Shelby County. A petition from Ray, which ewould have to allege how his rights had been violated by rearlier proceedings, would be docketed in the division where he was tried, before Judge Battle. If the judge turned down the petition, Ray would then be able to appeal that adecision through the higher state courts and the federal

rourts.
