If Thornley has made any other statements, like in papers, and you have them, please send them to me. I am particularly interested in anything following his grand-jury appearance.

When I get a chance I'll phone Bob and see if he is interested in having me respond. If that happens, please tape it for me, particularly if Thornley responds, and, if you can, transcribe his remarks and to what he responds.

Your transcript was particularly helpful to the grand jury. I tell you this for your own information only, believing you would want to know.
