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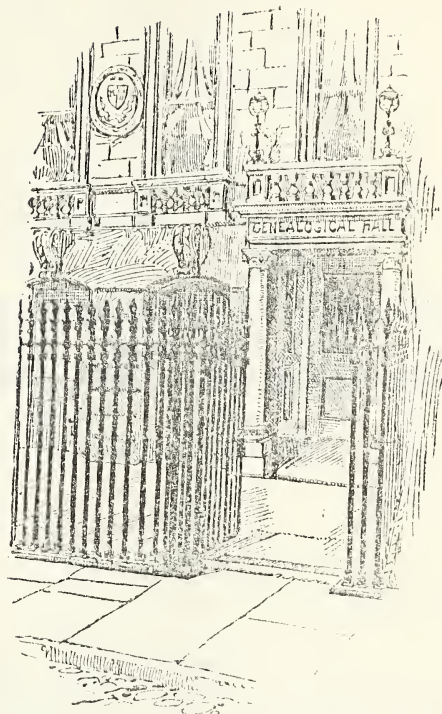

SUMMARY OF REPORTS

OF THE OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES MADE AT THE ANNUAL
MEETING, JANUARY 12TH, 1906

The Society has good cause for congratulation on the progress made during the year 1905.

The roll of members now comprises 270 annual, 126 life and 8 honorary members; making a total of 404, being a gain of 6 names for the year; and in addition thereto we have 11 corresponding members.

The names of the deceased members with obituary notices prepared by the Necrologist have appeared in our regular publication, "The Record."

The report of the Executive Committee indicates that the Society is in a more prosperous condition than ever before in its history.

The market value of our property is steadily increasing. Important improvements have been made as to the Hall, in redecorating, supplying new chairs, and in establishing a new system of ventilation, for which last we were indebted to the generosity of our President.

The rents for the rooms in our building were \$1,524, showing an increase of \$63 over the previous year.

The rents for the Hall were \$940, and are steadily improving.

The Society's publications, "Dutch Church Marriages and Baptisms," have proved, as was expected, very remunerative; the edition of the Marriages is entirely exhausted and that of the Baptisms rapidly becoming so.

SUMMARY OF REPORTS

A fourth volume of the "Society's Collections" is in preparation, which will include the "Church Records of Staten Island," a natural supplement to the previous publications.

The Treasurer shows that the net assets of the Society are now \$70,662.02, being an increase of \$5,200.70 during 1905.

The report follows at the close of this summary, and is so comprehensive in its details as to speak eloquently for itself.

The Secretary calls attention to the fact that seven meetings have been held, at which papers were read as follows:

In January, Annual Meeting of the Society, Election of Trustees, Annual Reports of Officers, Committees, etc.; in February, Edward Gaylord Bourne, Ph.D., Professor of History in Yale University, read a paper entitled "The Travels of Jonathan Carver;" in March, Williston Walker, Ph.D., D.D., Titus Street Professor of Ecclesiastical History in Yale Divinity School, read a paper on "Jonathan Edwards, the Man and His Works;" in April, Miss Mary V. Worstell delivered a lecture, illustrated with stereopticon views, on "James Wolfe, the Hero of Quebec;" in May, Mr. Evelyn Briggs Baldwin, Commander of the Baldwin-Ziegler Expedition, gave a lecture on "The Search for the North Pole," which was illustrated with stereopticon views and many articles used on the expedition; in November, Mr. Hopper Striker Mott read a paper entitled "Madison Square and Vicinity," illustrated with stereopticon views; in December,

Mr. William Ordway Partridge, the Sculptor, gave an address—subject, "Nathan Hale, Our National Hero."

All these meetings were unusually well attended.

The present prosperity of the Society emphasizes the fact that in the near future more space will be required for Library and Society accommodations.

It will be the earnest endeavor of the Officers of the Society to provide for this growing need.

The Publication Committee calls attention to the fact that "The Record" is paying expenses.

