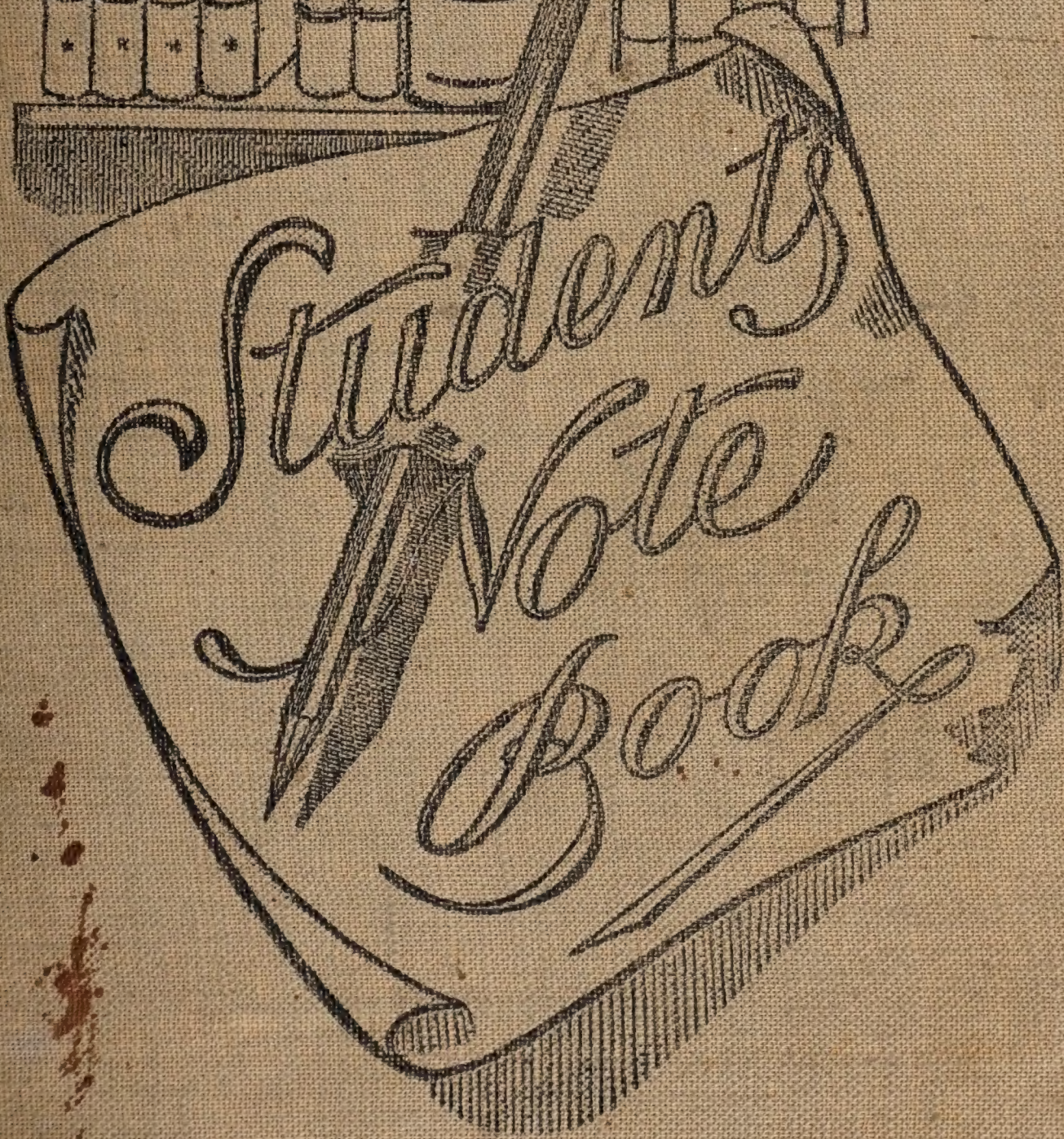

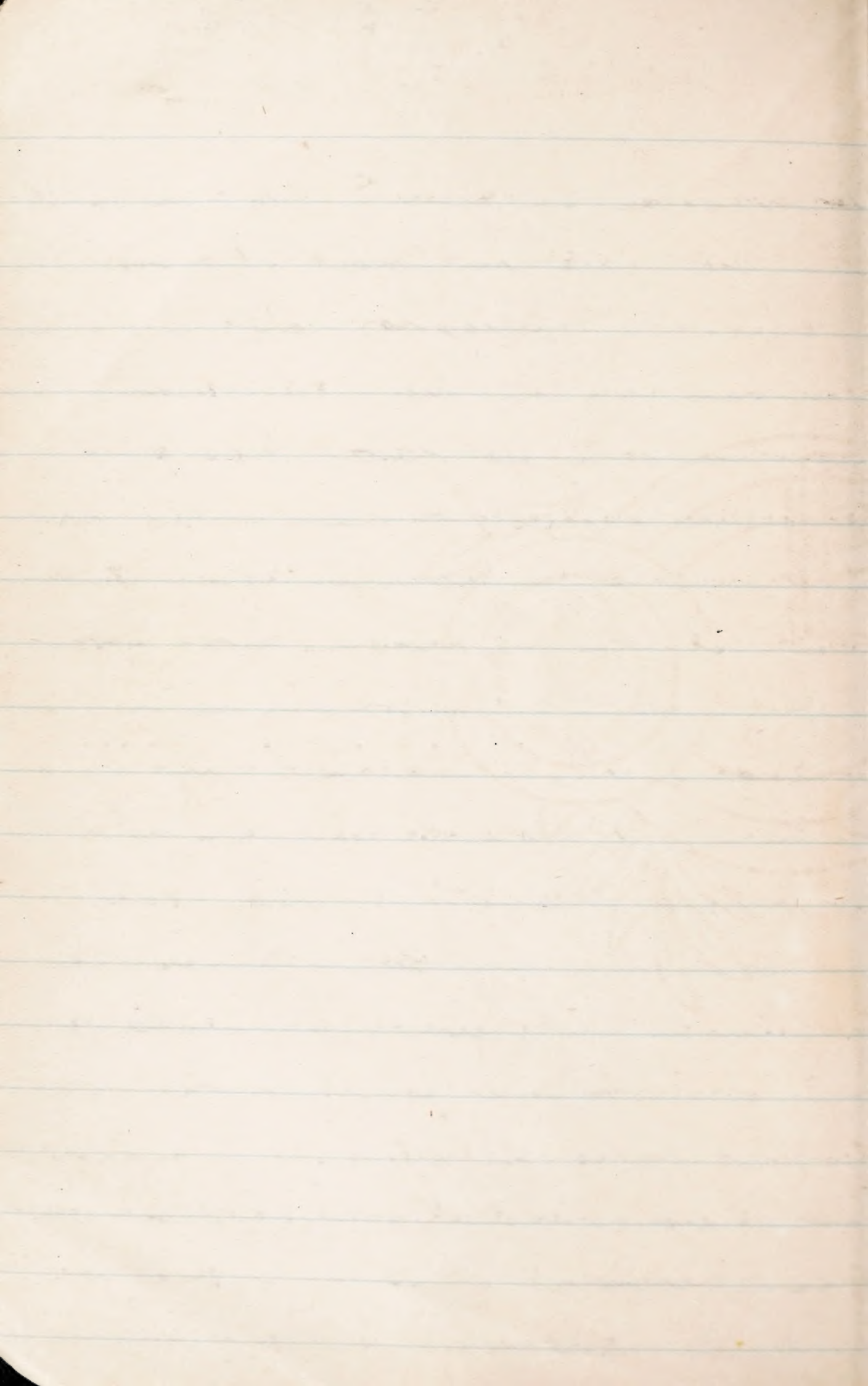

August 5, 1902.  
Coronado Island Expedition.

