

Excessively Rave Capture of Azov Chervonets 1711



Chervonets (Ducat) 1711. Moscow, Kadashevsky mint. GOLD. 3.40 gm. Bit 16 (R3), Diakov 345 (R4), GM 56.1 (RRR), Petrov (250 Rubl.), Sev 21 (RRRR). Imperial eagle on reverse holding four maps (charts), one in each of its beaks, one in each of its talons. This Excessively rare Ducat was struck following the capture of Azov. The four maps signify Russian sovereignty over the Baltic, White, Caspian and Black Seas. However, following Tsar Peter's capture and the hastily concluded peace with Turkey on July 12, 1711, Azov was returned to the Sublime Porte. As a result, the mint recalled all of the Ducats.

The Finno-Russian statesman, Vladimir Borisovich Frederiks (Adolf Andreas Woldemar Freedericksz; 1838-1927), was appointed in 1897, at the age of 60, Imperial Household Minister. Praised by the French ambassador as "the very personification of court life," Frederiks held his position until the abdication of Nicholas II in 1917. He was responsible for the administration of the Imperial family's personal affairs and living arrangements, as well as the awarding of Imperial honors and medals. During the March Revolution, Frederiks' home was pillaged and destroyed by fire. He lived in Petrograd until 1924 when he was allowed to go to Finland, where he spent the remaining years of his life



Граф Александр Иванович Остерман-Толстой (1770/72-1857)— генерал от инфантерии, герой Отечественной войны 1812 года.

Участвовал в 1790 году под командованием Суворова в штурме Измаила, награждён за отличие орденом Св. Георгия 4-го класса. В феврале 1798 года Остерман-Толстой, приняв к тому времени графский титул и фамилию Остерман, произведен в генерал-майоры в возрасте 28 лет и назначен шефом Шлиссельбургского мушкетерского полка. С началом войн против Наполеона в 1805 году генерал Остерман на театре боевых действий. В 1806 году произведён в генерал-лейтенанты. 27 января (в февраля) 1807 года участвовал в сражении при Прейсиш-Эйлау. Командуя 2-ой дивизией и всем левым флангом русской армии, он сумел сдержать удар на его позиции корпуса Даву и стал по сути спасителем всей армии. Вернулся в строй с началом Отечественной войны 1812 года.



Во время войны он командовал 4-м пехотным корпусом в 1-й Западной армии Барклая-де-Толли, отличился под Островно и при Бородино. В Бородинском сражении Остерман-Толстой участвовал в боях на батарее Раевского, был контужен, но через несколько дней вернулся в строй.

В кампанию 1813 года Остерман-Толстой прославил свое имя 17 августа в блестящем бою под Кульмом, где потерял левую руку, оторванную ядром. Король Пруссии наградил Остермана Большим прусским Железным крестом, наградой, которая за всю свою историю вручалась только семь раз. Остерман вернулся в Петербург в начале 1814 года и сразу же был назначен генерал-адъютантом Александра Й. В этом качестве находился до самой смерти императора. В 1816 году назначен командиром Гренадерского корпуса. В августе 1817 года получает чин генерала-от-инфантерии.

3 Июля 1835 года Высочайше пожалован Орденом Святого апостола Андрея Первозванного.

Born in 1897, Kustoff was an officer in the Kuban Cossack Army. Fleeing the outcome of the Revolution, he arrived in the U.S. in 1919 and applied for naturalization in San Diego in 1920. He apparently suffered severe tribulations (kidnap and torture according to his personal account) when he tried to practice law in California in 1920's. Kustoff studied law at the University of Florida in Gainesville, and went on to be admitted to the State Bar of Texas. He died in 1964 and is buried in the Serbian Cemetery, Galveston TX.

The Lenin Peace Prize medal to Pritt is only the third ever auctioned in the Western World (and the first De-Stalinization exchange/replacement ever auctioned); fewer than 100 were ever awarded. Famous Laureates include Khrushchev, Castro, Picasso, Brezhnev, and Mandela.

Pritt's 1957 Leipzig honorary citizenship was the twelfth such honor from a major German city ever presented to a foreigner, and is apparently the only such honor to a foreigner ever auctioned; it was the first such honor bestowed by Leipzig, and the first from any major German city to a foreigner, since World War II. Its cleverly elaborate physical format is extremely rare, as most such German city honors were in simple folio format. (Until the 1970's, Nobel Peace Prize diplomas were presented in rolled, rather than folio, format.)



This lot may be by far the most historically significant lot pertaining to the Reichstag Fire ever auctioned.

Denis Nowell Pritt, (1887-1972), barrister, member of the British Parliament (1935-1950), and a Queen's Councillor, is considered the most universally significant lawyer of the middle third of the 20th Century. In 1954, he received a Stalin Peace Prize. (In 1956, Destalinization led to each Laureate being asked to exchange the Stalin Peace Prize medal.)

Pritt gained world renown as chairman of the international Legal Commission of Inquiry (held in London) into the 1933 Reichstag Fire, one of the most controversial crimes of modern times whose impact and origins is still hotly debated by scholars. The Commission's *Findings* that the fire was likely started by the Nazis, not the Communists, created a bombshell heard around the world, and probably helped much to stimulate anti-Nazi activism in many countries. Years later, Winston Churchill replaced G. Dimitrov and Pritt as the clear symbol of the "respectable" anti-Nazi movement in the West.

