

Evolution of DM Programme in Nepal Red Cross

Coverage : 900 communities/schools in more than 45 districts



Areas of Intervention of NRCS Disaster Management

- **Disaster response** (emergency relief)
 - **Disaster recovery** (early recovery)
 - **Disaster risk reduction** (Building safer communities, organization development, response preparedness as well as organizational and capacity building) **as development initiatives**
 - **Population Movement/Restoring Family Links**

1. Risk awareness and assessment

- VCA, PHAST, Livelihood and PWDs assessment
- Baselines in 900 communities of 45 districts using various tools and approaches
- Using risk assessment as planning of the actions
- Assessments for the institutional planning/strategy
- Emergency assessments
- DRM planning using multi hazard approach

2. Knowledge development

- IEC/BCC materials
- Training (HVCA < PHAST, CBDRR, DM ToT) and public awareness/education (various manuals and guidelines developed more than 27000 people trained in DRR and 18000 in response)
- Research and documentation
- Development of training curricula
- Case studies and best practices







- **PWDs Assessment, awareness generation on DRR, insure the participation on PCM, skill base training and devices support are the major intervention.**

1. Site Selection

3. Community Situational Analysis

- VCA (Vulnerability and Capacity Analysis)
- PWDS Assessment



4. DRM Planning \ Process:

1. Core groups invite representation from all sector of community, CBO member ,local government ,disable, lower ethnic groups
2. Review the result of CSA
3. Analysis of CSA results using problem trees analysis
4. Identify resource needed to implement the plan both those available with in the community those the requires external support
5. Identify committee needed to facilitate the implement the activities

5. Establishment of community Structure

1. The core groups notifies and calls for membership in the CDRMO, while insure the participation from most vulnerable group
3. Proper Orientation for members about the process of the establishment of community structure
4. The general assembly members formed different committees based on DRM plan
5. The CDRMO structure is totally dependent on the decision by general assembly members

6. Community led DRM plan implementation

- ❖ Collect the internal and external resources to implement the DRM plan
- ❖ Provide the skill based training
- ❖ procure and distribute the mobility devices, as per assessment recommendation
