



Your letter of July 24, 1962, has been received, and I want to the EDI thank you for your kind remarks regarding my administration of the FBI.

With respect to your inquiries, the FBI is strictly an investigative agency of the Federal Government and neither makes evaluations nor draws conclusions as to the character or integrity of any organization, publication or individual. In light of this, I am sure you will understand why I cannot comment concerning the individual or publications you mentioned.

I would like to point out that the Communist Party in this country has attempted to infiltrate and subvert every segment of our society. However, the Party's efforts are being thwarted by the FBI's internal security programs, by investigation, arrest and prosecution of Party functionaries, and by widespread, intelligent public opposition to the communist philosophy. These achievements are being accomplished through orderly, legal procedures, and I assure you this Bureau is continuing to handle its responsibilities in this field with the same dispatch and thoroughness that have characterized our investigations in the past.

Relative to the article by Mr. Cassels, in line with our long-standing policy, we cannot comment on articles which we have not prepared. The quotations attributed to FBI officials were taken from remarks previously made by them on other occasions. In addition, I have never been an Elder of the National Presbyterian Church; however, I was at one time a Trustee of this Church in Washington,

NOTE: We have had one prior correspondence with during March, 1960, which letter was acknowledged on 3-30-60. This letter also requested the Director's comments regarding the Air Force manuals, which she mentions in her current incoming and their allegations that communists have infiltrated the clergy. Our answer to her prior communication stated our policy against giving evaluations relative to organizations, publications or individuals. Dear Mr. Hoover,

I am writing to you was I consider you to be no of Americas most outstanding leaders. I have the utmost trust and confidence in you, and I hope you will be able to take the time out of your busy schedule to answer a few of my questions.

First, let me say that I do not belong to the John Birch Society or any Rightist Group. I have, however, been trying to get at the truth concerning the charges that have been made in reference to the infiltration of Communistiato the clergy. The Rightists are forever quoting "J.Edgar Hoover" to prove their point...and the Liberals quote likewise.

I feel that there has most certainly been "unfounded charges" made against some of America's Clergymen, but whenever a newspaper or magazine article plays up these "unfounded charges", it always tends to label 'Extreme Rightis on anyone who believes that some of America's church leaders did have Communist affiliations, as brought out in the Air Force Manual 45-0050 and vouched for by Representative Francis E. Walter of the House Committee on Un-American Activities. You see, I have tried to get as much government information as possible, relating to this. And who are we going to trust if we can't trust the various branches of our U.S. Govt.?

I wrote the House of Representative for the Hearing on Feb. 25, 1960 covering the controversial A.F. Immual. Among many other specific charges, Er. Arens, the Staff Director, said on page 1303 " Thus far of the leadership of the National Council of Churches of Christ in America, we have found over 100 per sons in leadership capacity with either Communist-front records or records of service to Corrunist causes. The aggregate affiliations of the leadership, instead of being in the hundreds as the chairman first indicated, is now, according to our latest count, into the thousands, and we have yet to complete our check..."

Probably you won't commit yourself, but I am still trying to get at the truth so I will boldly as you (1) As a leader of an investigative branch of our government, do you think Ir. Arens' Committee was accurate in the Feb. 1960 Hearing (in particular, page 1303)?

Mr. Louis Cassels wrote an article in Look Magazine April 24, 1962, whereby he quoted Re / Dr. Charles D. Kean as saying "Through vicious attacks against clergymen in general, and the NCC in particular, radicals of the Right have spread...discord...confusion..etc." Mr. Cassels stated that you also share Rev. Kean's concern. In fact, Mr. Cassels article in Look Magazine looks very much like it had your whole hearted endorsement, according to his "quote from you.

Would you please tell me - in black and white - (2) whether or not you think the charges made against some of the leaders in the NCC were "true" or "false"

It is unfortunate that approximately 75 men, active in the NCC, could cause a much suspicion of Communists in the entire National Council of Churches Organization. Frankly, I am not as concerned with the Communist infiltration bit as I am with the "Liberals" in the NCC who would deny basic truths about the person of our ford Jesus Christ. But that still doesn't hinder me from wanting to secure the truth or Talsity of those charges!