Near Oceanside, San Diego Co., ( $\frac{1}{2}$  mile north)  
at a tide flat saw flock of about 25  
Wood Ibises (Tantalus loculator); also all  
along ocean front and tide flats from  
Capistrano south are solitary Great Blue  
Herons (Ardea herodias); on grain fields lots  
of Meadowlarks & Mourning Doves, Turkey  
Vulture, Shrikes, Burrowing Owls, Arkansas  
Kingbirds, and on San Joaquin ranch  
one Roadrunner; also Sparrowhawks all along  
the line. At Coronado Beach this afternoon  
saw a flock of House Finches near hotel  
grounds; a good many Belding Sparrows about  
kelp along the beach; several Barn Swallows  
flying among buildings (some juvenals); several  
flocks of Hudsonian Curlew flying overhead  
(also heard after dark overhead); and one  
Brandt cormorant flying across spit over  
Lent City; Mockingbirds, Shrikes, & Hummers.

Aug. 6.

From Coronado Beach to Coronado Ids., 20 saw a few Brown Pelicans, Brandt's Cormorant, Western and Heermann Gull, + 2 Forster Terns, at Cove, where are cabins, on east side of South Id.; saw a few House Finches + Rock Wren. Spent the afternoon on Middle Island, 1 1/2 mi northwest, where following species were seen: Duck Hawk (1 flying overhead); Song Sparrow (only 2 seen on the Island, one secured); House Finch (probably a dozen in all adults + full-grown young; a nest with 3 1/3 grown young 10 feet above ridge in cliff in hole where cobble stone had dropped out of the sandstone conglomerate, nest made of dried ice-plant and lined with gull feathers, ♂ + ♀ shot); Rock Wren (one seen); Black Turnstone (a half dozen on rocks along surf); Wandering Tattler (one shot on rocks but fell in surf); Black Oystercatcher (1 pair, very noisy); Frazer Oystercatcher (one shot, in company with the last); Cal. Brown Pelican

(Young flying over); Western Gull (adults & full grown young); Brandt Cormorant (roosting on reefs, the only species found); Socorro Petrel (nesting in burrows wherever the soil is loose enough to dig into or under boulders; burrows very tortuous often turning aside when stones are met with, sometimes only a few (six) inches long, others as much as three feet long; enlarged cavity at end maybe 4 inches in diameter; egg or young laid on criss-cross foundation of twigs. When egg or newly-hatched young, then one old bird present, but when large young, no adults "at home"; nearly all young; few eggs, 2 or 3 fresh); Black Petrel (3 dug out in company with the last, 2 with eggs, one with young, nesting exactly the same); Am. Raven (one flying overhead); Centipedes (6 in long. by  $\frac{3}{4}$  broad!)

- August 7<sup>th</sup>.

Went up on South Island an hour early in the morning and saw: Am. Raven (1 roosting on ground); Bald Eagle (1 flying along bluff); Hudsonian Curlew (2 flying over); Song Sparrow (4 feeding on old tent-sight); House Finch (Perhaps eight in all among cactus and scrub bushes); Rock Wren (four in usual haunts - rocky ridges). Took

launch over to North Island, where found: Black Petrel (adult with egg, and 2 juveniles dug out, but on account of rocky soil they were there hard to get out; od of petrel oil was strong all over the island & burrows showed under rocks almost everywhere); Cassin's Auklet (2 large colonies of burrows found on north end, but all deserted; probably too late one dead bird found); Black Oystercatcher (several seen on southwest side along surf); Frasier Oystercatcher (one seen with last);



Cal. Brown Pelican (nesting nearly everywhere around steep sides of island, at south end clear to top; nests built up of weeds & sticks a foot or more leaving a flat top; young mostly able to fly, but one nest with two white downy young about  $\frac{1}{3}$  grown); Brandt Cormorant (Abundant all around island; colonies of old nest on steep sides); Farallone Cormorant (a few nest on top of south end; nests built up on rocks & bushes, substantially composed of weeds & sticks; one contained two apparently fresh eggs, another two eggs and two newly-hatched young, and several more with half-grown young); Dark Hawk (one seen flying); Western Gull (Abundant, young mostly full grown; some smaller seen stumbling among the weeds and rocks); Heermann Gull (immatures only seen off the island); House Finch (one seen on top of island);

Rock Wren (fairly numerous); Song Sparrow  
(Common & singing among small bushes  
on north-east slope of north end). On  
way back to Cove on South Island, saw  
two Spotted Sandpipers on rocks in surf.  
At Coronado Hotel Grounds this evening saw  
2 Calif. Thrashers & flocks of Brewer  
Blackbirds; Anna Hummers, Barn Swallows,  
Mockingbirds, Cal. Shrikes, etc.

