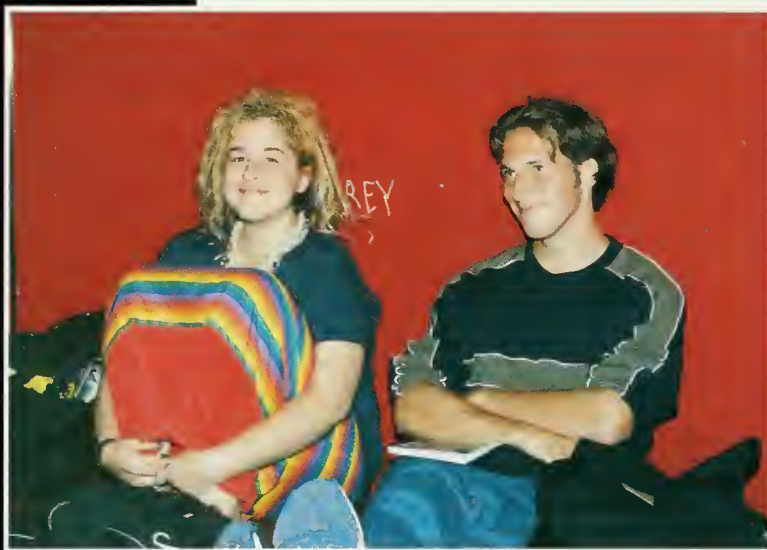

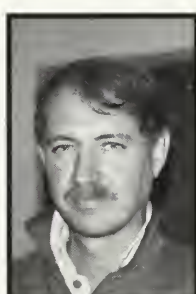
The English Department offers a comprehensive program to students in all grades and curriculum levels which includes classic and contemporary literature. Teachers use works in many genres to

1994 to 1998...four wonderful years. The first day of high school seems like yesterday. If time flies with such swiftness, what could possibly have changed? Well, the world certainly did! In 1994, we were stunned by the World Trade Center bombing in New York. In 1997, we wept at the tragic death of Princess Diana. We cheered at three Olympic games; Lillhammer, Atlanta, and Nagano. Every year since 1994, North has grown in size. The old adage, "the more the merrier," has proven to be only partially true. Each student gives a unique tint to the

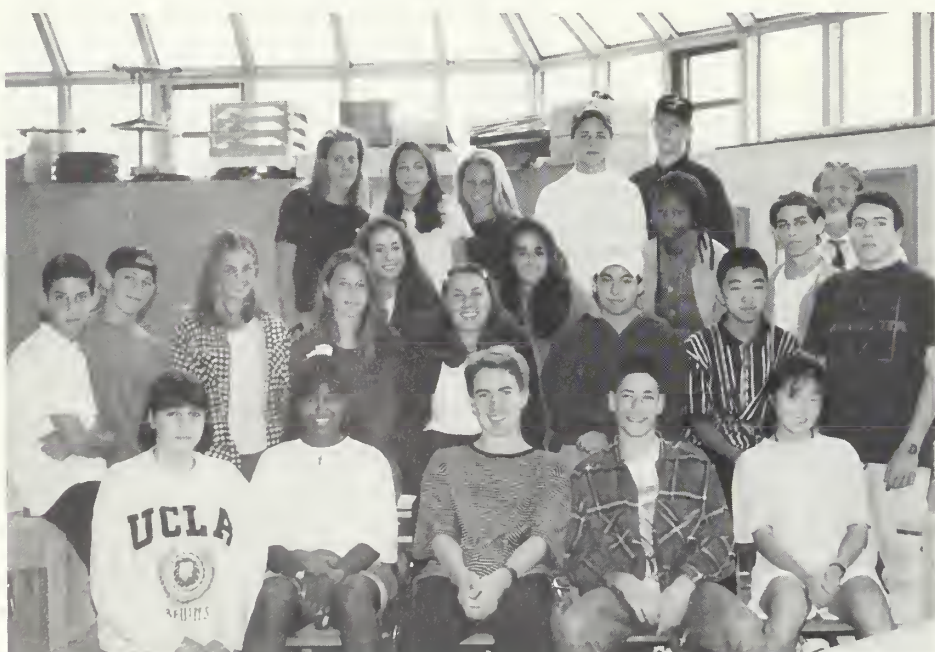


diverse stained glass mosaic of Newton North. However the increase in the number of students has led to larger classes, fierce competition for desirable electives, intolerably long cafeteria lines.