The amount received both from the subscriptions to "The Record" and the sale of back numbers, supplemented by the value of books presented to the Library (in consideration of review in "The Record"), is sufficient to render "The Record" self-supporting, with a fair balance annually to its credit.

"The Record" has still further been increased from 76 to 80 pages for each regular issue, exclusive of the index.

Opportunity is here taken to call the attention of all members to the desirability, if not to say duty, of supporting "The Record" by subscribing thereto, as an enlarged subscription roll is the only means of improving the character of the publication and increasing its influence as well.

The fact that "The Record" is self-supporting, as shown above, is only due to the persistent effort made by the Society in its behalf; and it is much to be desired that a fund be established, the income from which should be sufficient to place "The Record" on an entirely independent basis.

SUMMARY OF REPORTS

The Librarian reports 1,101 books, pamphlets, charts and manuscripts added during the year, of which 270 were bound volumes; being an increase of 99 over the previous year. These additions make an estimated total of 13,229 books, pamphlets and charts.

The value of the year's accessions amounted to \$1,558.52.

The number of visitors during the past year has been such as to emphasize the lack of space in the Library for consulting readers.

Owing to its increased prosperity the Society has been enabled to make more liberal appropriations for the purchase of books, which has resulted in adding to its shelves many standard genealogical works; nevertheless, the need still exists of a permanent endowment fund for the increase of the Library, and it is to be hoped that some means may be found to accomplish this end.

The Registrar of Pedigrees reports that 9 pedigrees have been filed during the year, so that we now have a total of 48.

The Historian spoke of his endeavors to get together an organized body of workers interested in collecting genealogical and historical notes relative to New York State, and that he was endeavoring to gradually secure corresponding members scattered throughout the State and representing as far as possible each county of it.

Although the Society has not been the recipient during the past year of any special bequests, yet its general financial condition was better during that period than in any previous year of its history, which should be a source of congratulation to its members.

INCORPORATION

WE, the subscribers, hereby certify that we have associated ourselves in pursuance of Title VII., Chapter XVIII., of Part I., of the Revised Statutes of the State of New York, for the purpose of promoting Genealogical and Biographical Science.

The name by which the Society is to be known is "THE NEW YORK GENEALOGICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL SOCIETY."

The particular business and objects of the Society are to discover, procure, preserve and perpetuate, whatever may relate to Genealogy and Biography, and more particularly to the genealogies and biographies of families, persons and citizens associated and identified with the State of New York.

The number of Trustees to manage the same shall be nine;* and the following are the names of the Trustees for the first year: Henry R. Stiles, M. D., David P. Holton, M. D., William Frederic Holcombe, M. D., Edward Chauncey Marshall, Seth Hastings Grant, Samuel Edward Stiles, Seymour Augustus Baker, D. D., Samuel Smith Purple, M. D., and Francis S. Hoffman.

The business of this Society is to be conducted and its place of business located in the City of New York.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I.

NAME

The name of this Society shall be "The New York Genealogical and Biographical Society."

ARTICLE II.

CORPORATE SEAL

The device hitherto used by the Society and herewith shown shall continue to be the seal of the Corporation.



ARTICLE III.

OBJECT AND AIM

The object and aim of this Society shall be to discover, procure, preserve and perpetuate whatever may relate to Genealogy, Biography and Local History; by the formation of a Library for reference; by the publication and dissemi-

nation of genealogical, biographical and historical material; by correspondence with kindred societies, genealogists and local historians, both in America and foreign countries; and by meetings for the transaction of business and the discussion of matters relating to the interests of this Society.

ARTICLE IV.

MEMBERSHIP

SEC. 1. The Society shall consist of Annual and Life members, paying fees and dues as hereinafter provided; also, Honorary and Corresponding members.

SEC. 2. Annual and Life members shall be elected as follows:—

The names of candidates shall be presented by members to the Secretary, who shall refer them to the Executive Committee for election. The list of members so elected shall be read by the Secretary before a meeting of the Society. Persons elected shall become members upon paying the fees and dues as hereinafter provided. The election of candidates who have not qualified at the expiration of thirty (30) days from date of notification may be rescinded at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. Honorary members shall be elected by unanimous vote of the Board of Trustees after being proposed at a previous meeting of the Board. Certificates of membership, signed by the President and Secretary, shall be presented to Honorary members.

