

HUBERT H. RAINEY / Inspector, U. S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Prisons, and JOHN J. CLARK, also with the U. S. Bureau of Prisons, contacted me in the Memphis Office the afternoon of June 11, 1968.

They had been in Memphis two days on instructions of the Attorney General, counseling with local authorities regarding security measures which may be needed when RAY is returned to Memphis. They are here in an advisory capacity and to be as helpful as possible. They wanted to let you know that they were in the City and that they would appreciate any suggestions you might have to make in connection with the handling of RAY in Memphis.

Both men appear to have had considerable experience in the Bureau of Prisons and were very pleasant and congenial. They were impressed with what they had found in the Memphis PD and in the Sheriff's Office. They indicated they might get back to see you, however, made no definite commitment in that regard.