The Newton North Tigers will never cease to celebrate their Tiger energy, their Tiger spirit and most importantly, their Tiger pride.

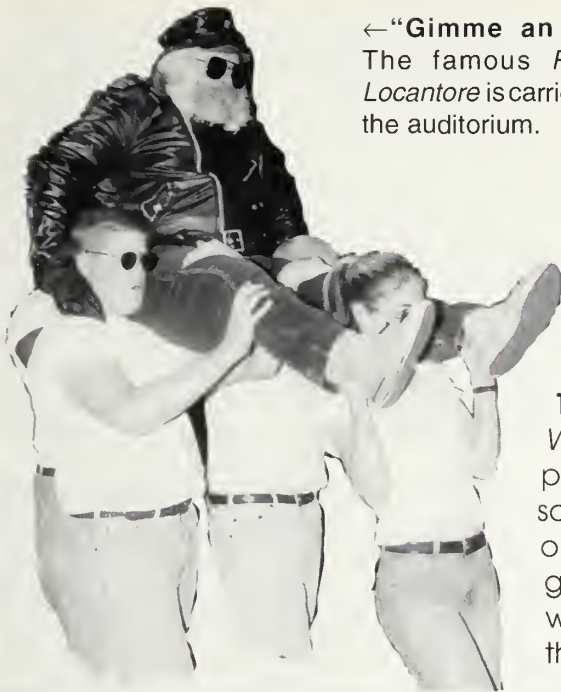

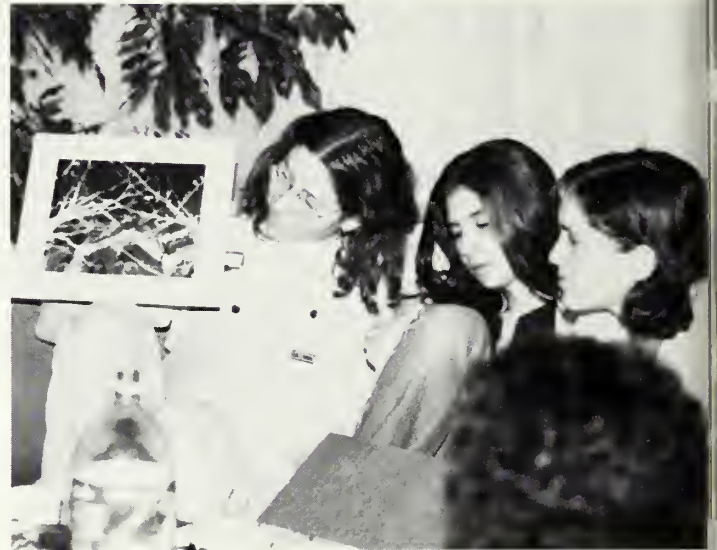
Thoughtprints, Newton North's literary and art publication, publishes a calendar in the fall and a magazine in the spring.

the show on a regular basis, but people know that it is there and that it is good, which is the important part."

