


IN APPRECIATION

For the fourth consecutive year, war is, on the Ole Miss campus as it is everywhere, the dominating factor. Constant change, continued disruption—and yet through it all, the steadfast determination toward the traditional, the usual, the old way of life. Activities which at first were cast aside to make place for war changes, are gradually creeping back into their original places—indicative of the endeavor to fight a total war and at the same time to cling to the way of the past.

Dr. A. W. Green, absent since February, 1942, as lieutenant colonel in the Judge Advocate General's department, returned in September to resume his position as dean of Graduate School and professor of

English. Dr. Green, who served in this country and abroad, re-entered service in December, however, this time in the Army of Occupation.

Dr. James W. Silver, acting professor of history for the past two years, was given leave of absence to serve in the American Red Cross. He left in February to be trained, after which he will be stationed overseas as personnel representative to men in combat areas.

At the opening of this year, the enrollment of women reached the highest peak yet attained. Ricks Hall, which had been closed for several years, was opened to take care of this increase in women students. An attempt toward prewar status was made when football and band activities, excluded during the past year, were reinstated. The band, which was directed by Mrs. J. W. 
Thus the year has gone—a little less confusion—a little nearer victory—but overshadowing all else, a greater realization of the totality of war as it effects each individual.

THE '44 SEASON

The Rebels' 1944 football season, according to the record books was far from a successful one. Ole Miss was forced to play one of the hardest schedules in the nation with, perhaps, the youngest team. Coach Mehre made a promise to the student body and to the alumni in the spring of 1944 that the coming season was not to be the important one. The emphasis would be in securing material that would help the University in the years following the war. To accomplish this, football prospects were judged for their possible benefit to Ole Miss later on as well as in the current season. The result of the final game of the year justified Coach Mehre's faith in building for the future with young men who can be developed into outstanding gridiron performers. They will constitute the nucleus of great Rebel elevens to come. It is safe to say that future stars blazing across the football heavens will be players like Bruce, McCain, Brewer, Pearce, Hooker, Butler, Clark, Arnette, Tiblier, Rose and a host of others who received little national recognition for work well done in a losing cause.

Kentucky 26-Ole Miss 6

When Coach Mehre took his football team to Lexington to meet the highly regarded University of Kentucky Wildcats, it was weight and experience that won 26 to 6 for Kentucky. The lighter Rebels could do nothing with the Wildcat line that averaged 204 pounds to the man and was composed of 4-F's and returned veterans. However, Ole Miss, led by Johnnie Bruce and Jerry Tiblier, took the opening kickoff and drove straight down the field for a touchdown. A disastrous second quarter in which Kentucky racked up 20 points spelled defeat for a team that had Captain Bob McCain as the only experienced man on the squad.

Ole Miss 26—Florida 6

Ole Miss hit the victory column for the first time against the University of Florida at Jacksonville when they put the works to the 'Gators 26 to 6. Clyde Hooker and Aaron Timmons took charge of a fourth-quarter Rebel scoring spree that saw them gain 19 points in less than eight minutes. Jimmie Butler played a great defensive game at guard when he and Jerry Tiblier sparked two magnificent goal-line stands that found the Rebels twice stopping Florida inside the three-yard line.

Tennessee 20-Ole Miss 7

October 7 found a Rose Bowl-bound Tennessee team taking the Rebels 20 to 7. Major, on the first play of the game, sneaked 76 yards for a Tennessee touchdown. Ole Miss rallied briefly when McCain went 69 yards to score in the second quarter and Hooker tied it up with a perfect placement. The Vols wrapped up the game with touchdowns in the second and third quarters, while Ole Miss ran the ball over the gridiron without being able to score again.





Alabama 35–0le Miss 7

The Alabama story can be told in three simple words—"too much football." Ole Miss went to Mobile after playing six tough games with practically no rest to meet a "victory hungry" Alabama team and was defeated 35 to 7. The Rebels flashed to life only once in the game when they made scoring look simple by driving 60 yards against Alabama's first team in the second quarter to score their only touchdown. Bruce sent Hooker across for the tally with a beautiful pass from the 35-yard line.

Ole Miss 13-State 8

An inspired Ole Miss team wound up an unsuccessful season by turning it into a success with a stunning upset over Mississippi State 13 to 8. The Rebels rode to glory on the running of Bob McCain, who went 22 yards on an end around to score the first touchdown, and on the magic toe and left arm of a kid named Johnnie Bruce, who kicked and passed the Maroons dizzy all afternoon. Ole Miss broke a 6-6 tie in the third period by traveling 65 yards on three passes and two running plays for the points that meant the game. Bruce carried over on a quarterback sneak. Big Jimmie Clark, out all season with a charleyhorse, constantly jammed up the State offense and took charge of a goal-line stand that found the Rebels stopping State's great Shorty McWilliams cold in the last minute of the game. The Maroons scored once on a pass from Colston to Moore and again when Horne blocked a Bruce kick for a safety. Little Rex Pearce did his share by pulling Moore down from behind after a 50-yard race for the goal line, while Jack Brewer wrote his name in Ole Miss football history with his great play at end. In fact, the entire Rebel team were the heroes of a victory that brought the famed "Golden Egg" back to the campus after a four-year absence.


DELTA GAMMA