ARTICLE MENTIONING FBI

You will recall that SAC, Cincinnati, advised us that Circuit Riders, Inc., had brought to the attention of that office an article in captioned publication which mentioned the FBI. SAC, Cincinnati, set out a lead for the Newark Office to obtain a copy of "Christian Beacon" which is published in Collingswood, New Jersey, by Dr. Carl McIntire.

SAC, Newark, has furnished the Bureau the publication in question by airtel 5-21-62. Virtually the entire issue, which is dated 5-3-62, contains items attacking the recent article in "Look" magazine by Louis Cassels which criticizes those who accuse the churches of communist influence. McIntire, in this issue, asserts that Cassels is an apologist for the National Council of Churches (NCC) which is "soft on communism." He goes on to say that Cassels has attempted to use the FBI in attack on the "religious right." He quotes from the Director's testimony in 1947 and from "Masters of Deceit" to support his assertion that communists are engaged in infiltrating religious groups. He states that Cassels, in his "Look" article, has implied that Assistant Director William C. Sullivan has been appointed by Mr. Hoover to defend American clergymen.

On page 8, McIntire makes this statement: "The times call for courageous, heroic action even if LOOK magazine, the powerful, developing hierarchy of the National Council of Churches, and even the officers of the FBI may be lined up against it"; this statement implies criticism of the Bureau.

Bufiles reflect that Dr. McIntire was an organizer of the American Council of Christian Churches and is an outspoken foe of the NCC. He has bitterly criticized the Revised Standard Version of the Bible and has stated publicly that communists are using the NCC in the United States. We have had a number of inquiries in the past concerning Dr. McIntire's statements on communism, and the Bureau is well aware that he is considered a controversial figure. In view of this, it is felt that we most definitely should not take any action with regard to this issue of "Christian Beacon."


Let me commend you for the work you have done in the F.B.I. during the past several decades.

More especially I am grateful for the attitude you and your department has taken toward Communists in the Churches during the past year. Until the past year I had the feeling that the Right wing in this country was using certain statements which cane out of your office and twisted them to their convenience and trying to convince people of the Churches and of the country that the Church was infiltrated with Communists.

Beginning with a pamphlet which came from your office and got into my hands last summer and helped greatly by the speech Mr. William Sullivan made in Phoenix during last winter and by the article RIGHTIST CRISES IN OUR CHURCHES by Mr. Louis Cassells in LOOK Magazine April 24, 1962, it seems to me that the tide is turning in favor of a more objective attitude toward the Church.

I have known many hundreds of ministers during my thirty-five years as a pastor. They seem to me to be down-right dedicated men-dedicated to Christ and the building of the Church. Some may be more liberal than I, but I believe they are liberal out of dedication to Christ and concern for the common man, rather than motivated by Communism or even Fabian Socialism.

So, thank you very much, for the share you are having in the lessening of tensions in the Church and the country.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

I have just finished reading Louis Cassels' article "The Rightest Crisis in Our Churches" in Look Magazine of April 24. I believe this article to be unfair and unjust, but the thing that disturbed me most was the implication given by Mr. Cassels that you and the F.B.I. deny any substantial communist infiltration into the churches and that you feel that all anti-communist groups are actually aiding the communist cause.

I first became concerned about communism in the United States after reading your book "Masters of Decait". After much reading and study of communism, I became convinced that the Mational Council of Churches was aiding the communist cause. Their pronouncements of being favor of recognition of Red China, unilateral disarmament, a ban on nuclear testing (regardless of what other countries do) and their support of United Mations' policy for a one-world government, to mention a few, led me to believe that communist influence must be very strong. Though I do not believe that most clergymen are actual communists, I feel that many of them are unknowingly aiding the communist cause and that this poses that as great a threat to our American way of life.