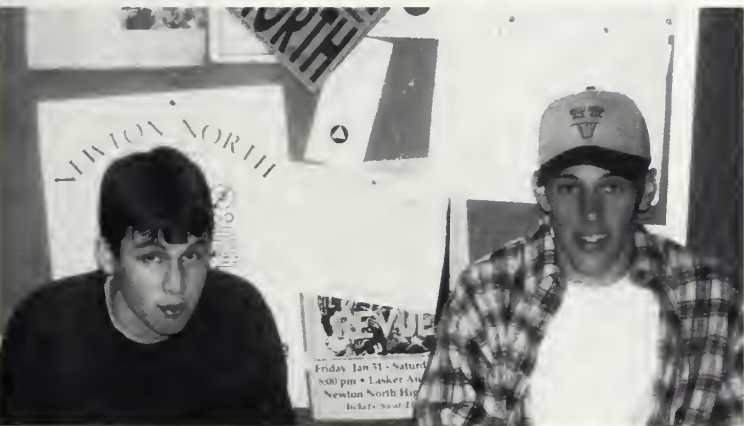

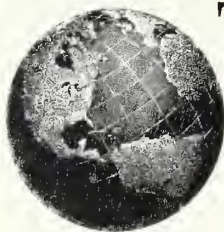

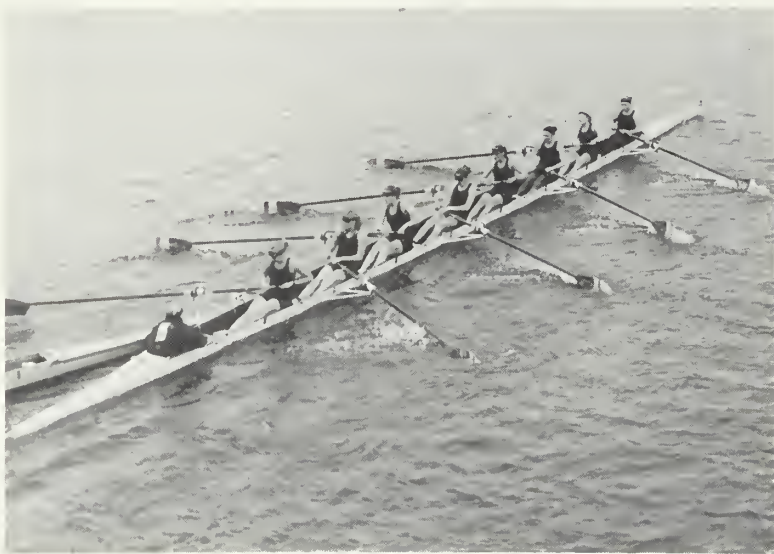

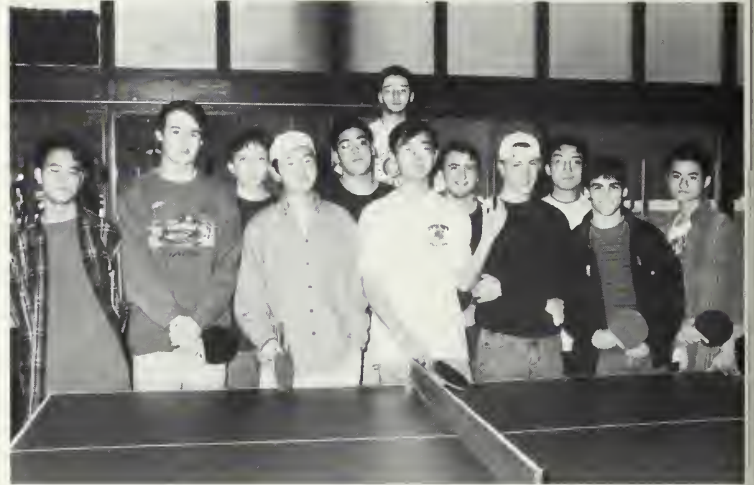

The club, which is for both men and women, played several games this year and hopes to become a full varsity team by 2000.