BY - L A W S

SEC. 4. Corresponding members shall be elected for the current year by the Executive Committee. They shall be selected because of their special knowledge of genealogy and local history in their respective districts. No person shall be eligible to Corresponding membership who resides within the City of New York.

SEC. 5. A member may resign at any time by signifying his intention of so doing to the Secretary in writing and paying all arrears of dues to the Treasurer.

SEC. 6. Any member may be expelled for cause by vote of a majority of the Board of Trustees, one month's previous notice having been given to the member charged.

SEC. 7. The privileges of all members shall be subject to the Standing Rules.

ARTICLE V.

F E E S A N D D U E S

SEC. 1. The entrance fee of Annual Members shall be Ten Dollars, payable on notice of election, together with Five Dollars as dues for the current year. The dues for Annual Members shall be Five Dollars, payable on the first day of January. If a member fail to pay said dues for one year he shall thereupon cease to be a member, unless the Board of Trustees otherwise direct.

SEC. 2. The payment at one time of One 'Hundred Dollars shall constitute a Life Membership in the Society, and such Life Member shall thereupon be exempt from the payment of an entrance fee and of annual dues thereafter.

BY - L A W S

SEC. 3. In case of the death of a member—either Life or Annual—a member of his (or her) immediate family, as husband or wife, son or daughter, or brother or sister (in case the deceased was not married), may assume the membership of the deceased (as an annual member) by the payment of annual dues, without the payment of an entrance fee: provided the membership is assumed without lapse of time, and provided the applicant is duly elected by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI.

MEETINGS

The Society shall meet in the City of New York, and at such times as the Board of Trustees shall specify in the Standing Rules. Special meetings may be called under direction of the President, or at the written request of ten (10) members of the Society.

ARTICLE VII.

GOVERNMENT AND ELECTION OF TRUSTEES

SEC. 1. The government of this Society shall be vested in a Board of fifteen (15) Trustees, to be chosen as hereinafter provided, who shall have the custody of all buildings, funds, collections and other property of the Society, and shall have entire control and regulation of its affairs. Five members shall constitute a quorum of the Board for the transaction of business.

BY - LAWS

SEC. 2. The Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held on the second Friday of January, at which meeting there shall be elected by ballot, five (5) Trustees to fill the places of the Trustees whose terms shall then expire, and they shall hold office for three (3) years, or until their successors shall be elected.

SEC. 3. At the November or December meeting of the Society a Nominating Committee of five (5) members that are not officers, shall be appointed by the Chair, for the purpose of selecting and nominating candidates to be elected as Trustees at the next Annual Meeting. The Committee shall post these nominations on the bulletin board at least fifteen (15) days prior to the election. Any ten (10) or more members may nominate not more than five (5) candidates for the aforesaid election, by sending such nominations to the Secretary above their signatures, who shall post them on the bulletin board at least ten (10) days prior to the election.

SEC. 4. None but Life members, and Annual members not in arrears, shall be permitted to vote at any meeting of the Society, or hold the office of Trustee.

SEC. 5. In case an election for Trustees shall not be held at the time above appointed, such election may be held at the next regular meeting of the Society, or at a special meeting called for that purpose, in the manner hereinbefore provided; and the Trustees elected at such meeting shall hold their offices for the same terms as if they had been elected at the regular Annual Meeting.

B Y - L A W S

SEC. 6. The Trustees may declare vacant the place of any Trustee who shall be absent from three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board without sending an acceptable excuse therefor to the Secretary.

SEC. 7. The Trustees shall fill vacancies occurring in the Board during an unexpired term, and a Trustee so elected shall hold office for the remainder of such term.