BACKGROUND:

My memo of 4-16-62 to you concerning the above-captioned article pointed out that quotations attributed to the Director and Assistant Director Sullivan were substantially correct and it was not felt that the original meaning had been altered in the quotations. With regard to the statement, "were substantially correct," the Director has asked, "What do you mean? Just what changes were made by Cassels?" Set forth below is information concerning quotations attributed to the Director and Mr. Sullivan.

QUOTATIONS ATTRIBUTED TO THE DIRECTOR:

On page 40 of "Look" magazine near the beginning of the article, Mr. Hoover is mentioned as a ruling elder of the National Presbyterian Church, and it is pointed out that he, as well as President Kennedy, shares a concern about extremist attacks on religion. It is noted that on your memo to Mr. Mohr of 4-3-62 setting forth a review of the galley proofs of the article, the Director noted he is not a "ruling" elder-The article quotes Mr. Hoover as stating that, "unfounded charges against America's clergymen" are weakening religious institutions "which stand on the front line in the fight against communism." These specific quotes cannot be located, but Cassels has apparently paraphrased them from the following statements made by the Director. In the Director's article entitled "Let's Fight Communism Sanely!" which appeared in the Ujanuary, 1962, issue of "Christian Herald," the Director stated, "Innuendoes, false accusations and unfounded charges can only weaken the fight against Communism by diffusing the strength of the anticommunist forces." Later in the Director's article, he stated, "Clergymen -- and men who believe in God everywhere -- literally stand on the front lines of this giant ideological battle." In the Director's June, 1961, "Crusader" magazine article on communism, the Director, referring to ministers, stated, "In reality they stand on the front line today in the fight against communism." On page 42 of "Look" magazine, the Director's picture appears, and below this he is quoted in large letters as follows: "Unfortunately, there are those who make the very mistake the Communists are so careful to avoid ... " This is followed in smaller letters with, "... These individuals concentrate on the negative rather than on the positive. They are merely against communism without being for any positive measures to eliminate the social, political and economic frictions which the Communistrare so adroit at exploiting. These persons would do well to recall a recent lesson from history. Both Hitler and Mussolini were against communism. However, it was by what they stood for, not against, that history has judged them." This quotation under the Director's picture is the last two paragraphs verbatim from the Director's statement, "The Communist Party Line," which he prepared for the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on 9-23-61.

QUOTATIONS ATTRIBUTED TO ASSISTANT DIRECTOR SULLIVAN:

On page 42 of the magazine beneath the Director's picture and quotation is Mr. Sullivan's photograph and the following quotation which is attributed to him: "Any allegation is false which holds that there has been and is, on a national scale, any substantial Communist infiltration of the American clergy." This quotation is a portion of a sentence which appears in the text of an address Mr. Sullivan gave at the Highland Park Methodist Church, Dallas, Texas, on October 19, 1961, and on page 44 of the magazine more of this sentence is set forth, and the quotation is attributed to this particular speech. There is a slight difference in the way the sentence is set forth in the "Look" article and the way it is contained in the printed text of Mr. Sullivan's speech. According to the "Look" article, the sentence is as follows: "To recapitulate, it can be stated factually and without equivocation that any allegation is false which holds that there has been and is, on a mational scale, any substantial Communist infiltration of the American clergy..." At the end of this sentence, Mr. Sullivan also stated, "in particular the Protestant clergy, "which "Look" did not include. Also, the quote was altered by stating, "any substantial Communist infiltration," when actually Mr. Sullivan stated, "an extensive or substantial..." " we were substantial..." " and proton

Mr. Sullivan is also quoted from his Highland Park Methodist Church speech as stating that, "There can be no doubt as to the loyalty of the overwhelming majority of the clergy of our nation, for they have been among the most consistent and dedicated opponents of communism.... In view of the great amount of time and money Communists have spent propagandizing the American clergy, it is a remarkable tribut to them that they have resisted so successfully." This is an accurate quotation except that in the first sentence, "of our nation" should be "to our nation."

