On Friday, Feb. 3, 1967 the writer met with an old acquaintance, whom I had known when I was employed by the Flami Linea Sumply. His name is FARILL LIKE CODY, also known as "Tex", Hissal Police BCI #39330. Note: See FSI record this file. (PEI ALSTHOLE).

At the time of this acquaintance he was also employed by the Miami Linen Supply,

Cody introduced me to a friend of his, named MICKEY Mc Laney and stated the following:

Mickey is the son of fiched J. Mc Laney, who had been named in an article published by Life "ogazine, Feb. 3, 1967. The article is on Fage 58 and is called "The Sandth in the Sandth of "associated with molies that like Telaney (father) is isolicated or "associated with mobster Mayer Lansky. Cory stated that Mr. Whenel J. Le Lansy is peing to sue Life Magazine because of this implication; that Mr. Me Laney is not associated with Mayer Lansky or any other mobsters in the Bahamas or envelope else; in fact he is in the process of going into business in the Bahamas and is especial to the mobster element there. To the bast of my recollection, Mr. McLaney is negotiating with LYDEN O. PUDLING, the new Precior of the Bahamas intends to build a hotel and gashing Casino on Paradiae Inland. To also intends to build a bridge from the City of "Lane to Paradiae Island. To feels that the article in Life magazine of thinds his chances that at one time Dan builtvan, Executive Vice President of the Crime Commission of Greater Mant, made a derogetory statement avaluate McLaney, - see thing to the effect that Mc Laney was a professional golf gambler out of New Orlands.

Due to the fact that there may be a possibility that blendel J. Aclaney is connected with mediaters here in Min.1 or in this commons, the writer requested Cody to arrange an interview between Mr. Eclaney and myself. Cody stated that he would arrange an interview at the earliest possible time.

On Feb. 8, 1967 the writer proceeded to the office of Dan Sullivan, and requested to see the files on Michael J. Helmay. Mr. Bullivan at first gave an oral atatement regarding the background of Helmay and then opened his files permitting me to read averyable, reparding him.

After reading Mr. Sullivan's file, it was the impression of this writer that nothing definite pinpoints Mr. McLaney as being associated with or connected with any mobster element. Apparently he has no criminal record or arrests. He was a Deputy Sheriff in New Orleans from approximately 1936 to 1943. He was at one time meateur tennis champion of Lousiana. He is quite athletic and plays excellent colf. He has an excellent mid with floures and figuring odds. He has several times been suspected of criminal activities - however nothing proved definite.

On Feb. 9, 1967 at 9.15 A.M. the writer conducted an interview with Mr. Michael J. McLaney at his residence 1021 North Venetian Drive. The following was learned:

Mr. McLaney is in feet expetiating at this time in order to build a gambling Costno and hotel in Paradiso Island in the Bahamas. He stated that he is definitely not associated with any mobater here or in the Bahamas and that he is depresed to the mobater element. He desires, if and when he is permitted to no into business, to run a logitimate business. Anyone who will be in his employ cannot have any criminal record whatsoever. He understands that the Bahamian Government will thoroughly check his employees but he desires to have them checked beforehand here in the States and if in the event they have a record, they will be desired employment in his establishment. At this point I stated that the City of Miami has a voluntary Civilian registration setup and will be available to his armiloyees. In this process the persons are l'ingaroriated, photographed and checked through the F.B.I. The cost for this is \$2.00 per person.

In the course of the conversation, Tr. McLaney named gome of his close friends. To the best of my recollection, those named were - J. Edgar Hoover, Director of the F.B.I., John S. Knight, Publisher of the Minmi Herald and Rockey Pomerantz, Chief of the Minmi Boach Police Department. He stated that he could use these people as references, along with the Chief of Police and Mayor of New Orleans.

Interview concluded at 9.45 A.i. Fob. 9, 1967.

Note: Upon my departure it was noted that his nort-door neighbor is Anthony Salerno, 1041 North Venetian Drive (refer to our file).

Mr. McLaney stated to me that I should feel from to lave an interview with him at any time in the future and gave me his chope number, which is 371-0683 (unlisted) to make an appointment.
