

THE LINDÉN COLLECTION

Åke Lindén (1927-2013)





Åke Lindén, who passed away on the 13th May 2013 at the age of 86, was a man of international stature having served for a number of years and eventually becoming Assistant General Director of GATT (General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade), now the World Trade Organisation.

He was born in Stockholm but grew up in Karlskoga where his father was a director at A B Bofors. His father travelled widely all over the world and brought back different coins from each country he visited. This is what first inspired Åke's passion for coin collecting. After taking degrees in law and economics, he joined the Swedish Foreign Office and served in Paris, Rio and Frankfurt before moving to the GATT Secretariat in Geneva where he became the leading expert in the international trade systems.

Being a somewhat reserved, almost shy and certainly modest person, Åke was immediately popular with people from all walks of life. His regular driver's appreciation of the man was such that he described him as "the epitome of a true gentleman". After taking his pension in the mid-1990s when GATT became WTO, he became a political consultant and was employed by both the EU and the United Nations as well as individual countries including Malaysia, Kazakhstan, Jordan and Sri Lanka.

In his limited spare time Åke enjoyed spending time with his younger brother and sister and their families, as well as a circle of close friends. He also gave legal advice and financial support to various "good works" and charities freely, which was typical of the man.

It is a wonder that Åke ever found the time to devote to his coin collecting hobby, but time he did find, or make as the case may be, and what is more he went about it in the most methodical and single-minded fashion. One could say that he became a more accomplished numismatist than many fulltime professionals. His numismatic interests were not merely wide ranging, he actually set about collecting every type coin since 1850, as per the Yeoman catalogue, from every country in the world. Being the true collector that he was, Åke would consider any coin that was missing from his collection in whichever condition available. However, when it came to the very rarest items, he did not hesitate to acquire them in top condition at whatever the price. To this end, Åke even went so far as to purchase graded coins in plastic "slab" holders, which was anathema to him because he could not enjoy handling them in the same way he was used to with coins that were "free". Such coins included, for example, the Korean 20-Won and 5-Won of 1906 and 1908 as well as numerous Japanese and American gold coins. His German States gold and silver collection, which is about as complete as one would wish for, bears testament to the methodical way that he went about putting together his collection.

This auction includes several coins from the Lindén collection and these are all marked as such in the lot description footnote.



Old Rus' - Coinless Period, 11th-14th Century

Silver payment bars serve as evidence for a long "coinless period" in the Russian monetary system from the end of the 11th to the middle of the 14th Century. As there were no coins being issued, silver bars became the only form of silver circulating in Rus. Because of their size, the bars could only be used for large payments, tribute, foreign trade, ransom, or investments in convents and monasteries.

Several varieties of silver bars exist, named after the sites of their discovery and circulating region: Kievan, Chernigovian, Novgorodian, Lithuanian and Tartar bars. The inscriptions scratched onto them by their owners – graffiti – are of great scientific interest. In the written sources, the silver bars are called 'grivnas of silver'. From the second half of the 13th Century, the Novgorod-type bars were called 'Roubles', a word which would later designate Russia's main monetary unit.



By the mid-17th Century the Russian controlled areas of Siberia extended to the Pacific; by 1709, the Russian population was 230,000. As local and regional commerce increased there was a greater demand for circulating imported - coinage. During the reign of Catherine the Great, coins were in very short supply across this vast and rugged land. In order to rectify this and to aid the local economy, while at the same time saving on government expenditure, a mint was set up in minerals-rich Siberia to produce a copper currency for the province. Mines and factories were already producing silver and copper in the Altai region at Kolyvan-Voskressensk. The new mint, Suzun would thus be sited by the source.

In 1763, the Ekaterinburg mint, ordered to provide the manpower and machinery for Suzun's production, sent 29 workers and specialists and 13 machines to Siberia. Meanwhile patterns were prepared in St. Petersburg in 1764 (and later Novodels). The Suzun mint was nearly finished in 1765, but fire delayed the first Russian Siberian general coinage until 1766 when denominations from the Polushka to the 10 Kopeck - which took full advantage of the proximity of abundant copper -- were produced. Coinage was to the standard of 25 Roubles to the pood instead of the current 16 to the pood because the Kolyvan copper contained silver and even some gold as a result of crude refining methods. Initially, the coins bore no mintmark, but in 1767, the mintmark 'KM' was added.