August 8th.

at San Diego saw a Belted Kingfisher  
on rigging of vessel in Bay; lots of  
Hummers around wild tobacco plants.

On way to Los Angeles saw West Red-tail  
carrying squirrel (near Ocean side)

### Palo Alto.

Sept. 14. Walk with Fisher to Atalanta Villa  
 Hot of Smokey. Heard note of Intermediate Sparrow  
 first for season, among bushes near "oval". Took  
 especial note of Trees & Shrubs: Quercus lobata  
 (with very large lobed leaves); Q. Douglasi (Blue Oak,  
 leaves smaller and only dentate); Q. agrifolia;

Aesculus californica (Buckeye); Rhamnus californicus  
(with black berry and leaf like bay); Umbellularia  
californica (bay); Heteromeles arbutifolia ("Holly");  
Rhus diversiloba (poison-oak); Arbutus menziesii;  
Populus trichocarpa; Salix lasiolepis;  
Alnus rhombifolia; Symphoricarpos racemosus  
(Snow-berry); Acer californicum (Maple, "Negundo",  
"box elder"); Acer macrophyllum; Adenostoma  
californica ("greasewood").

Saw several  
violet-green Swallows flying southeast high overhead;  
a scattering crowd of birds in alders &  
oaks along creek included Pileolated Warbler (3),  
Santa Cruz Chickadees, Plain Titmouses, Bush-tits  
and 2 Hutton Vireos. Saw among oaks  
near stock-farm Red-shafted Flicker, West. Bluebird,  
Cal. Woodpecker, Brewer Blackbird, Black Phoebe,  
House Finch, Ark. Goldfinch, Calif. Thrasher,  
Spurred Towhee, Calif. Towhee, Vigors Wren,  
Int. Wren-tit, etc.

Sept. 16 - first Fox Sparrow this forenoon under raspberry bushes  
in back yard (dark brown back ∴ *P. i. meruloides*).

Sept. 23 - Saw first Say Phoebe flying about the tile roofs of the quad buildings.

Sept. 24 - Killdeers have arrived on the grass-patch at the oval; and Intermediate Sparrows in town.

Sept. 27. Clear. Warm & windy.

around reservoir site); Vigors Wren; Audubon  
 Warbler; Willow Goldfinch (flocks feeds on oak  
 buds); Arkansas Goldfinch; Gambel & Golden-crow  
 Sparrows; Brewer Blackbird; Sparrowhawk;  
 Western Red-tail; Varied Thrush; Western Robin;  
 West. Meadowlark; Red-shafted Flicker; California  
 and Willow Woodpeckers; Plain Tit; Bush-tit;  
 Ruby-crown Kinglet; Am. Pipit; Cal. Towhee;  
 Cal. Jay; & Black Phoebe.

Went up to foot-hills this afternoon. Clear beautiful day, but cold in shade where ice remained all day; in cañon icicles 2 inches in diameter around waterfalls.

Saw great flocks of Robins on vineyards and young fruit orchards. Also cedar-birds and varied thrushes are numerous about streets especially where there are any peppertrees. Saw also: Plain Titmouse (singing); Hutton Vireo (spring song); Anna Hummer (Saw a week ago today a ♀ carrying nest-material in Arboretum; explosive "swat" of ♂ heard frequently); Golden Eagle (3 together flying up from hillside and circling); Black Phoebe; Hermit Thrush (very common everywhere even in middle of road along with Towhees and Golden-crown sparrows); Juncos (several flocks, those taken being clearly thurbini); Audubon Warbler, etc.

Feb. 23

Pasadena; May 11, '03.

