## Dr Holt's Anti-Cancer Therapy

Hi, Duncan: I have been reading a bit about Dr Holt's microwave treatment for cancer [see Letters, NEXUS 11/06], as I am someone who may benefit from this treatment.

First, the TV story has had a huge response. According to the Dr Holt support group, there were thousands of enquiries after the story ran. This shows the need for a treatment that is not damaging to the body.

Dr Holt spoke to an Australian Senate committee in 2000 about the effects of electromagnetic radiation on the body. He said that EMR promotes the growth of cancer cells. He referred to evidence from Western Australia which showed that after TV towers were built, the life expectancy of people with leukaemia became significantly reduced.

Ironically, it is a similar principle that he uses in his treatment. The cancer cells are prompted to grow with the microwaves of 434 MHz; then, with the injection of a glucose-like substitute that has been injected into the patient, the cancer cells are deprived of energy (glucose) and then die.

## The Fluoridation Threat

Dear Duncan: Thank you very much for the brilliant article, "The Absurdities of Fluoridation" by Prof. Paul Connett, and for the open letter to the Premier of Queensland with so many eminent and knowledgeable signatories [see NEXUS 11/06].

The UK is currently threatened with fluoridation as never before. Last autumn, the Water Act 2003 was passed by Parliament. Water companies will be obliged in future to fluoridate when asked to do so by the health authorities; previously they had the right to refuse.

Meanwhile, the medical and dental authorities continue to seriously underestimate the toxicity of fluoride. A review published on the National Pure Water Association's website shows that mass medication without individual consent, using silicofluorides

(untested, unregistered as medicines, part II poisons under the Poisons Act), contravenes the Biomedicine Convention of the Council of Europe and the European Union's fundamental human rights legislation.

This crazy and dangerous practice of fluoridation must be stopped.

## Animal Mutilations Mystery

Dear Duncan: For the past five years I have been working with many researchers from around the world to try to unravel the mystery concerning animal mutilations.

In the course of our research, we have noted that mutilations always conform to a repeated set of characteristics. An eye and ear are often missing, flesh from the jaw is stripped off on one side only, bones are cut cleanly without trace of bone chipping, indicating a saw was not used. The tongue is always severed with a vertical cut deep in the throat, the animal's rectum is always cored out and various internal organs are removed. It is normal for these animals to be subjected to exsanguination, i.e., completely drained of blood.

The phenomenon has been reported not just in the USA but in other countries around the globe, including Russia, Canada, Puerto Rico, Mexico and parts of Europe.

Although victims of the mutilations were generally cattle and horses, in recent years a wide variety of animals including foxes, rabbits, deer, sheep, pigs, goats, mice, badgers, birds, kangaroos, wombats and even domestic pets such as cats.

There are no traces of a struggle. Even in snow-covered ground, there are no tracks or footprints near the carcass. It appears as if the animals are somehow lifted off the ground and later dumped from the air.

## Ancient Culture in Bulgaria

Dear Sir: I'll be glad if you find my articles interesting [see Twilight Zone 11/06, "Ancient Electrical Device Unearthed in Bulgaria"]. I work at a museum in Bulgaria; my first degree was in Art History and my second was in History, focusing on Prehistory.

In the course of my long-time research work on the proto-Neolithic culture that existed during the 5th millennium BC in the Bulgarian lands, I have come across many interesting and unique findings which are authentic artefacts and have not been publicised up till now.

Years ago I found a proto-Neolithic settlement on an area of 20 dkr (20,000 square metres). The people who lived there were the carriers of the most archaic European civilisation, which began around the coast of the Black Sea beside the present Bulgarian land and disappeared quite mysteriously about 3,600 BC. The lodgings were burned to destruction and some of the ceramics were melted to a glass-like substance.

## The Golden Section Explained

Dear Duncan: As you know, I translate for the French edition of NEXUS. I have just finished translating the Letters to the Editor in NEXUS 11/06 into French, and I wish to react to JoNo's letter about the Golden Section. I entirely share his enthusiasm for this particular aspect of geometry, but I am afraid he is rather ill-informed about certain points.

1. The ratio 1.618... ( ) should be written with a few dots at the end because it is an irrational number, thus infinite in decimal form. It is the result of the fraction  $(\sqrt{5}+1)/2$ . As you see, it is a function of five. The geometric construction of the Golden Section is the basis of the pentagram, hence Michelangelo's drawing.

2. The properties of this ratio were first developed by the Italian mathematician Fibonacci (Leonardo of Pisa) in the 12th century. He showed that the geometric progression, the multiplier of which is  $\phi$  ( ), possesses a unique property: each number equals the sum of the two preceding ones.

3. At least 20 years before Schwaller de Lubicz's enormous work (three volumes), Matila Ghyka published a very thorough study of the Golden Section in his *Le Nombre d'Or* (ed. Gallimard, 1931), which is considered to be the basic reference on the matter.

4. I entirely disagree with JoNo's denigration of modern art. Shortly after World War II, French architect Le Corbusier created two geometric progressions of measures, based on  $\phi$ , which he called the *Modulor* sys-

tem. He used them in composition, as have many architects since (your servant included). If Le Corbusier's architecture is not modern art, what is?

And this is but one example, because contemporary painters, sculptors, etc. have made as wide a use of the Golden Section as have their ancestors.

5. French mathematician Jean-Marie Souriau and astrophysicist Jean-Pierre Petit recently showed that the law of Titus-Bode, which establishes a proportional relationship between the distances of the planets to the Sun, is but an approximation. Based on recent, accurate measurements, Souriau has shown that the progression of orbital distances is, in fact, that of the Golden Section!