Plans were drawn up to overstrike all of the current copper coins to double value, thus a 10 Kopeck coin would be made from a 5 Kopeck, and so on. The new design would show a simple cipher of Catherine II on the obverse. These new coins were scheduled to be released into circulation in January 1797.

Catherine II, though, died November 6, 1796 and the new Emperor Paul I immediately stopped the program. In 1797, he issued a decree to reoverstrike all prepared early coins back to their original value. To do this, both original and newly made dies were used. Original dies bearing the date and mint 1794 AM, 1795 AM, 1796 AM and 1796 EM were employed at the Annensk and Ekaterinburg mints. Newly-made dies were used only for recoinage bearing the dates 1791 EM, 1793 EM, 1794 EM, and 1791 and 1793. These new dies were distributed between the St. Petersburg, Moscow and Nizhy Novgorod mints.

The heroic and greatly respected Johanna Catherina Schubert was born in Nijmegen in 1763. Her tombstone erroneously gave her birth as 1772 (which was repeated on this medal) and also called her the 'Countess of Ross', a title she never used in her lifetime. In 1787, she married John Matthias Ross, director of the Holland Society of Sciences. The couple had one son, but Ross died a year later. The widow Schubert who remarried then divorced, moved to Warsaw with her son where she was known as Mrs. Ross. During the Napoleonic War, she gave shelter to the Dutch soldiers in Napoleon's army, and in 1813, bravely went to the Russian headquarters to affect the release of all the Dutch prisoners of war. Alexander I admired Ross and apparently befriended her.

The image of Nicholas on his deathbed is well-known from a number of contemporary engraved prints but the cataloguers are unaware of any other plaquettes. Seryakov came from Serf stock, joining the military as a child. He served as a bandsman in a Kiev Grenadier regiment, from where he was sent to a clerical job in St. Petersburg. His artistic talents were soon spotted, but his background prevented any promotion and it took a petition to the Tsar before was admitted to the Academy of Arts in 1847 at the age of 23. He later earned the status of "Free Artist" and from 1858 was able to travel in France and Italy for six years. He was elected an Academician on his return. His main works seem to be woodcuts, engraving and book illustration. He taught engraving to a number of students of whom Vasily Vasilyevich Mate is probably the best known. Perhaps he made this tribute to the Tsar as it was to him that he owed his whole artistic life.

Alexander Arkadievich Suvorov (1804-1882) was the grandson of the renowned Fieldmarshal Alexander Vasiliyevich Suvorov, Count of Rymnik, Generalissimo of all Russia, and son of Lt. General Arkadi Suvorov, who fought in the Napoleonic and Turkish Wars. He served as Governor General of Riga from 1848 to 1861, then as Governor General of St. Petersburg until 1866. It was A.A. Suvorov who announced the death of Tsar Alexander II at the hands of assassins in 1881. This medal was issued by one of the many societies of which he was a patron during his time as General Governor of St. Petersburg.

During World War I, Russia proposed to devalue the copper currency yet again, going from 50 Roubles to the pood to 75 Roubles to the pood. A series of patterns were made to that end. But because of the chaos into which Russia had devolved, the new coinage idea was abandoned, and today the 1916 patterns are extremely rare.





As a reply to an inquiry for help from the Russian Government, on Feb. 5th, 1915, the British Admiralty sent the H.M.S. "Jupiter" to Archangelsk. The White Sea was frozen, and 2 Russian regular icebreakers were broken down and out of service. A cargo ship "Thracia", loaded with military equipment and ammunition, got caught in the ice off Archangelsk, and "Jupiter" was sent to the rescue. With great difficulties and hardship, the "Jupiter" got the towline on the "Thracia", and started the tow for Archangelsk. The tow rope parted under the strain, and volunteers were requested to man the longboat, retrieve the ends of the towrope and splice it together, sixteen volunteers on a longboat performed this extremely hard task, all done in under -20C temperatures. As a result, after 2 days of extremely hard work, the "Thracia" was saved and towed for 20 kilometers to Archangelsk. The entire crew of H.M.S. "Jupiter" was awarded with Russian awards, and the list of names was printed in the "London Gazette" on November 19th, 1919. They were also presented to King George V and congratulated.