The Findings of this "Counter-trial" were announced by Pritt in London on 28 September 1933, days after the start of the Nazi government's trial in Leipzig of a group of Communists on charges of having plotted the arson. Hitler, who had become Reich's Chancellor weeks before the 27 February fire, had attributed it to a Communist conspiracy, using this charge to justify his immediate suspension of civil liberties guaranteed in the Weimar Republic Constitution. The German trial judge's subsequent acquittal of Dimitrov and other Communist defendants was widely seen as a vindication of Pritt's Findings.

Pritt has been viewed by the Western Right as a classic "fellow traveler", but was never a member of the Communist Party. His services were in the highest demand from business interests, but he would never take a case against "the little guy". He would defend, usually *pro bono*, victims of political prosecutions, the most famous being Jomo Kenyatta, Julius Nyerere, and Ho Chi Minh, whose life was arguably saved by Pritt's intervention in 1931.

The World Peace Council is the Soviet-fronted affiliate of the U.S. Peace Council. The WPC was founded in Prague during a "Peace Congress" sponsored by the Soviets and their Czech and other Eastern European satellites. It was headquartered in Helsinki, Finland until the 1990s when it moved to Greece.

Planned and controlled by the International Department of the Communist Party of the USSR, the WPC claimed to represent 600 million "organizers for peace" worldwide. It declined during Gorbachev's tenure in office, but has revived in recent years. The most recent Assembly of the WPC took place in April 2008 in Caracas, Venezuela, involving more than 280 peace delegates from 123 Organizations from 83 countries.

- 7.8. In accordance with the restriction in Condition 10.2, the benefit of the Guarantee is personal to the original Buyer and is not transferable to a new owner of the Lot or any other person.

8. EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY AND WARRANTIES

- 8.1. Except where these conditions expressly state otherwise, no warranty as to merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose is given to a buyer concerning a lot and each lot is sold "as is" and as shown with all faults, imperfections, errors of description (including authorship, origin, age, size, condition or value) or lack of authenticity or genuineness and neither we nor the seller nor any of our agents or sub-contractors will be liable for any damages, costs, expenses or any other liability arising out of the same whether or not caused by negligence. The auction is not an approval sale.
- 8.2. Except as provided in 6.3, any claims for adjustment other than authenticity must be made in writing within seven (7) days after delivery of the goods. No Lots may be returned without our written permission. It is the Buyer's responsibility to have the Lots fully insured while in his possession. Our maximum liability under these Conditions is the amount of the Purchase Price paid by you.
- 8.3. Neither we nor any of our agents or sub-contractors shall be liable, whether in tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty), contract, misrepresentation or otherwise:
- (a) for loss of profits or business, depletion of goodwill and/or similar losses; loss of contracts; or
- (b) any special, indirect, incidental, consequential, exemplary or pure economic loss, costs, damages, charges or expenses.
- 8.4. We shall not be liable to you or be deemed to be in breach of these Conditions by reason of any delay in performing, or any failure to perform, any of our obligations in the Conditions, if the delay or failure was due to any cause beyond our reasonable control.
- 8.5. Nothing in these Conditions excludes or limits our liability for any matter which it would be illegal for us to exclude or attempt to exclude under New York law or for our fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation.

9. DATA PROTECTION

9.1. By agreeing to these Conditions, a Bidder acknowledges and agrees that we will use personal information of a Bidder for the purpose of the Auction and ancillary matters, including providing a Buyer's personal details to any other person where necessary to enforce our rights under these Conditions.

10. GENERAL

10.1. These Conditions and the Seller's Conditions constitute the entire agreement between us and supersede all other agreements, understandings, warranties and representations concerning the subject matter hereof. All other terms, warranties and representations, express or implied by statute or otherwise are excluded to the fullest extent permitted by law. No variation to these Conditions shall be legally binding unless agreed in writing by us.

- 10.2. All rights and benefits granted to a Bidder under these Conditions are personal to him and may not be assigned or in any other way transferred to any other person. Any such assignment or transfer will be invalid and unenforceable against us.
- 10.3. A notice required or permitted to be given by either of us to the other under these Conditions shall, in the case of a Bidder, be to the last address notified to us and in the case of Auctioneer, shall be to the registered office of Auctioneer.
- 10.4. No failure or delay by us in exercising any of our rights under these Conditions shall be deemed to be a waiver of that right, and no waiver by us of any breach of these Conditions by you shall be considered as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision.
- 10.5. We may perform our obligations and exercise our respective rights through any of our group companies or assign our rights under these Conditions.
- 10.6. If any provision of these Conditions is held by any court or other competent authority to be invalid or unenforceable, in whole or in part, the validity of the other provisions and the remainder of the provision in question shall not be affected.
- 10.7. These Conditions, as well as the Buyer's and our respective rights and obligations hereunder, shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. By bidding at the Auction, whether in person, by agent, Commission Bid, telephone or other means, the Buyer shall be deemed to have consented to the exclusive jurisdiction of the state courts of, and the federal courts sitting in, the State of New York.

11. INTERPRETATION

11.1. In these Conditions:

'Auction Agent', 'Auctioneer', 'us' or 'we' means A. H. Baldwin & Sons Ltd., Dmitry Markov Coins & Medals, M&M Numismatics Ltd., and Ira & Larry Goldberg Coins & Collectibles Inc.;

'Bidder' and 'you' means a person making, attempting to make or considering making a bid for a Lot including a Buyer;

'Buyer' means the person who makes the highest bid for a Lot which is accepted by the auctioneer and if the person is acting as an agent, will be a reference to its principal only if Auction Agent has accepted the agency in writing;

'Catalog' means a catalog, price list or other publication or price list;