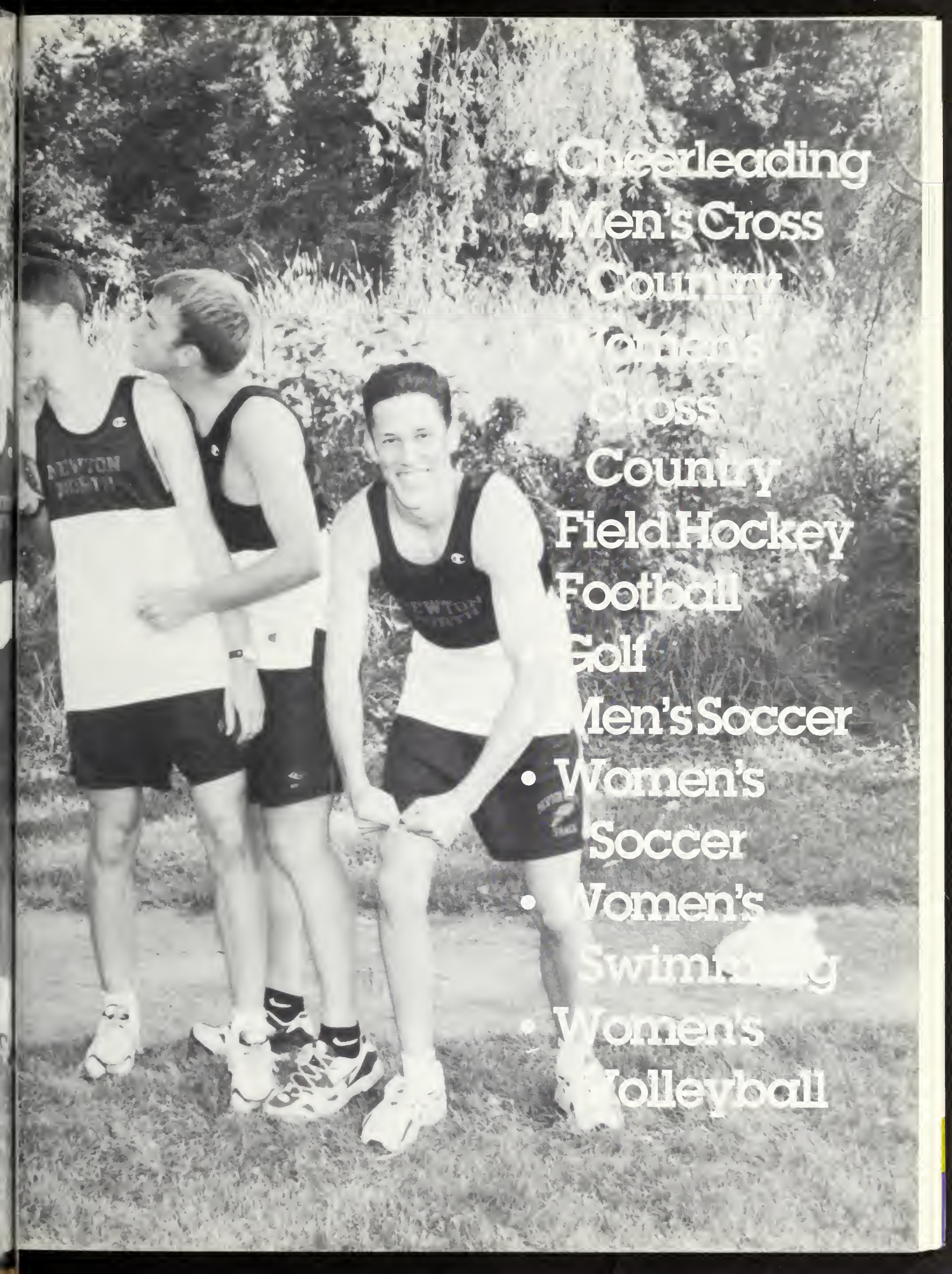

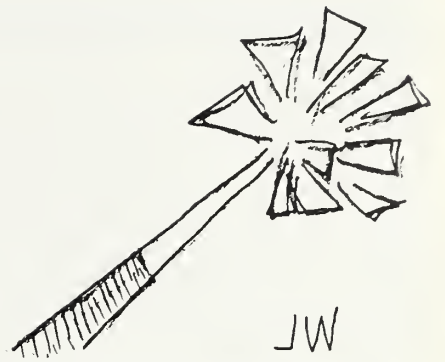

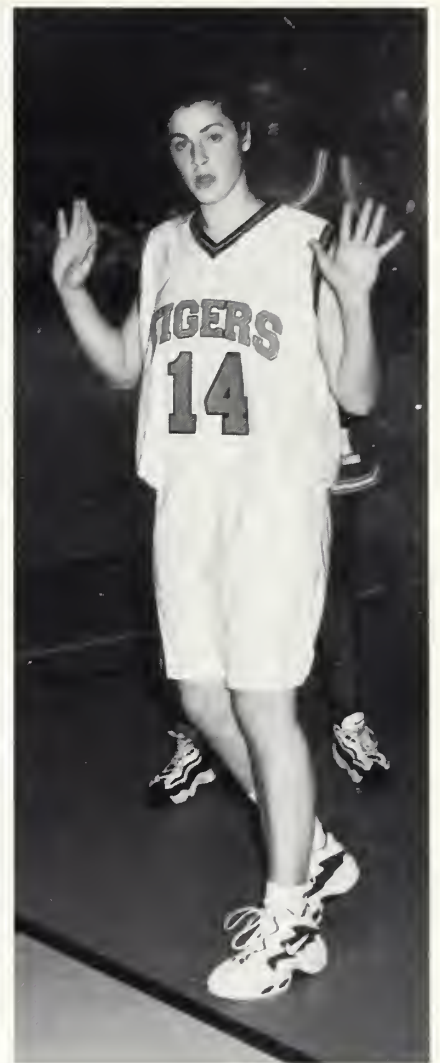

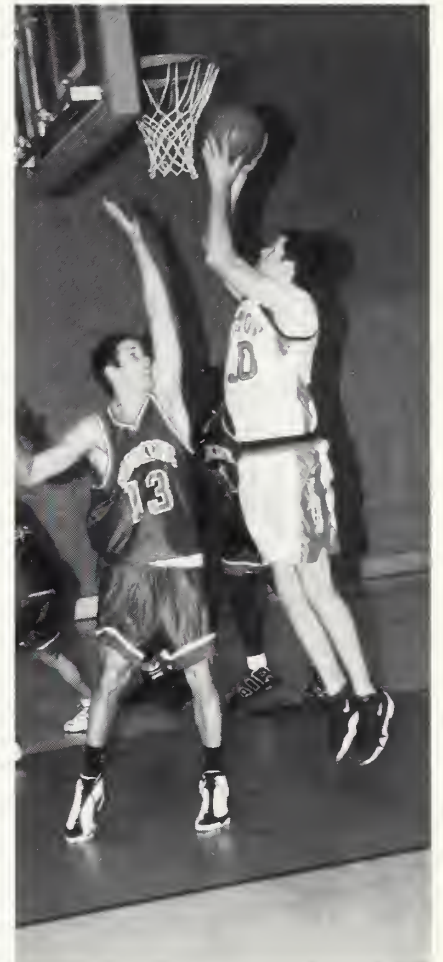

