REPORT TO THE SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE & FISHERIES.

SIR,

I HAVE now to submit the complete Agricultural Statistic for 1903. The volume not only brings together the information collected in the Agricultural Returns of Acreage, Live Stock, and Produce of Crops, already separately issued, but it also furnishes particulars of the Imports and Exports of Agricultural Produce, the Prices of Corn, of Live Stock and other commodities, the Weather Records of the year, and various details which are not available until some time after the close of the calendar year. Occasion is also taken to bring into this annual volume the latest statistics relating to the Agriculture of British Possessions and of Foreign Countries. In the preparation of these Tables the Board have again to acknowledge the co-operation of the Board of Trade, the Commissioners of Customs, the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, the Meteorological Office, and the Lieutenant-Governors of the Isle of Man and Channel Islands, as well as the assistance lent by the various Colonial authorities, and by the Official Departments of several Foreign Countries.

New features in the scope of the statistics now presented will New Table be found in the ampler records of the meteorological conditions of the year, and in the tables which classify the Agricultural Holdings of Great Britain, according to size, for the purpose of comparison with earlier enquiries. Tables extracted from the publications of the Inland Revenue Department and the Local

Government Board now also appear, which furnish such data as are available respecting the changes which have occurred during thirty years in the Annual Value of Land, according to the assessments in force for Income Tax and Rating purposes.

Number of Returns.

The statistics of the Acreage and Live Stock in Great Britain in 1903 have been compiled from 513,415 separate schedules, representing the distribution of the crops and numbers of the animals on the holdings of occupiers of more than one acre of land. The number of individual returns thus collected numbered in England 373,206, in Wales, 60,506, and in Scotland, 79,703, while supplementary returns, as regards live stock only, were received from 10,029 owners of stock, who either occupied no land at all, or whose holdings did not exceed one acre. The collection was, as in other years, effected by the Officers of Inland Revenue, who report that resort to estimates, in the absence of voluntary information, was necessitated in less than 3 per cent. of the total number of individual returns.

Publication of Returns.

A preliminary statement, shewing the total area under each crop and the number of each class of live stock in Great Britain, as returned on the 4th June, 1903, was issued on 26th August last. A more detailed abstract was issued on the 11th September, and a direct distribution of 250,000 copies of these tables to occupiers was effected in the course of that month. The publication of the Acreage and Live Stock Returns of the year was completed in October, by the issue of the usual Departmental paper, which was extended on this occasion so as to supply, at an earlier date than before, comparisons with earlier quinquennial periods, and a new series of tables showing concisely the changes occurring in each county in Great Britain in 1903, as compared with 1902.

The estimates of the total produce and average yield per acre of the British crops were issued on December 8th, and the complete Produce Returns, with details for counties, and totals for the United Kingdom, were published, after receipt of the summary returns for Ireland, on March 3rd. Each section of the complete Returns was accompanied by a memorandum of observations explanatory of the prominent features of the statistics, and this information is now rendered promptly accessible to the general public by these publications being separately placed on sale.

The latest measurements of the Ordnance Survey place Total Area, the total extent of Land and Water, in Great Britain, exclusive of foreshore and tidal water, at 56,787,000 acres, of which 587,000 acres are inland water. The Agricultural Returns account for some 84 per cent. of the measured surface, whereof 32,344,000 acres were returned as under crops and grass, and 12,868,000 acres were accounted for as being mountain and heath land used for grazing, while the special returns of woodlands, last collected in 1895, showed that 2,726,000 acres were at that date occupied by woods and plantations. In the remaining 16 per cent. of the surface, it is to be remembered, there is included not only land incapable of profitable cultivation, but also the area occupied by the minor holdings of one acre or less, which are not the subject of annual returns. It embraces, likewise, a considerable and yearly increasing area withdrawn from cultivation in consequence of the rapid extension of the urban population, and absorbed by its manifold requirements for residential, commercial, industrial and recreative purposes.

SIZE OF HOLDINGS.

With the view of discovering whether any noteworthy changes in the size of holdings in recent years were disclosed by the totals of acreage now accounted for in the individual occupiers' schedules, the officers collecting the returns of 1903 were instructed to furnish an abstract of the number of holdings in separate groups of size, so as to elicit specific information on this point. The results do not show that any very distinctive alteration in the size of farms is in progress at the present time in Great Britain. Such change as is indicated suggests, however, relative growth in the numbers of those medium-sized farms, lying between fifty and three hundred acres, in which, as I have shewn on former occasions, the larger portion of the cultivated land of Great Britain is held. The classes of holdings both immediately below and above this group exhibit a reduction in number, which is relatively most pronounced in the comparatively small number of "over 300 acre" holdings in this country.

