Ward Boundaries.

WARD ONE.—Commencing and including the house and land of Chas. Smith on Main St., thence crossing Main St. and dividing Masonic street, to Center, thence dividing Center St., to intersection of State St., thence dividing State St., past Park, Summer and Spring, to the Williamsburg railroad, thence northerly on line of N. H. & N. railroad to King St. road, to and across the bridge over said railroad, thence dividing bridge road to Slough Hill road, thence at the intersection of Slough hill and bridge road, northerly to Hatfield line, thence east on said line, to and dividing Connecticut river, southerly to a point at near right angles of the intersection of North St. and bridge road, thence to that intersection, thence to and including all the Mill Yard, so-called, to the Conn. River railroad, thence all southerly and westerly of said railroad, past Edwards, Bridge, Holyoke and Pleasant Sts., to Mill river, thence dividing Mill river, past South St. bridge, to a line parallel with the westerly line of Chas. Smith's land, to place of beginning, including all streets and parts of streets within the mentioned bounds and lands.

WARD TWO.—All northerly and westerly of ward one, following the dividing line and commencing at the westerly line of Chas. Smith's, on Main Street, thence dividing Masonic St. to Center, thence from Center to State, thence from State past Park, Summer and Spring to the Williamsburg railroad, thence on line of said railroad to and including the town farm, thence crossing Prospect St., to and dividing Franklin St. to Elm St., crossing Elm St. to northwesterly line of Daniel W. Clark's land, near land of H. G. Maynard, thence directly south to Mill river, thence southeasterly, dividing said river, to and near the Gas Works, or the westerly line of Chas. Smith's land, thence on the westerly line of Charles Smith's land to Main St., or place of beginning, including all of College avenue, Green St., West St., to the iron bridge, and all streets or parts of streets within the mentioned bounds and lands.

WARD THREE.—Commencing at the northwesterly corner of Bridge St., at the line of the Conn. River railroad land, thence on the line of said railroad land to and near the Mill Yard, so-called, land, thence northeasterly to the intersection of Bridge Road and North St., thence in a direct northeast line to the Connecticut river, thence dividing said river, past the

bridge, including Shepherd's island, to and past Hockanum ferry to the mouth and center of Mill river, thence dividing said river to the Conn. River railroad bridge, near Pleasant St., thence crossing Pleasant St. to and on the line of the Conn. River railroad land, past Holyoke St., to Bridge St., crossing Bridge St. to place of beginning, including all streets, parts of streets, and all lands easterly of the Conn. River railroad, with the exception of the Mill Yard and land northwesterly of the before mentioned intersection of North St. and Bridge road, within the mentioned bounds.

WARD FOUR.—Commencing at the middle of the Mill river, near South St. bridge, thence southerly, dividing said river to its mouth at Connecticut river, thence down Connecticut river to boundary line between Northampton and Easthampton, thence all of that part of the town known as Smith's Ferry, to and including land near Mt. 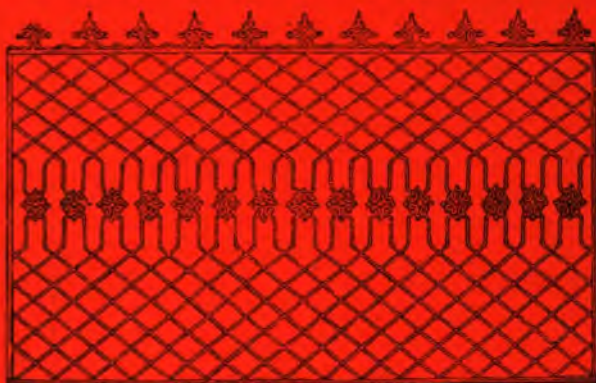

SMITH COLLEGE

The Smith Female College was founded and endowed by Miss Sophia Smith, of Hatfield, who died in 1870, bequeathing for that purpose an estate valued at \$386,608 ; to which, by the terms of the Will, the town added \$25,000. The property now amounts to over \$500,000. The College was dedicated July 14, 1875. It stands on the site of the Judge Lyman homestead, on Elm street, facing Main street. An Art Gallery has recently been added, and Winthrop Hillyer, of this town, donated the handsome sum of \$30,000 for the erection of an Art Building, and also left a bequest of \$50,000 for its permanent endowment.

NORTHAMPTON LUNATIC HOSPITAL.

Is located one mile west of the town, on the right bank of Mill river. The farm and grounds embrace about 340 acres. The building is four stories high, 190 feet deep, and a range of wings on each side three stories high, giving a front line of 512 feet. The floors cover an area of four acres. FORBES LIBRARY.

Judge Charles E. Forbes, of this town, who died Feb. 13, 1881, bequeathed an estate valued at about \$300,000, to the inhabitants of the town of Northampton, to establish a Public Library. In May, the Legislature authorized the town to adopt and execute the provisions of the Will, and by a further act incorporated the library. George W. Hubbard and Oscar Edwards were made a corporation by the name of the "Trustees of the Forbes Library Fund," to hold office until their substitutes and successors are elected in the manner provided by the Will. At a special town meeting held May 31st, it was voted to accept the provisions of the Will; and it was

Voted Further, That the trustees under the Will of the late Charles E. Forbes, appointed by the Probate Court, are hereby directed to permit the whole sum of two hundred and twenty thousand dollars or upwards, which by the provisions of said Will is available for library purposes, to accumulate until the first day of January A. D. 1891, or for such shorter period as the Town by its vote shall at any future meeting limit and direct; to the end that whenever the said period of accumulation shall expire or be terminated, the income and accumulations from said sum may be divided into equal moieties, one moiety to be added to the Building Fund and the other to the Book Fund, as prescribed in said Will

In July, the Trustees purchased the Turner estate, on West Street, at a cost of \$20,000, as a site; \$5,000 of the purchase money was, however, donated by a citizen.