Foggy all forenoon. Hot after sun came out. Drove down to arroyos below Devil's Gate and near Linda Vista for two hours this afternoon. Saw following birds:—

Turkey Vulture; Mourning Dove (common)  
Western Tanager (1 in town and one in  
sycamore in arroyo); Brewer Blackbird  
(adults & juveniles abundant in town, and very  
tame and fearless along murengo and  
on home place); Ariz. Hooded Oriole (nests  
on home place); Cal. Bush-Tit (nest three  
and one-half feet up in greasewood  
bush, scarcely concealed, containing young);  
Black-Tailed Gnatcatcher (a pair located, and  
female seen preening for a long time; finally  
nest located - 18 inches up in triple forks  
of "candle" cactus, contained two nearly  
full fledged young); Phainopepla (several);  
Cedar Waxwing (a flock of at least a dozen  
on home place this forenoon); Cliff Swallow  
(nest with young on home place under barn eaves);  
House Finch (Many nests & full-fledged young  
on place, one nest with six eggs);  
Cal. Towhee (full fledged young on place);

Spurred Towhee (several along arroyo banks);  
Golden-crowned Sparrow (one in brush on bank  
of arroyo, head fully black and gold, late!);  
West. Chipping Sparrow (Common in town);  
Lawrence Goldfinch (pair on place building,  
also pair in arroyo); Arkansas Kingbird  
(seen flying near town); Black Phoebe  
(full-fledged young in town); Western  
Wood Pewee (pair on home place; also common  
in arroyo); Western Flycatcher (one  
heard for several days on home place);  
Russet backed Thrush (one seen and heard  
in orange orchard this morning);  
Least Vireo (singing as usual in arroyo  
among Poisonoak bushes); Arkansas  
Goldfinch (nesting on home-place);  
Willow Goldfinch (transient on  
home place); Lazuli Bunting (singing  
all along arroyo banks); Black-headed  
Grosbeak (on place and in arroyo);

Costa Hummer (♂♀ common in arroyo bottom, but no nests found; apparently just mating); Anna Hummer (nest and eggs 8 feet up on eucalypto twig at back door; also two other ♀♀ carrying nesting material up into pine and eucalypto); San Diego Song Sparrow (fully fledged young on place); Cal. Thrasher (Full fledged young in arroyo); Mockingbird (very common in town and arroyo); Cal. Shrike (several in arroyo); Roadrunner (tracks common in arroyo); Cactus Wren (heard & old nests found); Valley Partridge (very numerous in arroyo); Yellow Warbler (pair on place); Horned Lark (on road between fields, ♂♂ common, but no females seen).

June 13, 1903.

Went down to arroyo below Devil's gate. Found four Costa's Hummer's nests, <sup>on cactus</sup> with young and one



with two badly incubated eggs. Saw no males.

Found quite a colony of Cactus wren's nests, one containing a fresh egg; also a dove's nest with two eggs. Saw; Phainopepla (common);

Vigors Wren (singing); Mockingbird (very abundant and singing constantly); Least Vireo (one singing);

Sagebrush Bunting (full-fledged young); Wren tit;

Ariz. Hooded Oriole (full-grown young); Cliff Swallow;

Black-tailed Gnatcatcher (two pairs + young);

Bush-tit (large band of young); Cal. Thrasher, etc.

Went down to arroyo above Devil's gate. Saw several White-throated Swifts + Violet-green Swallows; Cal. Thrasher (nest + 2 fresh eggs); West. Gnatcatcher (nest 2 feet up in white-sage on mesa, 2 nearly-fledged young); Phainopepla (nests just building); Costa Hummer (several nests, all but one with young, on cactus and sycamore); Ark. Goldfinch (nest 6 feet up at top of greasewood); Sagebrush Bunting; Vigors Wren; West. Warbling Vireo, etc.

Went up to Rubio wash. Saw a road-runner (flying with flapping wings up from <sup>level</sup> ground and over brush fully 100 feet); Costa's & Black-chin Hummer (abundant, the former with nests and young); Cal. Towhee (nest and two fresh eggs); Phainopepla (few); West. Lark Sparrow (2 pairs); etc.

Went with Daggett down to willow beds in the San Gabriel River bottom below El Monte.