SEC. 8. The Trustees shall elect from their own number the following Officers of the Society, viz:—

PRESIDENT,

TREASURER,

CHAIRMAN OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE;

and the Trustees shall elect from the Society at large (inclusive of the Board of Trustees if they deem it advisable) all other Officers of the Society and members of the Standing Committees. The Board of Trustees shall meet for such election and for other business on the Tuesday immediately following the regular election of Trustees; and they shall also meet on the second Tuesday of March, May and November in each year, and as much oftener as they may deem necessary, or as they may be called together by the President or any eight (8) members of the Board.

SEC. 9. The Officers and Standing Committees elected by the Board of Trustees as provided in Section 8 of this Article shall hold office for one (1) year or until their successors are elected.

BY - LAWS

ARTICLE VIII.

OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

SEC. 1. The officers and Standing Committees of the Society shall be :

A President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Librarian, a Historian, a Necrologist and a Registrar of Pedigrees; an Executive Committee of five (5) members, two of whom shall be the President and Treasurer of the Society; and a Publication Committee of five (5) members.

SEC. 2. There shall also be a Committee on Heraldry and a Committee on Research, members of which shall be appointed by the President.

ARTICLE IX.

PRESIDING OFFICER

The President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents, or in their absence a Chairman *pro tempore*, shall preside at all meetings of the Trustees and of the Society. He shall appoint all special committees authorized by the Trustees or by the Society.

ARTICLE X.

SECRETARY

The Secretary shall have the charge of the Seal, Charter, By-Laws and Records of the Board of Trustees, and of the Society. He, together with the Presiding Officer,

shall certify all acts of the Trustees and of the Society. He shall notify all members of their election, and of such other matters as shall be directed by the Society or the Trustees. He shall give due notice of the time and place of all meetings of the Trustees and of the Society, and shall attend the same. He shall keep fair and accurate records of all the proceedings of the Trustees and of the Society, and shall cause to be kept a proper membership roll, including deceased and living members. He shall give notice to the several officers and committees of all proceedings of the Trustees appertaining to their respective duties. He shall conduct the general correspondence of the Society, and shall present a written report to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE XI.

TREASURER

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to have the care and custody of all moneys and securities of the Society. He shall deposit the moneys in such bank or banks or other places of deposit as the Board of Trustees shall appoint, and shall have authority to sign cheques, drafts or orders for the withdrawal of moneys and securities. He shall make such disbursements as may be authorized by the Board of Trustees by general or specific action, or by the Executive Committee. He shall sign receipts for moneys coming into the Society, and shall keep or cause to be kept accurate accounts showing the receipts, disbursements and other financial affairs of the Society.

BY - LAWS

He shall, at each regular meeting of the Board, present a statement of his receipts and expenditures since the last meeting, and shall also present a written report to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE XII.

LIBRARIAN

The Librarian, in connection with the Executive Committee, shall have the charge and superintendence of the Library, and the care and arrangement of the books, manuscripts and other articles belonging to the Library. He shall cause to be prepared and kept a proper catalogue of the same, and shall acknowledge the receipt of donations to the Society in his department. He shall be present in the Library, in person or by an assistant, at such hours and times as may be appointed by the Executive Committee, and shall also present to the Society, at each Annual Meeting, a full written report on the condition and progress of the Library and collections.

ARTICLE XIII.

HISTORIAN

It shall be the duty of the Historian to direct the investigations and correspondence of the Committee on Research, in gathering genealogical and historical data for publication or preservation in the Library of the Society. He shall be the Chairman of the said Committee, and shall report their proceedings to the Board of Trustees, and to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

BY - LAWS

ARTICLE XIV.

NECROLOGIST

It shall be the duty of the Necrologist to prepare biographies of deceased members; and he shall deposit the same in the Library. He shall also cause to be placed on file in the Library, on blanks provided for that purpose, such biographical data of living members as he may be able to collect. He shall also present a written report to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE XV.