It is rumored that the Russian Emperor Nicholas II was on his tour in Archangelsk in August of 1916, and personally handed out these awards to all the crewmen of "Jupiter" on August 4th, 1916.

С огромными трудностями, взрывая лед по дороге взрывчаткой, "Юпитер" смог добраться до "Трасии", взять её на буксир, и начать движение в сторону Архангельска. Но от перенагрузки трос порвался, и 16 добровольцев на лодке, при температуре ниже -20 по Цельсию, были отправлены для ремонта троса. В результате двух дней сверхтяжелых работ в экстримальных условиях, "Трасию" удалось спасти, протащив полностью груженный корабль во льдах 20 километров до Архангельска. Вся команда "Юпитера" была награждена русскими орденами и медалями, список имен напечатан в "Лондонской Газете" от 19го ноября 1919г. Они также были официально представлены королю Георгу V.

Comrade Levchuk T. I. participated in the Civil War, and later in the infamous raids for forcefully taking away "extra" food supplies from the well to do farmers. In the late 20's – early 30's he was serving in the Tashkent NKVD (UzSSR), fighting against local basmachi formations and gangs. We found no record of his services later than 1938, suggesting that he either never made it out of Tashkent alive, or was purged during Stalin's Purges of the late 1930's...

Денисову — сотруднику Коллегии по делам музеев и охраны памятников искусства и старины при Наркомпросе. 

The reason for this is that when Zhukov was passing by one of the just liberated villages he noticed a lot of German corps around the trench, and when asked, was told that a single soldier was able to get into Germans' trench during a hand-to-hand fight, and then single handedly held off all the counterattacks by much superior German forces for 6 long hours, until Soviet reinforcements arrived. During those attacks, the Germans threw over 10 grenades into the trench, which he threw back at them. They also tried to use explosives, but he prevented this by killing the officer and the entire group of German soldiers. Before being helped by reinforcements, private Savostyanov personally killed 17 Germans, including an officer. This is definitely one of the best citations we've ever seen.

"В 9.00 17 декабря 1941 года красноармеец мотострелкового батальона 22-й танковой бригады тов. Савостьянов участвовал в составе своего отделения и танковом десан-те на опорный пункт Денисиха. Ворвавшись одним из первых в ту деревню, тов. Савостьянов с двумя бойцами выбил врукопашную и гранатами 7 немцев из блиндажа и, заняв его, упорно оборонялся до повторной атаки своего батальона. В течение 6 часов немцы несколько раз атаковывали блиндаж, забрасывая его защитников гранатами. В том бою разрывом гранаты ранило трех бойцов, а тов. Савостьянов был оглушен. Перевязав раненых, тов. Савостьянов упорно удерживал занятый блиндаж, стойко отражая все немецкие атаки. В это время было брошено противником в него более десяти гранат, из которых девять он выбросил обратно в немцев. В минуты затишья тов. Савостьянов перезаряжал все винтовки своих товарищей, а когда наступал противник, вел из них беспощадный огонь. В последний момент противник решил взорвать блиндаж толом, но метким огнем тов. Савостьянова группа немцев во главе с офицером была уничтожена. В 15.30 этого же дня части 22-й танковой бригады повторной атакой выбросили немцев из деревни Денисиха и освободили тов. Савостьянова, вокруг которого лежала масса немецких толом.

На наградном листе нет командиров батальона, полка, бригады и армии, сразу командующий Запфронта Жуков. Георгий Константинович Жуков в тот день, когда был совершен подвиг Савостьяновым, проезжал через село Денисиху с командиром 22-й танковой бригады подполковником И.П. Ермаковым, и тот доложил ему о том, что произошло в деревне. Г.К. Жуков приказал записать фамилию героя и оформить представление к званию Героя Советского Союза. А вот что писал о том событии сам Сергей Иванович Савостьянов:

"Я был тогда бойцом моторизованного стрелково-пулеметного батальона 22-й танковой бригады. 6-7 декабря 1941 года наши войска перешли в наступление. Враг был отогнан от Москвы на Можайском направлении километров на тридцать пять. Затем наша бригада перешла на волоколамское направление и мы подошли к деревне Денисихе. Это километров 180 от Москвы, около города Рузы. Эту деревню нашей бригаде предстояло освободить совместно с конниками действовавшего здесь кавалерийского корпуса. Операция готовилась тщательно. На исходных позициях в лесу в боевом порядке расположились танки. На одном из них в составе десанта находился и я. В восемь часов утра началась артиллерийская подготовка. После короткого, но сильного артналета, "заиграли" наши "катюши". Сначала двигались мы на танках десантом, затем из-за сильного огня противника мы вынуждены были с танков сойти, залечь и действовать в пешем строю. В ходе боя четыре наших танка были подбиты, мне с двумя бойцами удалось пробиться к деревне Денисиха. Оказалось, что в ней и был немецкий штаб. Кругом много фашистов. Мы забросали их гранатами, а потом подобрались к блиндажу, из которого немцы вели огонь. Мы забросали немцев гранатами и захватили блиндаж. Устроившись за косяком двери, я вел огонь по немцам, которые перебегали по ходам сообщения.

Вскоре немцы поняли, что в блиндаж проникли русские и начали забрасывать его гранатами. Две первые гранаты я выбросил обратно, разорвавшись, они осколками ранили нескольких гитлеровцев. Третья граната разорвалась в блиндаже и ранила трех моих товарищей. Я перевязал их и продолжал вести бой. Начали нас обстреливать из пушек и пулеметов. В блиндаже было много боеприпасов, оставленных немцами, - целый ящик круглых гранат. Я посчитал, что они мне пригодятся. Огнем из блиндажа я уничтожил трех немцев из противотанкового расчета, затем двух немецких пулеметчиков, которые ползли к блиндажу со станковым пулеметом. Затем я убил еще одного немца, перебегавшего по ходу сообщения в сарай во дворе. Всего я уничтожил около блиндажа, в котором находился, семнадцать немцев, в том числе одного офицера.

Вскоре немцы меня обнаружили. С тыла стал подползать к блиндажу немец со связкой гранат. Он крикнул: «Русь, сдавайсь! Капут!» Это нас еще больше разозлило. Нет, думал я, лучше смерть, чем плен, горькую участь его познал мой отец в Первую мировую войну. И я с новой силой продолжал бить фашистов. Одному немцу удалось бросить в блиндаж связку гранат. Я перехватил ее на лету и бросил обратно. Тот немец был убит собственной гранатой, я продолжал оставаться в блиндаже. В ход пошли немецкие гранаты, которые мы обнаружили в блиндаже. Их было достаточно. Через какое-то время в деревню ворвались наши артиллеристы, но многие из них погибли от огня фашистов. Затем пошли наши танки. Начала гореть деревня. Немцы начали перебегать из штаба в другие места. В это время я из автомата уничтожил еще пять гитлеровцев. Наши танки двигались по деревне и бой затихал. Немцы отходили. Вскоре к тому месту, где я находился, подъехал командир бригады Веденичев. Он подошел ко мне, я доложил ему о своих действиях. Рядом с командиром бригады было какое-то высокое начальство. Все, что произошло тогда, потом уточнялось и проверялось, а затем мне присвоили звание Героя Советского Союза.

Всего в том бою в деревне Денисиха насчитали семнадцать убитых фашистов. Я-то сам счет убитых фашистов потерял. Из блиндажа я выбросил девять гранат, которые немцы бросили в меня. Грамоту о присвоении звания Героя Советского Союза, орден Ленина и медаль «Золотая Звезда» мне вручил в Кремле Михаил Иванович Калинин. Затем за этот же

подвиг меня наградили английской золотой медалью...

Указом Президиума Верховного Совета СССР от 21 июля 1942 года стрелку моторизованного пулеметного батальона 22-й отдельной танковой бригады Западного фронта Сергею Ивановичу Савостьянову было присвоено звание Героя Советского Союза.



The Lenin Peace Prize medal to Pritt is only the third ever auctioned in the Western World (and the first De-Stalinization exchange/replacement ever auctioned); fewer than 100 were ever awarded. Famous Laureates include Khrushchev, Castro, Picasso, Brezhnev, and Mandela.

Pritt's 1957 Leipzig honorary citizenship was the twelfth such honor from a major German city ever presented to a foreigner, and is apparently the only such honor to a foreigner ever auctioned; it was the first such honor bestowed by Leipzig, and the first from any major German city to a foreigner, since World War II. Its cleverly elaborate physical format is extremely rare, as most such German city honors were in simple folio format. (Until the 1970's, Nobel Peace Prize diplomas were presented in rolled, rather than folio, format.)



