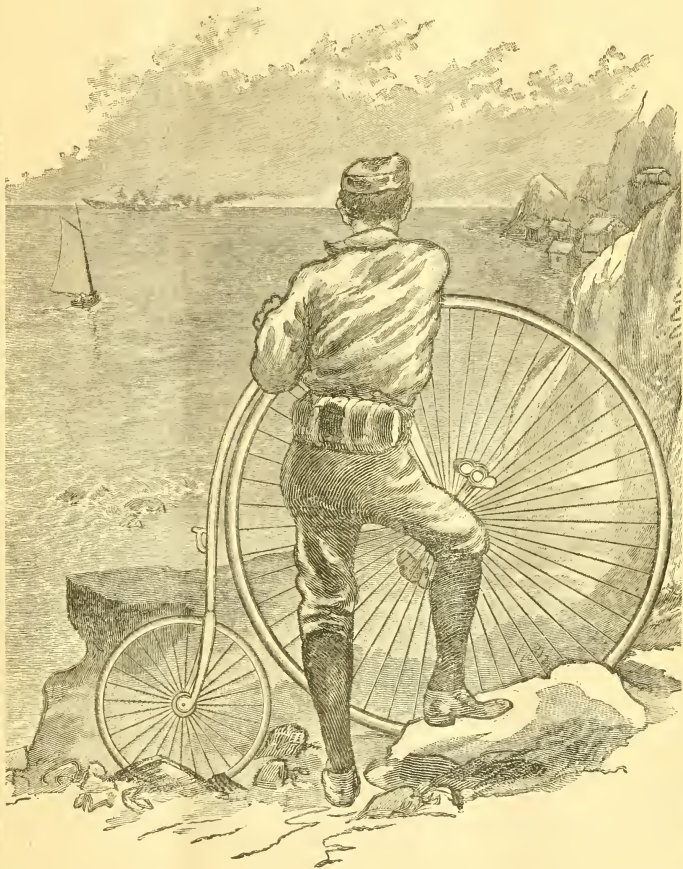
THE FORTY STEPS, NEWPORT.

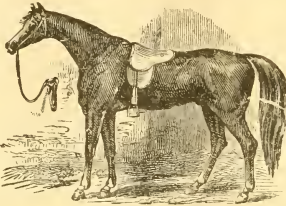

I am a bicycler, and enjoying this season the ripest fruits of recreation. Every pleasant day I mount my graceful "Expert Columbia" and run over the shady roads, feeling the Monarch of Wheels, and forcing Nature to spread out her nooks and corners in endless panorama. Grand old Newport is doubly graceful to a rider of the Modern Pegasus. I rise at early morning, when a new earth seems glittering in the jewelled dew; the birds are singing, and the murmur of the Atlantic adds a full organ to the swelling chorus. A glorious wheel! I

Go forth upon my wheeled horse and list
To Nature's teachings.

A ride on Bellevue Avenue, the one great artery of summer wealth, the most celebrated of streets,—a conservative, truly aristocratic close corporation of residences, whose holders' tenacity has held this avenue against all speculation has kept it for themselves and their posterity. I wheel by the "Old Stone Mill" on Touro Park. The key which unlocks the mysterious history of this ancient landmark was probably lost over Purgatory Cliffs. Whether the hand of Norseman or Anglo-Saxon mixed the lime and mortar which hold the rough stones together; whether it was the scene of lovers' leaps, or the looming tower of forgotten tragedies,—only far-fetched legends can shed a glimmer of light on this pile of unhistorized stone. A few turns of the wheel and I am close to the Channing Memorial Church. I admire the beautiful architecture and the wonderful stained-glass windows, a marvel of crystal-colored handiwork. Among all the glitter and wealth of Newport it is pleasant to find that the House of God stands out in holy magnificence. I wheel away; the rising sun throws its rays obliquely on my whirling wheel, and the nickeled spokes flash the sparkling light of a grand good morning.

On every side stand the summer homes of wealth. Here a stately pile of stone, there a picturesque cottage, both surrounded by well-kept lawns, shady nooks, and opening flowers. Every place stands by itself, original in plan, and rightly claiming its identity. In a few hours these little Edens will be filled with happy parties, and the now quiet avenue will be the arena of dashing teams, a merry rushing stream of life on wheels. But Bellevue Avenue does not contain all the magnificent residences. From the avenue lead many streets, lesser arteries it is true, yet claiming a goodly number of beautiful estates. One can ride for miles and yet see new architectural designs and fresh ideas of summer gardening. Newport is one vast garden, almost surrounded by the ocean, warmed by the generous sun, yet cooled by an ever-fanning breeze.

Ah, Newport is a glorious town, a perfect storehouse of grand good times! One can find a hundred places all vying with each other in beauty and interest. A wheel over Ocean Avenue—land on one side, water on the other; rocks and breakers, hotels and bathing-houses, shade and sunshine, old houses and palaces; an "old curiosity shop" of relics and modern conveniences. I pass the Spouting Rock, famous for non-spouting except when the wild winds urge the Atlantic into a foamy fury. Now comes a long, picturesque stretch of rocky scenery, a black frontispiece fringed with sparkling water, for there is "water, water, everywhere." The old ocean casts up its treasures, and the sunlight gives all a permanent blessing.

