Warren Case Critic Plugs New Book

Harold Weisberg, author of the Whiteash series of books critical of the Warren Commission investigation of the Kennedy assassination, is in New Orleans this week to publicize his fourth book on the subject.

The new volume, "Oswald in New Orleans—Case for Conspiracy with the CIA", begins with a foreword written by District Attorney Jim Garrison, who is conducting a probe of the late President Kennedy's murder in Dallas Nov. 22, 1963.

At a press conference here yesterday, Weisberg said that he feels the members of the commission were "victimized" by the type of evidence presented to them.

He said he agrees with Garrison's theory that the assassination was planned and carried out by a small group of anti-Castro Cuban guerrillas. He also said that he believes Lee Harvey Oswald did not shoot anyone in Dallas. Oswald was named the lone assassin by the Warren Commission.

Weisberg's new book deals with many of the persons whose names have been connected with Garrison's probe. Weisberg said it is not yet available in New Orleans.