This lot may be by far the most historically significant lot pertaining to the Reichstag Fire ever auctioned.

Denis Nowell Pritt, (1887-1972), barrister, member of the British Parliament (1935-1950), and a Queen's Councillor, is considered the most universally significant lawyer of the middle third of the 20th Century. In 1954, he received a Stalin Peace Prize. (In 1956, Destalinization led to each Laureate being asked to exchange the Stalin Peace Prize medal for a Lenin Peace Prize medal.)

Pritt gained world renown as chairman of the international Legal Commission of Inquiry (held in London) into the 1933 Reichstag Fire, one of the most controversial crimes of modern times whose impact and origins is still hotly debated by scholars. The Commission's *Findings* that the fire was likely started by the Nazis, not the Communists, created a bombshell heard around the world, and probably helped much to stimulate anti-Nazi activism in many countries. Years later, Winston Churchill replaced G. Dimitrov and Pritt as the clear symbol of the "respectable" anti-Nazi movement in the West.

The Findings of this "Counter-trial" were announced by Pritt in London on 28 September 1933, days after the start of the Nazi government's trial in Leipzig of a group of Communists on charges of having plotted the arson. Hitler, who had become Reich's Chancellor weeks before the 27 February fire, had attributed it to a Communist conspiracy, using this charge to justify his immediate suspension of civil liberties guaranteed in the Weimar Republic Constitution. The German trial judge's subsequent acquittal of Dimitrov and other Communist defendants was widely seen as a vindication of Pritt's Findings.

Pritt has been viewed by the Western Right as a classic "fellow traveler", but was never a member of the Communist Party. His services were in the highest demand from business interests, but he would never take a case against "the little guy". He would defend, usually *pro bono*, victims of political prosecutions, the most famous being Jomo Kenyatta, Julius Nyerere, and Ho Chi Minh, whose life was arguably saved by Pritt's intervention in 1931.

The World Peace Council is the Soviet-fronted affiliate of the U.S. Peace Council. It describes itself as a "an anti-imperialist, democratic, independent and non-aligned international movement of mass action." It is a non-governmental organization (NGO) member of the United Nations. The WPC was founded in Prague during a "Peace Congress" sponsored by the Soviets and their Czech and other Eastern European satellites. It was headquartered in Helsinki, Finland until the 1990s when it moved to Greece.

Planned and controlled by the International Department of the Communist Party of the USSR, the WPC claimed to represent 600 million "organizers for peace" worldwide. It declined during Gorbachev's tenure in office, but has revived in recent years. The most recent Assembly of the WPC took place in April 2008 in Caracas, Venezuela, involving more than 280 peace delegates from 123 Organizations from 83 countries.

You acknowledge that the grading of coins is subjective and may vary from specialist to specialist, as the process is by nature an art and not a science. For this reason, we do not automatically accept and are not bound by the opinions of third party coin grading services for any purposes including before and after the sale of a Lot.
- 2.4. If you are interested in a Lot, we strongly recommend that you view it in person before the Auction and form your own opinion of the description of the Lot.
- 2.5. We reserve the right to change any aspect of the published description of a Lot prior to the Auction. Any change may be published on our website, displayed at the Auction, announced by the auctioneer prior to the sale and/or communicated in any other manner.
- 2.6. All copyright in Catalogs, including images, belongs to Auctioneer.

3. ABSENTEE COMMISSION BIDS

- 3.1. If you are unable to attend the Auction personally, you may submit a Commission Bid and we will endeavour to purchase the Lot on your behalf for the lowest price possible. You must submit this in writing using the Commission Bid Form and send it to us by post, fax or email at least 24 hours prior to the Auction.
- 3.2. For all Commission Bids, you must supply your name and address, contact telephone number and email. You must also provide the Lot number and description of the Lot, the amount of your Bid and any other information requested in the Commission Bid Form or by us. It is your responsibility to provide the correct information and to ensure that we have received your Commission Bid.
- 3.3. We do not charge for this service and therefore we will not incur any liability for executing (or failing to execute) the Commission Bid.
- 3.4. If you submit a Commission Bid verbally (whether by telephone or otherwise), we shall not be responsible for any misunderstandings (by either us or our agents or you) in relation to your Bid. All bids made in this way must be confirmed in writing before the Auction.
- 3.5. If we receive two Commission Bids for equal value for the same Lot, the Bid received first by us shall take precedence.
- 3.6. "Buy" commissions and unlimited Commission Bids will not be accepted.

