

Behold, this is the third time I am ready to come 14 to you; and I will not be a burden to you: for I seek not yours, but you: for the children ought not to lay up for the parents, but the parents for the children. And I will most gladly spend and be ⁵ spent for your 15 souls. If I love you more abundantly, am I loved the less? But be it so, I did not myself burden you; 16 but, being crafty, I caught you with guile.

Therefore I endure all things for the elect's 10 sake, that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.

For before 12 that certain came from James, he did eat with the Gentiles: but when they came, he drew back and separated himself, fearing them that were of the circumcision.