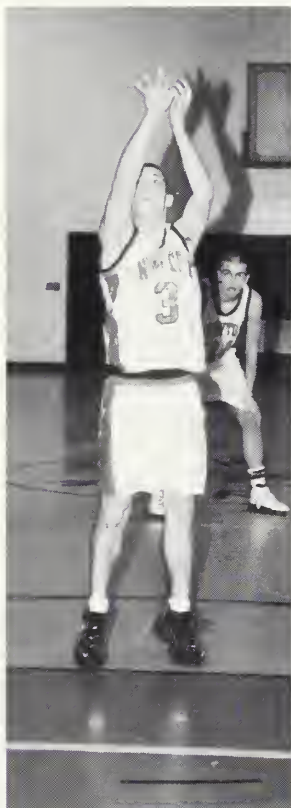

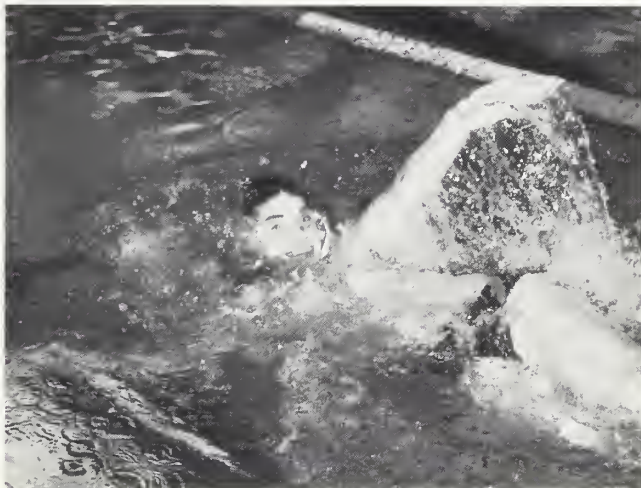

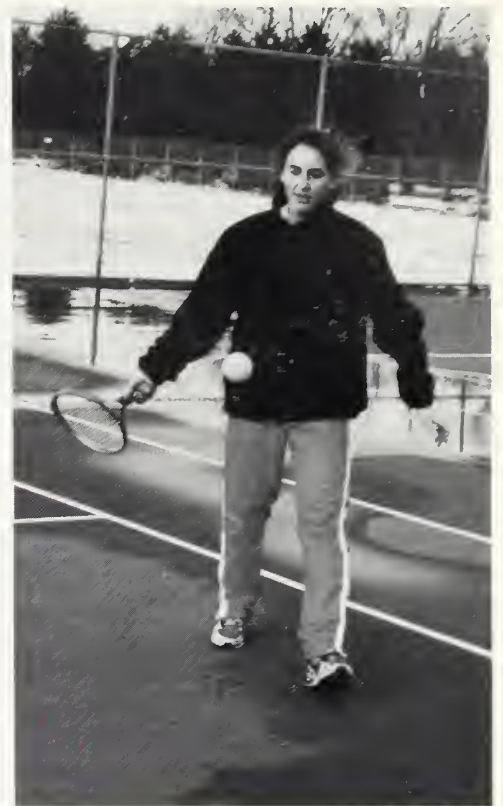