Other parts of Mr. Sullivan's Highland Park speech have been para phrased by Cassels, the meaning of which is correct. For the Director's information. RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND: .

The Director has asked, "Let me know just what our connection with the Look article is." The article appeared in the April 24, 1962, issue of "Look" magazine. It is entitled "The Rightist Crisis in our Churches" and was written by Louis Cassels, who writes religious articles for United Press International.

BRIEF RESUME OF ARTICLE:

Basically, this article is an attack on right-wing extremists who have been charging that some clergymen in America have been "soft" or sympathetic towards communism. Cassels singles out specifically Reverend Billy James Hargis, Reverend Doctor Carl McIntire, Edgar C. Bundy, Myers G. Lowman, Verne P. Kaub, and Robert Welch, founder of the John Birch Society. According to Cassels, these extremist right. wing leaders and groups specialize in making unwarranted attacks against clergymen and church organizations alleging communist sympathies, and he points out that the National Council of Churches has been a favorite target of these groups. Cassels points out how extremist charges have disrupted congregations, harassed ministers and generally hurt religious groups. Various prominent American clergymen are quoted regarding the harmful consequences of these bigoted attacks. REC 50/00-50869-911

Both the Director and Assistant Director William C. Sullivan are prominently mentioned and quoted in the article, and near the beginning of the article, a quotation from the Director, as well as Mr. Sullivan, is prominently displayed along with their photographs.

ARTICLE PROOFS REVIEWED:

In early April, Louis Cassels, who is very friendly toward the Bureau, made available the proofs of this article. Cassels is the one who wrote this article. The proofs were reviewed in this Division and your memo to Mr. Mohr of 4-3-62 set forth a brief summary of the agticle, including the information concerning the quotes. G. Lowman, have been carrying on an anticommunist crusade for the past several years. Their main target has been the communist infiltration of churches. In connection with this crusade, Lowman published, in April, 1962, "A Compilation of Public Records of 658 Clargemen and Layman connected with The NATIONAL COUNCIL of CHINCHES." Clergymen and Laymen connected with THE NATIONAL COUNCIL of CHURCHES. The introduction to this publication discloses that it is a compilation of affiliations of the personnel of the National Council of Churches (NCC) in pacifist organizations, one-world groups, socialist organizations, popular-front-type of action groups and communistfront organizations, publications, petitions, et cetera. According to Lowman, in 1961 communist fronts had the support of more than 1,200 different protestant clergymen but only a very small number of the clergymen have ever been members of the Communist Party. As a word of caution in the introduction, Lowman advises the reader of this publication to guard with the utmost care against the assumption that these men and women of the NCC are communists, communist sympathizers or Communist Party members. Any such assumption should be avoided with respect to the group of 658 as a whole and with respect to any individual member of the group. OBSERVATIONS:

He said that he is aware that some members of the National Council during the past 25 years have joined communist front organizations and, for all he knows, a few may have been members of the Party. He believes this is wrong and in his position is taking every step possible to prevent a recurrence of this type of activity. He told me that he does not think that any ranking officials of the Council today are connected with communist fronts or are in any way sympathetic to communist fronts. 'He said that if he knew that there were any of this kind he would do all that he could to have them removed.

National Council, on learning of the charges made against some of the members for having communist front connections, asked them to submit to the high-ranking officials of the Council a written statement setting forth all the details of their connections with the Communist Party, communist fronts or communist individuals. A few were reluctant to do this but the Council insisted. Today, he said, they have on file copies of all of these statements which they are holding in the avent that they believe it necessary to make them public or to otherwise put them to some good use.

By now you are probably thoroughly familiar with the article in LOOK magazine of the current issue which appears to many readers as being thoroughly endorsed by you, the way it is presented. The article by Louis Cassels in my opinion, is designed to perform the same service to the cause of Socialism as many leftist organizations have been promoting for a long time, particularly since the Moscow conference in December 1960;; i. e. to destroy the anti-communists.


