Research into Ionised Urine

Dear Duncan: In 1996 I published my book *Water Medicine*, where I mentioned the use of ionised alkaline and acidic water to treat certain diseases. For the last six years I have been doing studies in this regard, including on the ionisation of urine.

At the first world conference on urine therapy in Goa, India, I spoke to several people about the possibility of ionised urine, but to no avail. Am I the only one in the world researching this subject?

In my book *Urine, The Holy Water*, I did not mention the possibility of ionised urine since I was not ready and was unsure with my brief research at that time.

However, I have some reservations in regard to recycling of the acid-forming minerals and elements in urine—like phosphorus, sulphur and chlorine. Most allopathic drugs contain acid-forming minerals.

Ionisation of urine divides the acid-forming compounds and the alkali-forming compounds. Recycling only the beneficial, alkali-forming ingredients of urine for internal use, and the acid-forming minerals for external use, makes not only a lot of sense but also works better.

Pharmaceutical Side-Effects