For more than one reason it is not advisable to utilise the statistics relating to the very smallest group of units of occupation accounted for in the Agricultural Returns—those running from over one acre up to five acres—for comparison

Agricultural Holdings with earlier data than those for 1895. Although reaching 22 per cent. of the total number, the numerous petty holdings of this grade are really agriculturally insignificant. The surface which they represent forms in the aggregate little, if any, more than one per cent. of the cultivated area of Great Britain; and it is recognised that the occupiers of these plots of land must often belong to classes deriving their means of living from sources other than farming. The influences, also, which affect the increase or diminution of their number, are more complex and varied than are encountered in dealing with holdings not equally dominated by the local and residential considerations that prevail in this group. There is, moreover, a still more potent reason for omitting a comparison of this class of holdings with the returns obtained in the earlier enquiry of 1885, when it is remembered that the older practice of including in the Agricultural Returns a considerable number of holdings measuring exactly one acre was discontinued in 1892. Enquiry made in 1895 showed that these acre plots if brought into account would have added more than 14 per cent. to the minor holdings embraced in the smallest class actually returned in the enquiry of that year, and means are not now available to estimate with any precision their number either in 1885 or 1903.

With comparative safety, however, the growth or diminution in the several grades of holdings exceeding five acres may be traced by contrasting the earlier data with the latest returns, and this information applies to 99 per cent. of the distinctive area of 32,000,000 acres on which British farming is carried on, and on which the distribution of the crops is described in detail in the yearly Agricultural Returns.

The number of separate "occupations" in which this surface was farmed varied, as under, at the last three investigations :—

The relative importance of the three classes specially contrasted above may be usefully illustrated by quoting the percentage

distribution of the acreage in each category. Although not the subject of specific enquiry on the present occasion, this percentage was determined as lately as in 1895, when of the farmed area brought under review there was allotted to the "5 to 50" acre farms some 14 per cent. of the cultivated surface, to the medium class of 50 to 300 acre farms 58 per cent., and to the "over 300 acre farms" 27 per cent. of the whole.

The table above given suggests that the multiplication of the 5 to 50 acre holdings, which was indicated by their advance in the ten years 1885-95 by over 2,500, or rather more than one per cent., has been followed by a check of nearly equal proportions in the eight years which have since elapsed. The medium-sized farms of the country have in the same interval continuously increased over both periods, and they number now nearly 6,000 more than in 1885, while the occupations constituting the large-farm section of "over 300 acre" holdings have dropped from 19,364 to 18,081. The distinctive nature of this decline of 6·6 per cent. in 18 years in the numbers of the larger farms is thus sufficiently clear, while the total increase in the number of recorded holdings of all grades exceeding the 5 acre limit was about one per cent.

Below this limit, comparison, as already shewn, is only possible with the 1895 figures, and, although the class of one to five acre holdings is by no means representative of ordinary agricultural conditions, the disappearance of 6,611 such holdings in eight years represents a diminution of rather less than 6 per cent. in the numbers of the smallest group. This result may, in great part, be due to that absorption of small plots of cultivated land on the borders of urban areas, which is particularly likely to affect this grade of holding, as the concentration of population in the towns proceeds.

The average size of an Agricultural Holding has now been ascertained on several occasions, and the arithmetical result of dividing the cultivated acreage accounted for in 1903 by the total number of separate units recorded in Tables VI. to XII., including even the one acre to five acre group—shows no such material alteration of proportions as to vary the round figure of 63 acres quoted for Great Britain in 1895—although a percentage of change in the direction of increase makes its appearance if the calculation be carried to a place of decimals as in the figures offered in Table VI.