4. AUCTION SALE

- 4.1. This sale is a public auction sale conducted by licensed and bonded auctioneers.
- 4.2. Before the Auction, all potential Bidders must notify their name and address to the Auctioneer and, if required, provide proof of identity to our satisfaction and bank or other credit references. Bidders unknown to Auctioneer are requested to establish credit or deposit 25% of their bids before the sale. We cannot accept bids from minors.
- 4.3. The highest Bidder for each Lot shall be the Buyer. If there is a dispute, the Auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute including re-offering the disputed Lot for sale. Auctioneer reserves the right to refuse any bid he feels is not made in good faith.
- 4.4. A Bidder must submit a bid for an entire Lot and each Lot constitutes a separate sale. The Auctioneer shall, however, have absolute discretion to divide any Lot, to combine any two or more Lots, or to withdraw any Lot from the Auction without giving any reason (including after the hammer has fallen). Bidding shall be regulated at the absolute discretion of the Auctioneer. The Auctioneer has the right to refuse any bid.
- 4.5. All sales are final. Subject to Condition 4.4, the contract for the sale of the Lot is concluded on the fall of the hammer.
- 4.6. You cannot cancel your purchase of a Lot once the hammer has fallen.
- 4.7. Auctioneer reserves the right to include in any Auction its own material as well as material from affiliated or related companies, principals, officers or employees. Auctioneer may have direct or indirect interests in any of the Lots in the Auction and may collect commissions. THE TWO PRECEDING SENTENCES SHALL BE DEEMED A PART OF THE DESCRIPTION OF ALL LOTS CONTAINED IN THE CATALOG.
- 4.8. Auctioneer may bid for its own account at any auction.
- 4.9. All Lots are offered for sale subject to a Reserve.

4.10. Estimates in the Catalog are not limits or reserves but reflect the actual market prices and are intended as a guide for bidders. The actual prices realized may be higher or lower than these valuations. The starting price will be about 80% of the estimates, unless there are higher offers.

5. PAYMENT

- 5.1. The Purchase Price payable by a Buyer is the Hammer Price plus a Buyer's Premium of 17% of the Hammer Price. Buyer of a lot is responsible for paying New York sales tax, unless the Lot is exempt.
- 5.2. Buyer of a Lot shall pay the Purchase Price in full before the Lot can be delivered to the Buyer.
- 5.3. Except where Condition **5.2** applies, any part of the Purchase Price outstanding after the Auction shall be payable by you within 14 days of the date of the Auction, the due date.
- 5.4. The Purchase Price is payable by you in cash in full in US funds. You are not entitled to set-off any amounts that you claim are due from us or anyone else or make any other deductions.
- 5.5. Unless we have agreed in writing otherwise, you shall act on your own account as principal in respect of the sale and therefore if you accept a commission from a third party to bid on their behalf, you do so at your own risk and will remain personally liable (jointly with your principal) to us for the Purchase Price in accordance with these Conditions.
- 5.6. The methods of payment and surcharges are set out below.
- 5.7. If the Purchase Price has not been settled within 30 days of the Auction date interest will be charged at 2% per month from the due date of payment to the date that cleared funds are received whether that is before or after any legal judgment. This is without prejudice to any other rights that we have for non-payment.
- 5.8. If you fail to comply with your obligations under these Conditions, the Lot, in respect of such non-compliance, may at our discretion be put up for sale at Auction or privately and resold. In this case, you will be liable in full and will indemnify us for all losses, costs and expenses (including attorneys' fees and legal costs) incurred as a result, including the costs of the resale and the amount (if any) by which the Hammer Price obtained on the resale is less than the Hammer Price obtained on the original sale of the Lot to the Buyer.

