of what represent an undetected intrusion here. Early yesterday a.m. I found a common yellow leadpencil outside the carport window to my office. Making it more unusual—neither of us uses them—is that fact that it bore the Ginn's (D.C.) name. It happens that the night before Lil had gone out to inspect an unusual large bettle I had Rilled there. We walk past that place often each day and we have had no visitors of whom we know and no deliverymen who could have dropped it by afcident. It was not there the night before and there was no wind to blow it in from another place. It can mean that someone dropped it the night of 7-25-26. I had been up since before daylight working at that spot inside and I had gone out for the paper after six and before seven a.m., when I found it.
