

# Anti-War Rally Here Hits at House Probers

Some 100 members of the National Committee to Defend the Civil Liberties of the Anti-War Movement held a "victory" rally yesterday on the Washington Monument grounds, then inarched down the MALL.

The group claimed victory over the House Un-American Activities Committee in last week's hearings on antiwar activities in the United States.

One spaker called called the committee hearing "an inquisition for no other purpose other than attempting to kill the peace movement."

Among the speakers were Don Slaughter, chairman of the group, and Fannie Lou Hamer,

of the Mississippi Free Democratic party.

After the speeches, the demonstrators paraded along the Mall to Union Square, across the street from the Capitol grounds. There, they were met by Capitol police who warned they would be arrested if they crossed over to the grounds.

Police said the demonstrators halted, listened to a brief statement from one of their spokesmen and then dispersed.

Park Police reported, arresting three men during the demonstration. They charged Keith Kern, 29, of Baltimore, Md. and meamber of the committee, with disorderly conduct. Henry Method, 47, of Alexandria, Va. was also charged with disorderly conduct. Charged with picketing without a permit near the Grant statue was George T. Arseneault, 21, who listed his address as 6150 Wilson Blvd., Arlington, Va., the address for the American Nazi party.
