I have received your letter of August 7th, with enclosure.

In reply to your inquiry, it is contrary to my long-standing policy to comment on material not prepared by personnel of this Bureau. Please do not infer, however, that we do or do not have data in our files relating to the World Council of Churches or the National Council of Churches.

The Department of Justice has requested the FBI to ascertain whether those implementing the so-called "Black Manifesto" are in violation of any Federal statutes within our jurisdiction. The results of our inquiries are being furnished to the Department of Justice which has the responsibility for determining whether prosecution is warranted. In view of this, I cannot make any further comments regarding this matter.



Dear Mr. Hoover:

I fully realize that your time is limited and that a request from an ordinary citizen is an imposition, but in recent months I have become increasingly concerned regarding the apparent infiltration of socialist, Marxist and communist elements into every phase of our society. I am concerned about this infiltration in our churches, particularly the United Methodist Church of which I am a member.

For several years some members of our local church have protested in vain about the literature used in the Sunday School program. This literature is provided at our expense by the central offices of the church and is basically a "must." Some of the material seems to be un-American, if not outright communistically oriented, but efforts to get some improvement have not been effective.

At the General Conference of the United Methodist Church, which met in Texas in 1968, the internal organization of individual churches was revised. I believe these changes reflect a plot to organize to disorganize by destroying the effectiveness of the Sunday School in developing our young people in the true Christian spirit. Further events, such as the participation of the United Methodist Church in sponsoring the Mational Black Economic Development Conference which led to the "Black Manifesto", lead me to believe that the United Methodist Church, as well as other denominations, have become strongly infiltrated at the top eschelon of leadership with people who are out and out communists, socialists, ultra liberals, or just plain stubid.

An ordinary citizen like myself only knows what he hears and reads in the news media. I have developed a strong feeling, without any proof or personal experience, that something is wrong. We "sheep" are being led to the slaughter unwittingly through the slick use of our churches, schools, and unions by undesirable elements of this society who, if not out and out communists, are certainly not Americans in the traditional sense. Recent activities of the black militants, SDS and other anti-American organizations have strengthened







Just as the universities are yielding to the demand for black studies programmes, for segregated black departments, and even for open departments, and even for admissions "-the acceptance of Negro students without the schooling normally required for any recognizable degree course—so the Churches have already begun to make token or initial payments, and are burriedly praising the black leaders who have so effectively jozged their consciences. .

The black demand against the Churches is rather for hard cash than for opportunities for more black participation-a Negro was recently elected president of the Baptist convention. At the World Council of Churches conference London last week black churchmen urged white Christians to purge their racism by adopting black Christian. forms of expression. In Britain the black challenge may be simply for Christian rejection of "white' racism", but in America the call is for compensation, of conscience-money, to be paid for the

alleged connivance of the Ch past and present oppression of the l

The white Churches in America are caught in a dilemma, Many of them are immensely wealthy, and they enjoy extensive tax privileges. They cannot deny that there is want and suffering all . round them which makes claims on their charity,

Aiready in London Channing Phillips, a notable Nagro moderate reformer, has discovered that Mr. Forman's original demand for \$500m. is too low. This is hardly surprising, as the Churches have started paying up without fully considering whether reparations for Negro slavery and oppression can be quantified at this or any other figure.

Violence on the campus and in church may seem better tactics than riots in the ghettoes, which damage black perty and economic interests. Thas been a good cheekturning week for Anglican potentates, what with Archbishop Ramsey's spology to Black Powerhan Roy Sawh and Bishop Hyddleston's confrontation with the National Front.

Incidents like these, ending up with the Black Power visitations, were almost predictable, however, given the bizarre assortment assembled for the World Council of Churches' five-day consultation on Race, which ended in Notting Hill yesterday.

Attending members of what is almost the Clerical International (even the Roman Catholics sent observers along) included orthodox politicians like Gahfeld Todd (Church of Chrik), former Premier of Rhodesia; Oliver Tambo (Anglican), leader of the African National Congress (banned in South Africa), and George McGovern (Methodist), United States Democratic Senator, who presided over the conference.

