Assassination 15.A **Probers Charge** Tampa Witness NATIONAL

NEW ORLEANS (P) - Kerry W. Thornley, a Marine Corps buddy of Lee Harvey Oswald, was charged yesterday with perjury before the Orleans Par-ish Grand Jury in its Kennedy assassination probe.

1968 Thornley, 29, of Tampa, was accused by Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison of lying before the jury 22, when he testified that he had February not been with Oswald here in September 1963.

IN TAMPA, Thornley said the perjury, charge is "false" and said he has a "feeling of futility about going through the rest of my life bailing myself out of debt over this thing." Times, Thursday,

He said he probably would not fight extradition and would ask for a public defender to repre-

for a public detender to repre-sent him in court. In response to the charge, Thornley said there is either a conspiracy afoot to "frame me" by someone with a large Petersburg St. amount of money, or the Grand Jury was misled by "an overwhelming amount of circumstantial coincidences."

MANY WITNESSES, Thorn-ley declared, apparently "delib-erately lied" in testifying that they saw him with Oswald in portainment and other places. restaurants and other places. "I have neither the resources, investigative-wise nor legalwise, to prove that these witnesses were lying," he said. "I feel a comprehensive investigation would clear me." Oswald, named by the Warren Commission as the lone assassin of President John F. Kennedy, was shot to death two days after the assassination in Dallas, Nov. 22, 1963.