RISK, TITLE AND DELIVERY

- 6.1. The risk of damage/loss to the Lot will pass to the Buyer on the fall of the hammer. Title in a Lot will not pass to the Buyer until the Purchase Price has been paid in full.
- 6.2. Unless agreed by us, you should collect the Lot within 7 days of the date of payment in full. We reserve the right to charge for storage and to resell by Auction or privately without notice to you, if a Lot is not collected. Alternatively, we will send the Lot to you by recorded post. Postage and insurance costs will be charged as additional costs.
- 6.3. Except in relation to Forgeries, you must satisfy yourself that the correct Lot has been delivered to you at the time of collection/delivery. We will not be responsible for any discrepancy which might be discovered after the Lots have been collected. If we have shipped the Lot to you, we will not be responsible for any discrepancies if you fail to notify us within 24 hours of receipt.
- 6.4. It is the Buyer's responsibility to obtain any necessary import, export or other licences required in relation to a Lot.

7. GUARANTEE FOR FORGERIES

- 7.1. Auctioneer is a member of the International Association of Professional Numismatists and in accordance with the conditions of membership, shall provide a guarantee to the Buyer for all Lots against Forgeries on the terms set out in these Conditions ("Guarantee").
- 7.2. For the purposes of these Conditions, a 'Forgery' means an imitation that has been created with the fraudulent intent to deceive in respect of the authorship, origin, date, age, period and the correct description does not correspond with the description in the Catalog and as a result has a value significantly less than it would have been had it been genuine.
- 7.3. You must notify us in writing within one (1) month of you becoming aware that the Lot may be a Forgery. The Lot must be returned to us in the same condition as at the time of sale and you must submit evidence that the Lot is a Forgery, the onus being on you to prove that it is a Forgery.

7.4. You acknowledge that:

- (a) we reserve the right to re-assess the Lot or engage at our expense any expert or authority considered by us at our sole discretion to have the necessary expertise to undertake a re-assessment of the Lot;
- (b) following our re-assessment of the Lot, you agree to be bound by our decision as to whether or not the Lot is a Forgery.
- 7.5. You shall not be entitled to a refund for a Forgery if:
- (a) the grounds for claiming that the Lot is a Forgery is based primarily on a difference of opinion between us and a third party providing coin grading services;
- (b) the grounds for claiming that the Lot is a Forgery is by reason of any damage and/or restoration and/or modification work of any nature;
- (c) the description of the Lot in the Catalog was in accordance with generally accepted opinions of numismatic specialists as at the date of publication or the catalog indicated that there was a conflict of opinion.

- (d) it has been proved that the Lot is a Forgery by applying a method that was unavailable or not generally applied within the industry of numismatics as at the date of publication of the catalog or was disproportionately expensive, in both cases as determined in our absolute discretion.
- 7.6. If we agree that the Lot is a Forgery then subject to:
- (a) you being able to confirm in writing that you can transfer legal and beneficial title to the Lot to us or as directed by us free from all encumbrances or third party claims of any nature; and
 - (b) the exclusions in Condition 7.7,

then the sale of the Lot will be rescinded so that it is cancelled and we will refund the Purchase Price to you in full.

- Your right to return the Lot and receive a refund of the Hammer Price under the Guarantee is your sole remedy against us, our agents and sub-contractors and/or the Seller for a Forgery. You will not be entitled to claim interest on the amount due to you. Neither we, our agents or sub-contractors nor the Seller shall be liable for costs, expenses, damages or any other liability however it arises relating to a Forgery.
- 7.8. In accordance with the restriction in Condition 10.2, the benefit of the Guarantee is personal to the original Buyer and is not transferable to a new owner of the Lot or any other person.

8. EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY AND WARRANTIES

- 8.1. Except where these conditions expressly state otherwise, no warranty as to merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose is given to a buyer concerning a lot and each lot is sold "as is" and as shown with all faults, imperfections, errors of description (including authorship, origin, age, size, condition or value) or lack of authenticity or genuineness and neither we nor the seller nor any of our agents or sub-contractors will be liable for any damages, costs, expenses or any other liability arising out of the same whether or not caused by negligence. The auction is not an approval sale.
- 8.2. Except as provided in 6.3, any claims for adjustment other than authenticity must be made in writing within seven (7) days after delivery of the goods. No Lots may be returned without our written permission. It is the Buyer's responsibility to have the Lots fully insured while in his possession. Our maximum liability under these Conditions is the amount of the Purchase Price paid by you.
- 8.3. Neither we nor any of our agents or sub-contractors shall be liable, whether in tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty), contract, misrepresentation or otherwise:
- (a) for loss of profits or business, depletion of goodwill and/or similar losses; loss of contracts; or
- (b) any special, indirect, incidental, consequential, exemplary or pure economic loss, costs, damages, charges or expenses.
- 8.4. We shall not be liable to you or be deemed to be in breach of these Conditions by reason of any delay in performing, or any failure to perform, any of our obligations in the Conditions, if the delay or failure was due to any cause beyond our reasonable control.
- 8.5. Nothing in these Conditions excludes or limits our liability for any matter which it would be illegal for us to exclude or attempt to exclude under New York law or for our fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation.