But the non-members, invited for their experience of the world's various racial struggles, included less orthodox activists: like Dr. Nathan Hare (atheist), head of the Black Studies department of San Francisco State College and key figure of a Sve-month student strike, and Father James Groppi Roman Catholic), attacked by some white Roman Catholics for his direct action methods in Milwankae.

Though the militants made a "positive impact," it was not entirely a case of trendy liberal churchmen falling ever themselves to appease their black accusers. Professor Kenneth Little, of Edinburgh, gave a masterly display of keeping your ecademic cool after his acientific analysis of racialism had provoked furious criticism; and although the Archbishop clearly made a mistake in refusing to let Roy Sawh continue his apach. observers agreed his subsequent apology had a certain impressive dignity.

The militants themselves livegree on the usefulness of the proceedings. Nathan Hare ("I came for the chance to get out of the cesspool, even if only briefly") felt his optimism, little enough to begin with, disappear in the face of the churchmen's "psychological reluctance" to commit themselves to meaningful action. Groppi, however, saw the delegates as wielding real power within their churches, power which could allocate fulds in a radical way. He had an idea, too, that they could for weapons for South African floodedly not on.

Certainly people like Gerfield Todd and his fellow Rhodesian Herbert Chikomo (Presbyterian), very much in the frent line of the race wer, found the emference worth while. Both run the risk of legal repercusions for attending it: Todd could be deported to his native New Zhand, and Chikomo could be separated from his family and placed under restriction. He goes through a folly runtime

whenever he ottends World Council conferences, the British and Rhodesian Governments monotonously confiscating and re-issuing him with rival passports.

The conference achieved something else, though set semething the organisers could lave expected—a boost for the image of the British police. When these moved in en the National Frontmen beckling Bishop Huddleston and Tambo on Wednesday night, the Americans and Germans from with herror, expecting tear gas at the least. They saw, instead, the becklers removed very gently. "We had thought all the reports of the near-violent police at Gresvenor Square were British Pless manipulations," said one visiting churchman. Or as Garfield Tudd put ft: "Without dogs and betons, it didn't seem like heme at all."

They greeted him with shouts of "God Save the Queen," and "Britain for the British." They were removed by stewards and police.

Mr Sawh walked out, after shouting: "That is the trouble with you English You always want to do things your bloody way." He refused requests to

Father James Groppl, a white Roman Catholic priest with a black parish in Milwaukee, criti-tised Dr Ramsey for not fulfilling the Church's primary rôle in evercoming racialism — readiness to listen to what coloured people had to say. He called for an apology to Mr Sawh.

The Ber. Channing Phillip. Negro elergyman from Washing-ton, said the tragedy of the inci-dent had not been the confrontstion that took place, but that the "same old Christian platitudin-ous drivel" had continued to come "without any kind of sensitivity . . . that we had grossly insulted that young man.

a speech by Mr Mertyn Roes, Under-Secretary, Home Office, on the Governmen's immigration policies. Mr Sawh was asked to put his questions after the break but by that time Mr Rees had

Churches given a taste of Black Power

The World Council of Churches' consultation on racialism yesterday had its first real brush with aggressive, but closely argued, Black Power.

Dr Nathan Hare, chairman of the department of black studies at San Francisco State College, told the gathering in London that the churches would have to get

out of their reformist eccoon and into a revolutionary framework.

If they did not, someone would get around to telling the council to go to Hell." said Dr Hare, whose remark won loud applause from the delegates meeting under the chairmanship of Senator George McGovern, of South

Dr Hare—who began with a dedication to Malcolm X, Stokely Carmichael, Eldridge Cleaver, and all the other brothers who have been killed or failed or driven away "—said race relations were becoming human relations. If we could just love one snother we would solve all our problems.