REGISTRAR OF PEDIGREES

It shall be the duty of the Registrar to secure pedigrees of the members of the Society. He shall cause a copy of such to be transcribed in the form issued by the Society and known as "The Register of Pedigrees," and shall certify to the correctness of the same, which register shall be deposited with the Librarian, and shall be open to the inspection of members only. He shall also certify all additions to the Register, and shall present a written report to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE XVI.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to generally superintend the interests of the Society and perform such duties as may be committed to them by the

Board of Trustees. They shall provide for the literary and other exercises of the Society. They shall have power to authorize the expenditure of moneys out of the general appropriations made by the Board of Trustees; and to examine into the general finances of the Society; and to make and alter the Standing Rules from time to time, subject to the approval of the Board. They shall also have power to elect candidates for Annual and Life membership in the Society. They shall have the management of the Society's buildings, the making of leases, and all matters pertaining thereto. They shall have charge of the sale and distribution of the Society's periodical and all other publications and duplicates. They shall, in connection with the Librarian, have charge of the arrangement and regulation of the Library and collections, and shall have authority at any time to examine into the condition of the same. They shall meet at least once in every month, and shall keep accurate minutes of all their transactions, and make their own rules. They shall make a written report to the Board of Trustees upon demand, and to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE XVII.

PUBLICATION COMMITTEE

SEC. I. The Society shall publish an official quarterly publication to be known as "The New York Genealogical and Biographical Record." Subscriptions to "The Record" shall be classified as follows:

BY - L A W S

Annual Subscriptions, terminating with the current year.

Life Subscriptions, terminating with the life of the subscriber.

Perpetual Subscriptions, actual property of the subscriber and subject to his disposition by bequest or inheritance.

The cost of such subscriptions to be regulated by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the Publication Committee to take charge of and manage the editing and printing of "The Record," and such other publications as the Board of Trustees may commit to them. They shall elect their own Chairman, who shall also act as Editor of "The Record." They shall, upon demand by the Board, report to them regarding all unpublished manuscripts in their possession, and shall, at least once in each quarter, render an account of expenditures to the Treasurer for settlement. They shall also make a written report to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE XVIII.

COMMITTEE ON HERALDRY

The Committee on Heraldry shall collect and preserve for the use of the Society, information on the subject of Heraldry; and all inquiries on the subject shall be referred to them for their opinion. They shall elect their own Chairman, and make a written report to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

BY - LAWS

ARTICLE XIX.

COMMITTEE ON RESEARCH

The Committee on Research shall consist of any number of persons each chosen to represent a particular locality with which he is familiar. It shall be the duty of each member to ascertain the facts relating to unpublished records and historical data lying within his territory, and to report the same to the Historian, to whom he shall render assistance in securing the same or copies thereof. The Committee shall not, either collectively or individually, obligate the Society to publish or purchase material, or incur any expense, unless authorized by the Board of Trustees. They shall, through their Chairman, report to the Board upon demand, and shall further make a written report to the Society at its Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE XX.

FUNDS

SEC. 1. All sums received from dues and rentals, and from the general income of "The Record," may be used for the maintenance of the Society, the support of "The Record," and the increase of the Library.

SEC. 2. All sums received from Life Membership and Entrance fees shall constitute a permanent fund, the income from which may be used for the support of "The Record," and the increase of the Library. The principal of this fund shall not be used except by resolution of the Board of Trustees.

B Y - L A W S

SEC. 3. All sums received from Life and Perpetual subscriptions to "The Record" shall constitute a permanent fund, the income from which shall be used to support "The Record." The principal of this fund shall forever remain intact.

SEC. 4. All sums received by gift or bequest shall be invested, and the names of the persons bestowing them shall be commemorated, as follows:

Donors.—Those who subscribe \$1,000: the same to be invested as a permanent fund, the income to be used for the benefit of the Society; the names of Donors to be perpetuated in the Society's Year Books.

Patrons.—Those who subscribe \$5,000: the same to be invested as a permanent fund, the income to be used for the benefit of the Society, or for such other purposes as may be designated by the Patron and approved by the Board of Trustees; the names of Patrons to be perpetuated in the Society's Year Books.

