Warning on Doctors of Death

A most startling claim referred to in the US study is that "It is now evident that the American medical system is the leading cause of death and injury in the US".

The pandemic's decades-long duration and multinational extent imply a massive global accumulated toll.

It seems logical to question international media's virtual silence about a government-sponsored global iatrogenic pandemic.

I have written to key Australian media to ask why they do not even use the term "iatrogenesis", let alone forewarn future victims.

Compare how quickly mad cow disease or SARS became household words to the response you get from asking people, "What is iatrogenesis?" I have found many chiropractors, politicians, journalists and patients had no idea what that word meant, let alone a grasp of the extent, duration and toll of the pandemic.

In what turns out to be the gamble of their lives, many thousands of medical consumers stake their lives upon the trust that what their medical

practitioner is about to do will not harm them, and they lose.

Let us compare iatrogenesis to a cliff. The Australian government is so aware of the extent of concern about iatrogenesis that it made Australian taxpayers put an ambulance at the foot of the cliff to indemnify medical practitioners. Government should run a consumer education campaign by putting a factual fence at the top of the cliff that clearly forewarns the patients of their risk.

I have written to the health spokespersons to ask: as the next generation approaches the cliff top, whose responsibility is it to forewarn the thousands who are about to take, and lose, that gamble?

I suggest that Australia's taxpayer-funded, government-sponsored, media-concealed epidemic is ideal material for an article in NEXUS.