Birds are extremely abundant, doubtless due to unusual food supply following wet winter. Most birds are laying second sets, while full-grown young are plentiful. Saw:

West. Blue Grosbeak (just one ♂); Black-headed

Grosbeak (few); Lazuli Bunting (few); Wren-tit;

Pileolated Warbler; yellow Warbler; Yellowthroat;

Long-tailed Chat (♂ singing in every clump, but very hard to locate, or get sight of);

Trail Flycatcher (nest with young and nest with 2 eggs, both about five feet up in willows);

Russet-backed Thrush (singing commonly, nest with 4 eggs 7½ feet up against willow trunk);

Cal. Crow (very common); Barn Owl; some Finch  
Willow Goldfinch (nests with fresh eggs & young);  
Arkansas Goldfinch; Cal. Cuckoo (heard in two places)  
Cal. Shrike; Bullock Oriole (common, young full-  
grown); Red-winged & Brewer Blackbirds;  
Tree Swallow; Cliff Swallow; Ash-throated Flycatcher  
(common); Arkansas Kingbird; Black Phoebe;  
Nuttall & Cabanis Woodpecker; Red-shafted Flicker;  
West. Meadowlark; Song Sparrow; Cal. Bush-tit;  
Hutton Vireo (nest with 3 slightly-incubated eggs,  
12 feet up in willow); Spurred Towhee.

Went up to Rubio Wash again. Orioles, both Hooded & Bullock, are very common, bands of young with parents. So are hummers, black-chin & costa very numerous about unusually abundant flowers. Saw full-grown young of Texas Nighthawk. Also Least Vireo, Bell Sparrow (adults & full-grown juveniles), Western Martin (flying overhead), etc.

Went up Arroyo Seco Cañon to Switzer's Camp and back. Birds are still scarce over the extensive burned areas, though these have grown up to brush six feet or more high. Saw:—

West. Gnatcatcher (on trail over ridge); Vigors Wren (juv. im.); parkmanns wren (nests in holes in sycamore with young); Cal. Bush tit; Plain Titmouse (on ridge)

Wren-tit (the most common bird in burned region);  
Cal. Thrasher; Cañon Wren (beautiful song heard  
in several places high up on cañon sides); California  
Yellow Warbler (juveniles); Cassin Vireo (few seen  
and heard in lower cañon; Warbling Vireo  
(the commonest vireo, along the stream);  
Hutton Vireo (2); Least Vireo (at mouth of cañon);  
Phainopepla (only near mouth); West. Tanager (only  
about a dozen seen all together, nest  $\frac{1}{3}$  incubated  
nearly to completeness 10 feet up on alder sapling);  
Rufous-crowned Sparrow (1 ♂ heard and finally shot,  
near mouth of cañon); Anthony Towhee;  
Spurred Towhee (not common); Lawrence Goldfinch  
(a pair high up in cañon); Arkansas Goldfinch  
(common clear up); Black-headed Grosbeak (2 or three  
high up); Lazuli Bunting (only near mouth);  
Ariz. Hooded Oriole (only near mouth); [no jays at all!!]  
West. Wood Pewee; Olive-sided Flycatcher (at Surtzer's)  
Traill Flycatcher (heard near Barker's); West. Flycatcher  
(very common in lower Cañon, nest on side of alder);

Black-chin Hummer ( $\frac{1}{2}$ , fresh near Brunk's place)  
White-throated Swift (near Switzer's on ridge flying);  
Nuttall Woodpecker (several); Cabanis Woodpecker (few  
in upper cañon); Cooper Hawk (2 fully-fledged  
young on nest in top of oak in upper cañon, flew  
when disturbed, were whistling loudly); Golden Eagle  
(1, flying); Turkey Vulture; Mountain Quail (Coveys  
of young and adults just below Las Casitas; Valley  
Quail (2 coveys of young in lower cañon;  
Black Phoebe (in lower cañon); Mourning Dove  
(common and nesting numerous, eggs & young seen).

