

Ex-Marine Corps Buddy of Oswald Is Subpenaed

Says Tampa Man The district attorney's office Tuesday issued a subpena for a Marine Corps buddy of Lee Harvey Oswald, apparently to ask questions it feels the War-ren Commission should have asked. Criminal District Court Judge Matthew S. Braniff issued the subpena for Kerry Wendell Thornley, S. Tampa, Fla., after it was presented by Assistant District Attorney Richard V. Burnes. The subpena says commission attorneys questioned Thornley for 33 pages about his knowledge of Oswald in the Marine Corps in 1959, but did not question him about what the DA's office termed Thornley's "association" with Oswald in New Orleans in 1963.

Won't Veluntarily Go,

Thornley, contacted at his I home in Tampa, told The Associated Press he does not plan r to honor the subpena unless he is formally extradited. He said he knew Oswald about three months, when both were stationed in El Toro, Calif., with Marine Air Patrol Squadron No. 9.

"The frequency of Mr. Thornley's contacts with Oswald in New Orleans also indicates that a he might be in possession of i specific information concerning i other associations which this of i fice has found Oswald to have i had during his period in New i Orleans," Burnes said in one i part of the subpena.

Bonds are subjecta. BONDS ARE SET Meanwhile Thursday bonds were set in Criminal District Court for Vernon W. Bundy on charges of armed robbery and theft.

Bundy, a 29-year-old Negro whose address was listed as 4039 Athis ct., was one of the state's major witnesses in a hearing in which three judges ruled that Clay L. Shaw should be held over for trial on a charge of conspiring to kill President John F. Kennedy. Shaw later was indicted by the Orleans Parish Grand Jury on this charge. Bundy testified that he saw Shaw and Oswald together at Cont. in Sec. 1, Page 15, Col, 4
