In this case, the distorted bullet, listed as Q64, did not bear sufficient microscopic marks of value for identification purposes. No photographs or photomicrographs of the test bullets obtained from the evidence rifle were made inasmuch as such photographs would not be taken in situations where it is not possible to effect an identification.

All the notes available concerning the firearms examinations of the evidence bullet, Q64, have been made available.

Two hours of agent time were utilized.