CLARKE INSTITUTION.

The Clarke Institution for Deaf Mutes was incorporated July 15, 1867, and John Clarke, of Northampton, donated \$50,000 for the establishment of the school, which was at once commenced, and the system of teaching articulation adopted. Miss Harriet B. Rogers was chosen Principal. On the 5th of July, 1869, John Clarke died, bequeathing to the Institution the bulk of his estate, which, with the donations made previous to his death, amounted to \$273,500, the income only of which can be used. In 1870, the trustees purchased the present site on Round Hill, and erected suitable buildings at a cost, including land and furnishing, of \$98,825. Additional buildings have since been erected to meet the increasing demands of the Institution.

SMITH CHARITIES.

This Institution was founded by Oliver Smith, of Hatfield, who died Dec 22, 1845, leaving an estate valued at \$370,000. In his will, he directed that a board of trustees should be constituted in the following manner: The towns of Northampton, Hadley, Hatfield, Amherst and Williamsburg, in Hampshire county, and Deerfield, Greenfield and Whately, in Franklin county, shall choose at each annual meeting a person who shall be called an elector. The electors were to choose three persons who should constitute a board of trustees, who were to have the control and management of all the funds. He then set apart the sum of \$200,000, which was to be managed by the trustees as an accumulating fund, till it should amount to the sum of \$400,000. This accumulated fund was then to be divided into three distinct funds: One, of \$30,000, to found the "Smith Agricultural School," at Northampton; the second, of \$10,000, the income to be paid to the American Colonization Society, under certain restrictions. This society failing to comply with the terms of the Will, this fund was incorporated with the Agricultural fund. The third of \$360,000, for indigent boys, indigent female children, indigent young women and indigent widows. The remaining portion of his property was constituted a contingent fund, to defray expenses and keep the principal funds entire.

Since the Will went into effect, in October, 1848, to May 1, 1883, there has been paid to the people of the eight towns named, for

The Northampton Bank was organized April 13, 1833, with a capital stock of \$100,000. Eliphalet Williams was President, and J. D. Whitney, Cashier. In 1837, the capital was increased to \$200,000. In 1865, the Bank was re-organized as the Northampton National Bank, and the capital increased to \$400,000. The Bank has always occupied the present site. In 1866, the building was remodeled and a handsome front put on. On January 26, 1876, this Bank was made notorious by the great Northampton Bank Robbery; when Bonds, certificates, money and other securities, to the amount of one and a half million of dollars, were stolen; the greater part of which, however, has been restored.

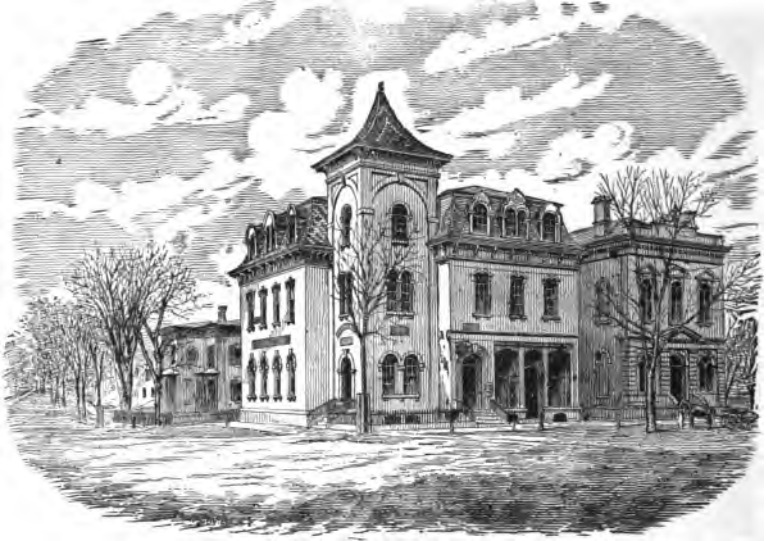

OF NORTHAMPTON.

The Holyoke Bank, from which it derived its existence, was chartered in 1848 with a capital of \$100,000. John Clarke, President; and Thomas Green, Cashier. In 1849, the capital was increased to \$150,000, and in 1850 to 200,000. In 1857, Samuel Williston, of Easthampton, was made President, and William B. Hale, Cashier. In 1864, it was made a National Bank with a capital of \$300,000, and has since been known as, "The First National Bank of Northampton."

In the re-organization, Joel Hayden was chosen President; W. B. Hale, Vice President; and Henry Roberts, Cashier. Mr. Roberts had been for many years Teller of the Holyoke Bank. Mr. Hayden died in November, 1873, and Wm. B. Hale was chosen President, and Mr. Roberts continued as Cashier till his death in September, 1880, when F. N. Kneeland was appointed in his place. Mr. Roberts was a man greatly esteemed and beloved by all who knew him.

In 1865, the capital stock of the Bank was increased to \$400,000, and in 1869, to \$500,000, at which sum it now stands. Since the State law making the Bank directly liable for the tax to the stockholders, the Bank has assumed and paid those taxes to an amount exceeding \$80,000. The total amount of Dividends paid out to stockholders since its organization as a National Bank, is \$810,000 and the present reserve fund and undivided profits amount to more than \$180,000. In 1865, the present banking house, at the corner of Main and King streets, was erected, at an expense of over \$40,000. The main entrance to the banking room is on King street. The vault is built in the strongest manner, and chronometer locks guard its doors. Upon the walls of the Directors' room hang life-like portraits of the three deceased Presidents; John Clarke, Samuel Williston, and Joel Hayden; and Mr. Roberts, the late Cashier.