In a series of satiric examples which eventually drew smiles from most delegates. Dr Hare said black mathematics could be related better to the life of a

black slum child by dropping "stocks and bends" and saying:
"If you loot one store and burn two, how many do you have left?" And black science could pay particular attention to the presence of rate.

Earlier Mr Eddie Brown, Negro director of Mississippi Action for Community Education, warned that the die was being cast "in terms of a head-on collision along race lines, and that struggle will not be peculiar, to the United Estates."

One erucial point—emerging paradoxically at an ecumenical gathering—is that a number of delegates believe black Churches should not yet integrate but first help their adherents to a true, sense of identity. In essence, no integration before full independent equality.



In this latter category, Dr. Roy reports, there have not been more than seventy-live persons over a thirty year period. And of this number, he says, only about twenty-five remain. If this is true, then it is sheer nonsense to suggest that America's ministers have gone soft or that the National Council is a haven for subversives.

Rut one doesn't have to rely upon Dr. Roy's testimony alone. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, whom the Radical Right delights to quote, has made it indelibly clear that he has complete confidence in the loyalty of the nation's clergymen as well as in the various donominations and church

The Verne Kaub tract against the NCC, cites a statement Mr. Hoover made in 1947 in an attempt to prove that the Council is red-tinged, even though the FBI director made no allusion whatever to the Council or its leaders! But lest any doubt remain, Mr. Hoover has said: "I want you to know that neither on this occasion nor at any time have I ever made any statement criticizing . . . the National Council of Churches," Moreover, through his chief asaissant, the FBI boss has gone on record as saying:

"We owe a debt of deep gratitude to the clergymen of this nation-men who unflinchingly battle against this conspiracy, The Communists, recognizing religion as the most

potent enemy, are always cadesvoring to gain influence within the church. In a few instances, unfortunately, have succeeded in influencing clergymen. However, the v majority of our clergy are completely loyal and are resig the attempts of the Communists to delude them. To mind, no group in America has a more key sole a in fighting communism than our clergy. Very truly they stand on the front line of this giant ideological bettle. 5

Mr. Hoover has gone even a step further and pointed out that people who make wild charges against the clergy and our churches make the very mistake the Commu

so careful to avoid. He has remarked:

"These individuals concentrate on the negative rather than on the positive. They are merely against communism without being for any positive measures to eliminate the social, political and economic frictions which the Communists are so adroit at exploiting. These persons would do well to recall a recent lesson from history. Both Hitler and Mussolini were against communism. However, it was by what they stood for, not against, that history has judged them."

Moreover, the FBI has indicated that it has evidence that the Communists are very happy about attacks from the right which tend to breed suspicion against America's churches and other democratic institutions. That this is indeed the case is reflected in an article which appeared recently in

Soviet journal. The article said:

"Lenin said that the most ardent foes of communism will eventually become frightened and suspicious of anybody who does not agree with them. In this manner, these extremely nationalistic capitalists will actually work for the cause of communism by eliminating some of the largest obstacles on the road toward a world-wide Communist way

(Some one better do something... to many with yellow streaks down their backs.)

At a news conference last Tuesday, Los Angeles Chief of Police Thomas Reddin stated, and I quote, "Much of the money accumulated by the National Council of Churches ends up being given to militant organizations, and these organizations have been active in interfering with the school program in Los Angeles."

What is the National Council of Churches? How did it begin? How large is its membership? What does the National Council of Churches stand for? Who controls it? What movements does it support?

Well, the National Council of Churches represents church organizations with an estimated forty million membership. But this is not to say that forty million American Christians and their churches support the N.C.C. A vast percentage of the forty million polled find many activities of the council to be objectionable and repulsive.

Yet--millions of Americans find that their church donations help support the National Council of Churches. The Federal Council of Churches, organized in 1908, had become so heavily infiltrated with Communists by the middle thirties--that it was branded a subversive group by the Office of Naval Intelligence. The Federal Council of Churches became the National Council of Churches in November of 1950.