More interesting it may be to show, for the farms which begin at something over five acres, and with which a legitimate comparison can be carried further back, how in the different agricultural divisions of the country there has been some variation in the course of the slight general movement in the direction of reduction between 1885, 1895 and 1903 respectively. The average acreage of an "over five acre" holding at the dates mentioned was as under:—

The large farm counties of 1885 and 1895 remain the large farm counties of 1903. Leaving out of consideration, as any calculation of this nature must, the estimated areas of hill land and rough grazings which widely extend the surface occupied in some counties, it will be seen that the average English holding varies from 123 acres of cultivated crops and grass in Northumberland, and 107 in Wiltshire, to 45 acres in Cornwall and to only 44 acres in the West Riding of York, in Cheshire and in Middlesex. In two counties the average is still lower, for it sinks to 42 and 41 acres respectively in Derbyshire and Lancashire. The 81 acres appearing as the average of the holdings lying within the county of London is of course, for obvious reasons, exceptional. In Wales as small a county average as 28 acres is reported from Carnarvon, while, as in 1895, the range in Scotland is much greater than in England—averages exceeding 200 acres being credited to Berwickshire and East Lothian, while in Ross-shire and in Inverness an average cultivated

holding is only about one-tenth of this figure, and the average Crop Areas cultivated holdings of Shetland and of Sutherland decline to 16 and even 12 acres.

CHANGES IN CROP AREAS.

The following extracts from the Memorandum prefixed to the Acreage and Live Stock Returns for 1903 are here reproduced for convenience of permanent reference, as shewing the salient features of the recorded changes in the distribution of crops during the year.

The reduction in the area of land under the plough in Great Britain which has now continued annually since 1875, with only three slight checks, in 1885, 1894 and 1897, still continues. In the present year a further withdrawal of 172,000 acres from arable cultivation is recorded, thus bringing the total below 15½ million acres, or three million acres less than it was thirty years ago. The loss in 1903 occurred almost entirely in England and Wales, the position in Scotland, in spite of some local changes in the different counties, being practically maintained. The greatest absolute reductions reported were in Essex, 12,000 acres, Wiltshire, 9,000 acres, and Gloucestershire, 8,000 acres.

The decrease by 145,000 acres, or 8½ per cent., in the acreage returned as under Wheat in 1903 reduced the area under that crop in Great Britain to 1,582,000 acres, a smaller surface than in any year except 1895. The chief cause of this somewhat marked decline appears to have been the unfavourable sowing time, while the fact that oats are considered to be generally a more remunerative crop had some influence in the same direction. The uniformity of the decline throughout England and Wales may be seen by a reference to the detailed county figures in Table II. or, more concisely, in the summary of Increases and Decreases presented in Table XIII. In no English and in only one Welsh county was an increase recorded, and although in Scotland there was rather less consistency, the exceptions to the general rule were insignificant.

The acreage of Barley fell in 1903, by the decrease of 51,000 acres—2·7 per cent.—to 1,858,000 acres, this area being the lowest on record. The dependence of the barley crop on the weather at harvest was no doubt emphasised by the experience of 1902, and combined with other causes to induce farmers to place less reliance upon it. It will be observed that the decline in Scotland was relatively much greater than in England, and in the counties of Aberdeen, Banff, and Ross and Cromarty, where the largest reductions occurred, it was attributed by the Collectors to low prices, the failure of last year's crop and the smaller demand by distillers.

Oats are reported from many districts to have been substituted for Wheat, and the increase by 83,000 acres, or 2·7 per cent., in the acreage under this crop places it at a higher level than in any previous year except 1893, 1894, and 1895. Oats now cover rather more than

Crop Areas. one-fifth of the total arable area of Great Britain, and only 300,000 acres less than the acreage under wheat and barley combined. The increase in 1903 was fairly consistent throughout the country, only six counties in England, two in Wales and eight in Scotland exhibiting a decline. The counties showing the largest additions were Lincoln, Norfolk, Lancaster, Aberdeen and the East Riding.

The decrease by nearly 10,000 acres of the acreage under Potatoes is of significance, reducing that crop, as it practically does, to the position which it occupied in 1900. In Scotland and the Northern division of England there was an increase in the Potato acreage, and in the important county of Lincoln also there was a slight gain. But over the rest of England the reduction was considerable, being most marked in Bedford, Cambridge, Notts, Hampshire and Devon. The unfavourable season for planting was among the causes assigned for the diminished area.

The area under Turnips and Swedes has year by year declined during the past decade, and the movement in the same direction was continued in 1903, although only to the extent of 5,000 acres, or 0·3 per cent. The local changes were as a rule small, but it appears that the reduction was mainly in the typical corn-growing counties, while in the pastoral counties a tendency to increase the turnip break was frequently indicated.