Benefactors.—Those who subscribe \$10,000 or more: the same to be invested as a permanent fund, the income to be used for the benefit of the Society, or appropriated as such Benefactor may direct subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees; the names of Benefactors to be perpetuated in the Society's Year Books. A Benefactor shall be entitled to an honorary seat in the Board of Trustees for life. On his death, Life Membership shall be conferred upon such one of his descendants, in perpetuity, as may be elected by the Board of Trustees.

BY - L A W S

SEC. 5. Donors, Patrons and Benefactors shall be entitled to Life Membership in the Society.

ARTICLE XXI.

AMENDMENTS

No amendments to the By-Laws of the Society shall be made unless each alteration shall have been openly proposed at a previous meeting of the Trustees, entered upon the minutes with the name of the Trustee or Trustees proposing the same, and adopted by a majority of the members of the Board. And in case of such proposed amendment, the Secretary shall be required to accompany the notice for the next meeting of the Board with a copy of the proposed amendment, stating that the same will be acted upon at the meeting for which the notice was given.

ARTICLE XXII.

EXTRACT FROM STANDING RULES

1. The Society Building and the Library shall be open to members and to persons introduced by them from 10 A. M. to 6 P. M. on all week days and holidays, and on Monday evenings from 8 to 10, except New Years Day, Independence Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas. The Library may be closed during the months of July, August and September.

2. The Society shall meet on the evening of the second Friday in each month, except during June, July, August, September and October.

3. Members may have access to the Lecture Hall and Members' Room except when the same are rented or in use for Committee or Board meetings of the Society.

4. Members shall not command any service of the Janitor or his assistants, outside of the building, without the permission of the Executive Committee.

5. The Library shall not be opened during the absence of the Librarian and his assistant, except to a member of the Board of Trustees, an officer of the Society, or on an order from the Executive Committee.

6. Any person not a member may obtain the privileges of the Library for one week or less upon the recommendation of a member to whom the applicant is known. But

no person shall be permitted to make abstracts from the manuscripts of the Society without special authority from the Executive Committee.

7. Members of the Society and persons having the privileges of the Library will, in all cases, call upon the Librarian or his assistant for such books as they may wish to consult, which must be returned to the Librarian before the closing of the Library. All persons using the Library are specially requested to leave books on the table without attempting to replace them on the shelves. All memoranda must be made with pencil; the use of ink is prohibited.

8. No book or manuscript shall at any time be removed from the Library, except for the purpose of review or publication for the Society, or for use in the Members' Room.

9. Certain books, at the discretion of the Librarian, may be removed to the Members' Room for use, provided the member signs a proper card of withdrawal obtained from the Librarian.

10. It shall be the duty of the Librarian to report to the Executive Committee any injury done to any book or manuscript by persons consulting the same; and the said Committee may, at their discretion, lay such reports before the Board of Trustees. For any such injury, the person committing it shall make such pecuniary compensation as the said Committee shall judge proper; and if he be not a member, the Committee shall have power to prohibit him from further access to the Library.

TO THE MEMBERS

The Society having been placed on a self-supporting basis, the attention of the members is urgently called to the necessity for establishing permanent funds for special purposes. The income derived from dues and from rentals must be mainly devoted to the general running expenses of the Society and the maintenance of the building. It is to be hoped that those of our members who are able to do so, and other public spirited individuals will become Donors to, or Patrons or Benefactors of, the Society.

NEEDS OF THE SOCIETY

A new modern fire-proof library building in an accessible location to accommodate the Society, including hall, library, office, members room, etc.

For the Library a permanent fund, the income from which to be devoted to the purchase of works relating to genealogy, **\$20,000**

For "The Record" a permanent fund, the income from which to be used to support the publication and enable it to be enlarged and improved, . . . **\$30,000**

Special funds for the publication of the Society's Collections including hitherto unpublished Church and Town Vital Records, the amount in each instance to be governed by the nature of the publication.

Any sums contributed towards any of the above specified needs of the Society will be set aside and invested for such specific purpose as the Donor may elect; and whereas large donations are desired, yet it should be borne in mind that small donations will in the aggregate accomplish the same purpose.