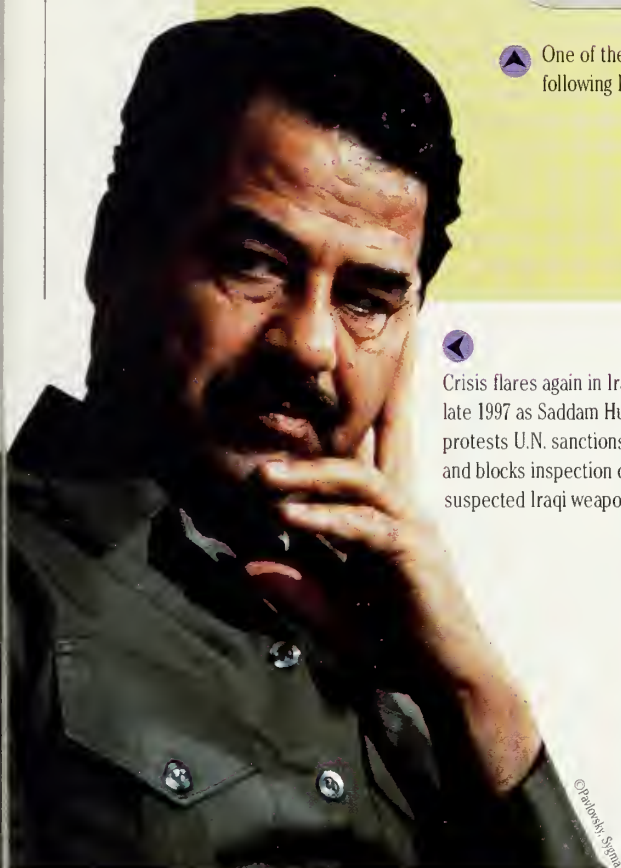

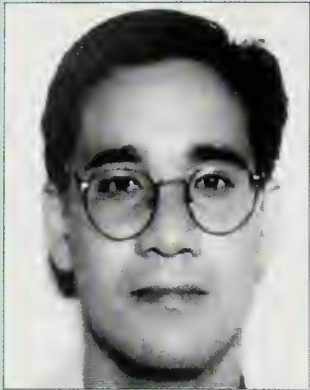

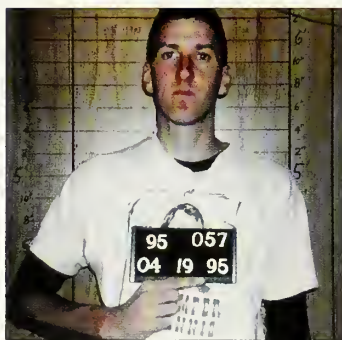

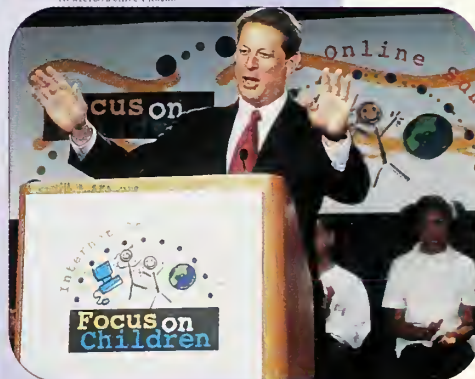