9. DATA PROTECTION

9.1. By agreeing to these Conditions, a Bidder acknowledges and agrees that we will use personal information of a Bidder for the purpose of the Auction and ancillary matters, including providing a Buyer's personal details to any other person where necessary to enforce our rights under these Conditions.

10. GENERAL

10.1. These Conditions and the Seller's Conditions constitute the entire agreement between us and supersede all other agreements, understandings, warranties and representations concerning the subject matter hereof. All other terms, warranties and representations, express or implied by statute or otherwise are excluded to the fullest extent permitted by law. No variation to these Conditions shall be legally binding unless agreed in writing by us.

- 10.2. All rights and benefits granted to a Bidder under these Conditions are personal to him and may not be assigned or in any other way transferred to any other person. Any such assignment or transfer will be invalid and unenforceable against us.
- 10.3. A notice required or permitted to be given by either of us to the other under these Conditions shall, in the case of a Bidder, be to the last address notified to us and in the case of Auctioneer, shall be to the registered office of Auctioneer.
- 10.4. No failure or delay by us in exercising any of our rights under these Conditions shall be deemed to be a waiver of that right, and no waiver by us of any breach of these Conditions by you shall be considered as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision.
- 10.5. We may perform our obligations and exercise our respective rights through any of our group companies or assign our rights under these Conditions.
- 10.6. If any provision of these Conditions is held by any court or other competent authority to be invalid or unenforceable, in whole or in part, the validity of the other provisions and the remainder of the provision in question shall not be affected.
- 10.7. These Conditions, as well as the Buyer's and our respective rights and obligations hereunder, shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. By bidding at the Auction, whether in person, by agent, Commission Bid, telephone or other means, the Buyer shall be deemed to have consented to the exclusive jurisdiction of the state courts of, and the federal courts sitting in, the State of New York.

11. INTERPRETATION

11.1. In these Conditions:

'Auction Agent', 'Auctioneer', 'us' or 'we' means A. H. Baldwin & Sons Ltd., Dmitry Markov Coins & Medals, and M&M Numismatics Ltd.;

'Bidder' and 'you' means a person making, attempting to make or considering making a bid for a Lot including a Buyer;

'Buyer' means the person who makes the highest bid for a Lot which is accepted by the auctioneer and if the person is acting as an agent, will be a reference to its principal only if Auction Agent has accepted the agency in writing;

'Catalog' means a catalog, price list or other publication or price list;

'Commission Bid' means an instruction from a Bidder to us to bid on their behalf at the Auction;

'Conditions' means these conditions of sale and any other additional terms notified to Bidders in writing in a Catalog or otherwise (which includes notices displayed at the Auction) or as agreed in writing between Auction Agent and the Bidder;

'Hammer Price' means the amount of the highest bid for a Lot accepted by the auctioneer;

'Including' or 'include' mean including without limitation and include without limitation, respectively;

'Lot' means any item deposited with us for sale at auction including items described against any Lot number in a Catalog;

'Purchase Price' means the Hammer Price plus Buyer's Premium and New York sales tax, where applicable;

'Reserve' means a confidential price below which the Auctioneer will not sell a Lot or will re-purchase on behalf of the Seller or for the account of Auctioneer. Unless otherwise specified at the time of Lot consignment, this will be set at approximately 80% of the Lot estimate at complete discretion of the auctioneer;

'Seller's Conditions' means the terms and conditions of sale between Auction Agent and a Seller for the sale of a Lot as displayed in the Auction room, on our website or available from Auction Agent.

11.2. Headings in these Conditions are for convenience only and shall not affect their interpretation.