And it is interesting to note that at that time, the arbitrary action of a few dozen delegates at a Cleveland convention made denominational churches of twenty-eight million people--made them members of this National Council of Churches.

The National Council of Churches has appeared determined to debunk American patriotism and to support propagands for a one-world super-socialist state. In 1957, the Department of Racial and Cultural Relations of the National Council of Churches published a pamphlet entitled, THE NEGRO AMERICAN-A READING LIST.

And April twentieth of 1960, California Republican Congressman, Donald Jackson, discussed that National Council reading list. He told Congress-told the House that some books on the list contained passages so filthy that he could not--in good taste--read passages into the Congressional Record--that some of the material was too obscene to mail, according to postal officials.

And among the books on the National Council's reading list were those by Victor Perlo, an identified Communist; Herbert Aptheker, chief theoretician of the Communist Party in the United States; the late W. E. B. Dubois, the former leading Negro Communist in the United States; Shirley Graham, a leading American Communist; Gene Weltfish, who has an extensive Communist front record; the late Ruth Benedict, with an extensive Communist record; Gunnar Myrdal, a Swedish Socialist, whose son is an official of Sweden's Communist Party; E. Franklin Frazier, a writer for Communist publications; Alan Lomax, associated with many Communist fronts; Benjamin Botkin, associated with fifteen Communist fronts; and Langston Hughes, the leading Communist who wrote the poem, "Goodbye, Christ." Hughes has many books on the National Council of Churches' reading list.

F.B.I. Chief J. Edgar Hoover has stated, "The deadliest Communist ideological and propaganda missiles are being directed against the Christian pulpit to shatter, immobilize, and confuse this powerful forum of idealism, morality, and civic virtue." And the F.B.I. Chief, Hoover, continues, "Because they despise the church, Communists continually attempt to infiltrate unsuspecting religious organizations." And he asks, "What better cloak of legitimacy can be found for Communist programs than to present them as the offerings of clergymen and churches? The strategy of Communists to get others to front for them and to do their dirty work cannot be underestimated."

Hoover cites many instances in which the Communists have flattered and appealed to the brotherhood and humanitarian instincts of churchmen to endorse Communist projects—to take part in front groups—to sign petitions—or keep silent on the dangers of Communism. It has been charged that both the Communist Party and the Mational Council of Churches approach many subjects, shall I say, on a parallel course, and have many similar objectives.

As example, peaceful coexistence--disarmament--ban nuclear testing--abolish loyalty oaths and security laws--abolish investigative committees on Communism--social revolution--increase foreign aid to Communist countries-recognize Red China--discredit J. Edgar Hoover and the F.B.I.-- destroy immigration and passport laws--and clemency for convicted spies.

Now these are just a few of the objectives shared by the Communist Party and the National Council of Churches. The chairman of the Committee on Interpretation of the National Council of Churches has stated, and I quote, "It is not unreasonable to prophesy that the churches ought to be able to control the whole economy of the nation within the predictable future." End of quote.

Now may I remind you that this Mational Council of Churches enjoys taxexempt status. Well, is it any wonder that Los Angeles Police Chief

I am writing this letter to you as one churchman to another. On the evening of March 23, 1969, I heard an editorial over Station KTTV here in Los Angeles that gave me concern. It inferred that the National Council of Churches was supporting the Communist cause in America. It further inferred that you supported his position and that you had cited many instances in which Communists had used churchmen to achieve their objectives. Enclosed is a copy of the editorial.

CHIEF REDDIN-NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES

By George Putnem . March 17, 1969

At a news conference last Tuesday, Los Angeles Chief of Police Thomas Reddin stated, and I quote, "Much of the money accumulated by the Mational Gouncil of Churches ends up being given to militant organisations, and these organizations have been active in interfering with the school program in Los Angeles."

What is the National Council of Churches? How did it begin? How large is its membership? What does the National Council of Churches stand for? Who controls it? What movements does it support?

Well, the National Gouncil of Churches represents church organizations with an estimated forty million membership. But this is not to say that forty million American Christians and their churches support the M.C.C. A wast percentage of the forty million polled find many activities of the council to be objectionable and repulsive.