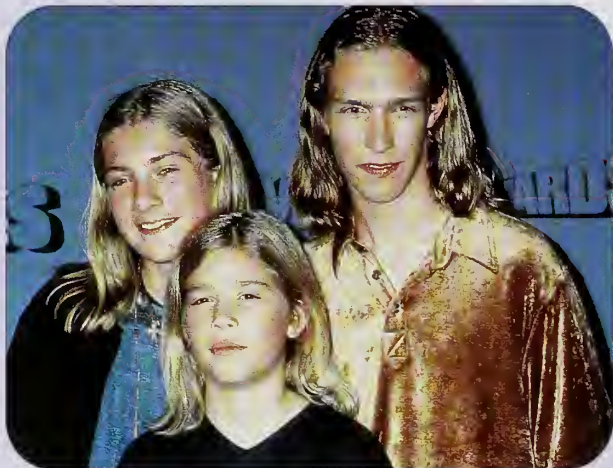

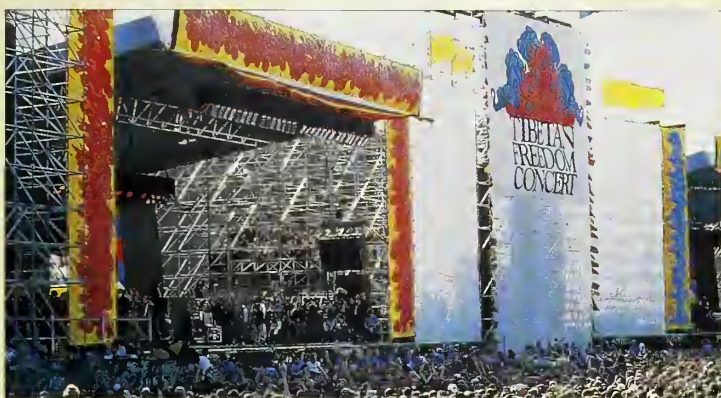

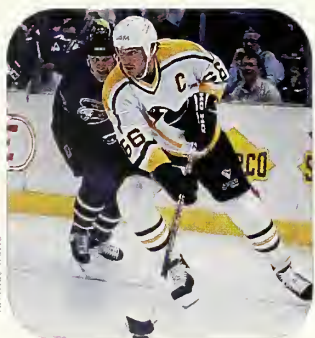

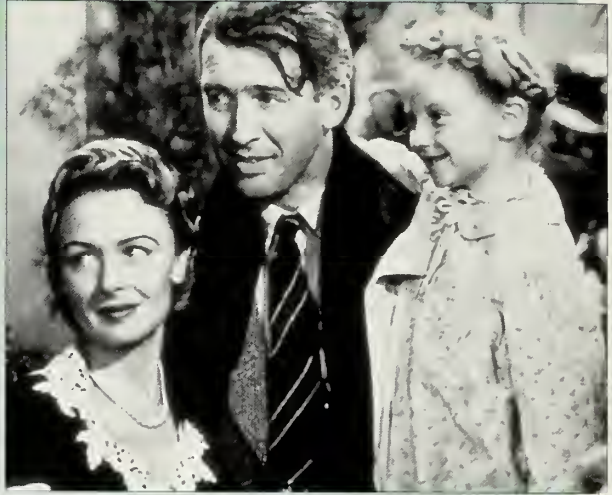