But to the beach—the whitest, grandest ocean-platform in the land. The great Atlantic rolls to your very feet, and, bowing in a cloud of foam, pays a

A romantic place indeed! As I look at the rugged sides and dangerous height, it is easy for my imagination to picture lovers' leaps, hair-breadth escapes, and the thousand and one tragedies which fiction if not reality has plentifully woven into its yawning chasm. Leaning on my "Expert," I view the land and water. 'Tis a glorious sight. Before me the Atlantic, its smooth surface dotted with an hundred sails, the whole glistening in an immense crystal panorama; behind me old Newport just awaking from a breezy night, I am happy; and even the saddest of men could not remain within himself before the ruddy, smiling face of Nature.

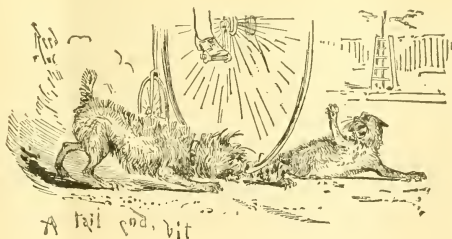
The exercise of my wheel has strengthened my body and cleared my mind. As do my brother wheelmen, I have taken the advice of Pope, and

Postal Regulations.

First-Class Matter. — Letters. The postage on letters not over one half oz. to all parts of the United States is 3 cts.; and for each half oz. or fraction thereof of additional weight, 3 cts. Articles sealed are charged as letters. *Postal Card*, 1 ct. *Drop*, or *Local Letters* (to be delivered in the office where mailed), 2 cts. a half oz., at offices where free delivery by carrier is established; at other offices, 1 ct. Paid letters not delivered at the first office named will be re-forwarded to the place where the owner is if known, or returned to the writer, if indorsed with that request, free. Letters to be mailed from one office to another will not be sent unless prepaid at least 3 cts. The domestic postal card may be sent to Canada without any extra stamp.

Second-Class Matter. — Newspapers and Periodicals to regular subscribers. (No limitation of weight) — When mailed from a known office of publication or news agency, and issued regularly, the postage for each pound, or fraction of a pound, is 2 cts., the matter in all cases to be weighed in bulk at the office of mailing. Newspapers, except weeklies, without regard to weight, and magazines not over 2 oz., deposited in letter-carrier offices for delivery there, 1 ct. each. Magazines over 2 oz., 2 cts.

Third-Class Matter. — On Transient Newspapers and Magazines, Books, Pamphlets, and occasional publications, circulars, engravings, photographs, hand-bills, posters, blanks, proof-sheets, manuscript copy if accompanied with proof, maps, and sheet-music, the postage on one package, to one address, is 1 ct. for every 2 oz., or fraction, the weight of the package being limited to 4 lbs., except single volumes of books, which may weigh over 4 lbs. Newspapers, except weeklies, deposited in letter-carrier offices for delivery there, require only 1 ct. each, without regard to weight; and periodicals require, if under 2 oz., 1 ct., and for any weight over 2 oz., only 2 cts., each.

Fourth-Class Matter. — Letter envelopes (whether printed or plain), cards, sample cards, plain and ornamental paper, seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions, and other articles of merchandise which are not in any way liable to injure the contents of the mail-bag, or the person of any one engaged in the postal service, 1 ct. for every oz. or fraction, the weight of the package being limited to 4 lbs. The name of the sender of any article, or the address, may be written in the package or on its outside, with the word "from" above or preceding the same, or briefly the number and names of the articles enclosed, and addresses may be either written, printed, or affixed, at the option of the sender; but any writing of the nature of a letter or personal correspondence, in or upon any article, will subject it to letter rates.*

Registration. — All mail matter may be registered by prepayment of a fee of 10 cts. for each address, in addition to the required postage.

Money Orders, for any amount not exceeding \$300 in one day, and not exceeding \$100 on one order, are issued in the principal offices, on payment of the following fees: Orders not exceeding \$10, — 8 cts.; orders exceeding \$10, and not exceeding \$15, — 10 cts.; orders exceeding \$15, and not exceeding \$30, — 15 cts.; orders exceeding \$30, and not exceeding \$40, — 20 cts.; orders exceeding \$40, and not exceeding \$50, — 25 cts.; orders exceeding \$50, and not exceeding \$60, — 30 cts.; orders exceeding \$60, and not exceeding \$70, — 35 cts.; orders exceeding \$70, and not exceeding \$80 — 40 cts.; orders exceeding \$80, and not exceeding \$100, — 45 cts. There are over 5,000 money-order offices.

Foreign Registration. — Letters, printed matter, and samples may be registered to most countries for a fee of 10 cts. besides the postage, which must be all prepaid.

Foreign Money Orders. — Money Orders are issued to Great Britain and Ireland for a fee of 25 cts. for amounts not over \$10; for 50 cts. for amounts from \$10 to \$20; for 70 cts. from \$20 to \$30; for 85 cts. from \$30 to \$40; for \$1.00 from \$40 to \$50. To Switzerland, for amounts not exceeding \$50; the fee being 25 cts. for each \$10, or fraction of \$10. To France, Germany, Italy, Canada, and Newfoundland, for 15 cts. for \$10, or less; and 15 cts. more for each additional \$10, or fraction of \$10. Foreign money orders limited to \$150 in one day.

* It is forbidden to send in the mails to foreign countries pieces of coin, jewelry of any kind, articles of gold or silver, or anything subject to customs duty. Packages will not be forwarded at sample rates of postage, unless they are actually trade-samples, and are enclosed in such a manner as will admit of an easy examination of the contents. Articles of merchandise are expressly excluded from the mails to Canada.