Yet--millions of Americans find that their church donations help support the National Council of Churches. The Federal Council of Churches, organized in 1908, had become so heavily infiltrated with Communists by the middle thirties--that it was branded a subversive group by the Office of Naval Intelligence. The Federal Council of Churches became the National Council of Churches in November of 1950.

And it is interesting to note that at that time, the arbitrary action of a few dozen delegates at a Cleveland convention made denominational churches of twenty-eight million people--made them members of this Mational Council of Churches.

The Mational Council of Churches has appeared determined to debunk American patriotism and to support propaganda for a one-world supersocialist state. In 1957, the Department of Racial and Cultural Relations of the Mational Council of Churches published a pamphlet entitled, THE NEGRO AMERICAN--A READING LIST.

And April twentieth of 1960, California Republican Congressman, Donald Jackson, discussed that Mational Council reading list. He told Congress-told the House that some books on the list contained passages so filthy that he could not--in good taste--read passages into the Congressional Record--that some of the material was too obscene to mail, according to postal officials.

F.B.I. Chief J. Edgar Hoover has stated, "The deadliest Communist ideological and propaganda missiles are being directed against the Christian pulpit to shatter, immobilize, and confuse this powerful forum of idealism, morality, and civic virtue." And the F.B.I. Chief, Hoover, continues, "Because they despise the church, Communists continually attempt to infiltrate unsuspecting religious organizations." And he asks, "What better cloak of legitimacy can be found for Communist programs than to present them as the offerings of clergymen and churches? The strategy of Communists to get others to front for them and to do their dirty work cannot be underestimated."

Hoover cites many instances in which the Communists have flattered and appealed to the brotherhood and humanitarian instincts of churchmen to endorse Communist projects—to take part in front groups—to sign petitions—or keep silent on the dangers of Communism. It has been charged that both the Communist Party and the National Council of Churches approach many subjects, shall I say, on a parallel course, and have many similar objectives.

As example, peaceful coexistence-disarmament-ban nuclear testing-abolish loyalty oaths and security laws-abolish investigative committees on Communism-social revolution-increase foreign aid to Communist countries-recognize Red China-discredit J. Edgar Hoover and the F.B.I.-- destroy immigration and passport laws-and clemency for convicted spies.

Now these are just a few of the objectives shared by the Communist Party and the National Council of Churches. The chairman of the Committee on Interpretation of the National Council of Churches has stated, and I quote, "It is not unreasonable to prophesy that the churches ought to be able to control the whole economy of the nation within the predictable future." End of quote.


Now may I remind you that this Mational Council of Churches enjoys taxement status. Well, is it any wonder that Los Angeles Police Chief

It is this reporter's opinion that the Chief of Police of Los Angeles did not make such a charge frivolously—that he has complete documentation—that he will release such documentation at the proper moment—that it further enlarges upon his charge that a conspiracy exists to destroy our school system—and that if the National Council of Churches is on firm ground, that it immediately bring a lawsuit against the Chief and determine, in a court of law, as Sergeant Friday often puts it, "The facts—just the facts, ma'am."

Some time ago I read, or heard, a statement that I would like to have verified. I foolishly failed to record the source of the statement except that it was supposed to be a quote attributed to you and your office.

If the statement has any validity to it, it would be of great help in combating an insiduous reaction that truly hurts the positive program of the Church. Likewise, if the reaction has validity to it, then we have a moral obligation to truly face up and clean up. The reaction that I am referring to is that within the top leadership of the major Protestant churches, and especially the National Council of Churches, there are many people who are active in Communistic fronts. The implication is that these folks are calling the shots on many of the confrontations of today's issues.

The quotation that I recall was a statement to the effect that the number of people within the top leadership of the major denominations of Americaare surprisingly free of communistic influence, but that within the leadership of sect-type churches that the influence of Communist sympathisers are rather numerous.