Frye's Harbor is a narrow fiord terminating a steep-sided cañon running back among the hills and mountains of the west end of Santa Cruz Island. The Cañon bed is lined with willows, Blackberries, and

a few cottonwoods; The cañon and hill sides for a considerable ways up are covered with fine large live oaks, manzanita, iron-wood, heteromeles, and a few pines. Saw following birds:—

Bald Eagle (several along precipitous shores); Island Shrike (a few heard and seen high on cañon sides); Dusky Warbler (common in oaks and willows in Cañon); Hutton Vireo (several in oaks and brush with bush tits); Bush-tit (several flocks in brush on cañon sides); Santa Cruz Wren (fairly common in brush anywhere); Santa Cruz Jay (numerous among oaks anywhere, quiet but curious, as usual, notes rather different from mainland jays, feeding on acorns and redberries); Spurred Towhee (few among blackberries and willows in cañon bed); West. Chipping Sparrow (at least a dozen in cañon bottom among willows); Anna Hummer (very numerous);

Raven (several pairs); Mockingbird (one among cactus high on hillside); Rock Wren (Common on bare hillsides); House Finch (few among cactus on dry hill-tops); Red-shafted Flicker (few among oaks); Mourning Dove (Common); Black Phoebe (several along stream in Cañon bed); La. Tanager (one heard on hill side).

This afternoon cruised down north side of Santa Cruz Island. Saw: Cal. Brown Pelican (small flocks & individuals alone sitting on outlying rocks or flying along shore); Heermann Gull (common all along); West. Gull (fairly common); Brandt Cormorant (very numerous large nesting grounds on outlying ledges); Belted Kingfisher (several along cliffy shores); Pink-footed Shearwater (numbers out in channel, some close in shore scooting over waves).

On shore an hour this evening at Smuggler's Cove, S.E. end of Santa Cruz Island,



which is barren, save for ranch with trees and weeds. Saw:— Raven (pair flying over); Bald Eagle (several along bluff); Cal. Shrike (several among olive trees of orchard on hillside, very noisy at dusk); Belted Kingfisher (along surf); Black Phoebe (several around houses); Ash-throated Flycatcher (one individual among walnut trees); Spurred Towhee (common in patch of weeds, coriander or anise); Rufous-crowned Sparrows (several heard on hillside among weed clumps, juvenile taken); Rock Wren (in rocky gorge); Santa Cruz Island Wren (Fairly common in weed patch); Parkman Wren (one heard singing in coriander patch, finally shot); Island Horned Lark (heard on barren-topped hills).

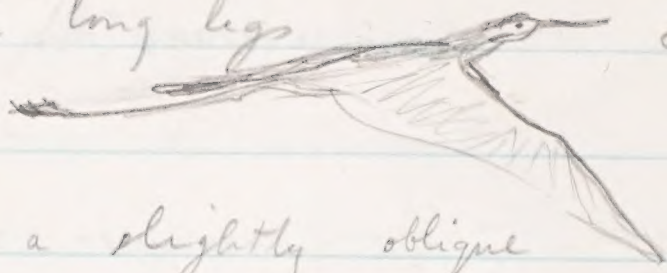



Went down to San Pedro and Pt. Fermin today with physiography class. Saw quite a number of Spotted Sandpipers along the rocky surf-line towards Pt. Fermin. They were always seen singly. Saw several Bonaparte Gulls in the inner harbor at San Pedro; also in vicinity of deadman Island Heermann & Western Gull, Brown Pelican, Brandt & Farallone Cormorant, Royal Tern, & Surf Scoter. On the green & grassy upland between San Pedro & Pt. Fermin, saw a large flock of Mountain Bluebirds (*Sialia arctica*); also West. Savanna Sparrows, Audubon Warblers, Am. Pipits, Cal. Shrike, etc.

In fact a few Pileolated were the only transients present in even fair numbers. Saw also a few Audubons in sycamores, one Pacific Yellowthroat in scrub oak, and heard what I supposed were Tolmies. In canyon Yellow Warblers were singing



commonly. Birds in general were present in but small numbers. Summer birds are still scarce, only 2 or 3 each of Lazuli Bunting, & Black-headed Grosbeak being seen. But small Flycatchers were in evidence: — Hammond (only the one shot, in oak); Wright (only the one shot, in oak); Gray (the 2 shot, & perhaps 2 others heard in bush & oaks of wyo<sup>o</sup> bottom); Western (few); Ash-throated (only 1 seen). Saw several Barn Swallows flying west high up. also White-throated Swift; Western Red-tail; Lawrence Goldfinch (quite common this year); West.
