Tests Ordered in King Case

A Memphis judge has ordered James Earl Ray's lawyers to notify him by Aug. 1 as to who would conduct a proposed new round of tests to determine whether Ray's rifle killed the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

Criminal Court Judge Joe Brown also served notice that he will press for new examination of the shullest fixed from the rifle by the PBI in 1988, Bellistics evidence from the PBI tests, subpoensed edone from the PBI tests, subpoensed to pressional assassination hearings in 1978, can placed under a 50-year seal by Congress after the hearings. Brown, however, has directed defense and prosecution lawyers to seek their release.

Ballistics experts who tested Ray's rifle in May under an order from Brown reported earlier this month

Prosecutor Lee Coffee expressed skepticism about the defense lawyers' intentions. "I get the impression that we can be back here in tr > year 2005 and we'll still be dealing with James Earl Ray," Coffee said.
