Inclusion vs Integration

Phase 1: 2007 – 2012, the integration

Mission East starts to incorporate in its project portfolio (DRR, WASH and Food Security) disability friendly initiative.

(See disability friendly DIPECHO, next slides)

Phase 2: 2012-2017, the inclusion

- ME aiming to become inclusive organisation
- Shifting from project to program in Karnali named: INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT FOR BETTER RESILIENCE and POVERTY REDUCTION
- Mission East together with other NGOs (DCA, DPOD...) working on an alliance to promote INCLUSIVE and RESILIENT communities



Phase 1 applied to DIPECHO

Challenges:

- No valid statistic
- No knowledge on disability by local partners
- No clue how to involve people with disabilities in project

Technical Partnership with Handicap International

- Mapping of people with disabilities
- Data analysis
- Partner training
- Implementation of activities at community, district and national level

Limit of integration

- Lack of participation at design phase for people with disabilities
- Not enough project resources for specific right-base and skill learning
- Risk of increased stigmatisation by community. Why helping them? They are useless!

Door to door mapping in target area during vulnerability mapping









Using data collected

Sensitise partner staff, communication skill






- Encouraging presence of disables people in DRR group

Inclusion of marginalised groups (disabled people, women, Dalits, People with HIV/AIDs, etc...) become central aspect of ME strategic objective for 2012-2017.
