ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT  
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY  
DALLAS, TEXAS  
NOVEMBER 22, 1963

On November 26, 1976, Richard Harold "Dick" Lester, 1440 Hansboro, Dallas, Texas, telephone 337-0812, telephonically contacted the Dallas FBI Office and stated that for several years he has been going to the area where President John Kennedy was assassinated and has been "looking around." Lester stated that approximately two years ago, while using a metal detector in the area of the assassination, he discovered what he believes to be a 6.5 millimeter slug.

On December 1, 1976, Richard Harold "Dick" Lester was interviewed, as set forth in the attached interview report.

On December 1, 1976, a small piece of metal which Mr. Lester furnished to the interviewing Agents was transmitted to the FBI Laboratory, Washington, D. C.

On January 1, 1977, Mr. Lester telephonically contacted the Dallas FBI Office and advised Special Agent [redacted] that he has seen considerable publicity in the newspapers concerning the bullet that he turned over to the FBI. Mr. Lester stated that he wanted to emphasize that he only wanted the FBI to have the bullet and he only wanted the FBI to do the examination on same. Mr. Lester was concerned that if someone else did the examination on the bullet that he would not get the bullet back. Mr.