That Turnips and Swedes have been to some extent replaced by Mangolds is an observation which has sometimes been made in commenting upon the Agricultural Returns, and the fact that during the thirty years ending with 1902 the one crop has decreased by about 24 per cent. and the other increased by about 18 per cent. may be said to have justified this suggestion. During the present year, however, the acreage under mangolds was reduced by 40,000 acres, or 9 per cent., the unfavourable season for sowing and the heavy root crop of the previous year being referred to as probable causes. The decline was most marked in Yorkshire, while material reductions are also reported from Lincoln, Norfolk, and Essex.

An increase by 48,000 acres in that portion of the area under Clovers and Rotation Grasses which was cut for hay was more than set off by a decrease of 72,000 acres in the area from which no crop of hay was taken. The nett decrease of 24,000 acres was mainly attributable to the loss of nearly 20,000 acres which was recorded in Wales alone. In the Eastern division of England an equivalent gain was made, but this was somewhat more than balanced by losses in the Southern, Western, and North-Western counties.

By an increase of 128,000 acres, the area returned as Permanent Grass now reaches 16,934,000 acres in Great Britain, and this area is exclusive of the surface of nearly 13,000,000 acres returned as mountain and heath land used for grazing. In England and Wales the increase was general, and in some counties, notably Essex, Devon, Gloucester, Wilts, Anglesey, and Denbigh, considerable.

Summary of the United Kingdom. The addition to the statistics collected for Great Britain of the figures for Ireland, supplied by the Irish Agricultural Department, and also of those furnished for the Channel Islands and

PRODUCE OF CROPS.

The general result of the year's harvest in Great Britain was so largely influenced by the weather conditions of the year that it has been thought desirable on this occasion to obtain and place on record additional information exhibiting both the local variations in the rainfall and temperature and the distribution of excess or defect in these particulars between the different quarters of the year. This I have been enabled to do in the tables which have been supplied by the Meteorological Office, whose help in this matter has been readily forthcoming. In addition to the statistics previously published in these returns, the data recorded by the Meteorological Office have now been presented in groups corresponding to the Agricultural Divisions or groups of counties adopted by this Board in analysing the acreage and produce returns of the year.

Excessive rainfall characterised the weather of 1903, the annual amount in some localities exceeding the highest previously recorded. The autumn of 1902 had, as already noted in last year's Report, been on the whole favourable to farming; the temperature in England being generally above the average, with a relatively low rainfall. The year under review opened with a temperature and rainfall somewhat above the average, January proving the first of ten successive months in which the

precipitation over Great Britain as a whole was above the mean. February and March were distinctly warmer than usual, and the latter month proved very wet. The conditions during the first quarter of the year, however, materially differed in different parts of the country. This three months' rainfall was, in England, but little more than average, and did not, indeed, exceed the mean in the east, whereas it was nearly double the average in Scotland. Temperature in April was decidedly low, especially during the latter half, when sharp frosts were of frequent occurrence. It is to this fortnight, following the warm period that had preceded April, that much of the general failure of the fruit crops may be attributed. In Scotland, the rainfall during the second quarter of the year proved under average; while most parts of England had a large excess. The heavy rains of June fell on comparatively few days, and came largely in the form of thunderstorms. In the summer the excess of wet was greatest in England; the temperature, however, was not very much below the normal. The persistent excess of rainfall from May onward, culminating as it did in the extraordinary fall of nearly seven inches in October, did much damage to the quality of the crops, and abnormally protracted the harvest. Considering the year as a whole, the temperature did not vary greatly from the average, and the recorded bright sunshine would appear to have fallen only about 6 per cent. below the mean of the preceding twenty years.

Comparison
with 1879.

The losses of this exceptional season caused by the poor condition of the crops make it of interest to compare the chief meteorological features of 1903 with those of 1879, a year of agricultural disaster, and distinguished by a very wet summer. The particulars supplied by the Meteorological Office for this comparison are given, so far as regards rain and temperature, in Tables LVI. to LVIII., where it may be noted that the first quarter of 1879 was, in England, a good deal wetter than that of 1903, but that the reverse held good north of the Border. Both the second and third quarters were, except in Scotland, rather wetter in 1879 than in 1903. The rainfall of June, July, and August, in the earlier season, indeed, nearly reached 14 inches, as against a normal supply of 8 inches, while last year it was $10\frac{1}{2}$ inches. The rainfall in the fourth quarter of 1879 was, however, singularly small, and, indeed, the autumn fall in 1903 was nearly three times that of the same months of 1879.

Striking an average for Great Britain, the total fall in the first nine months of these two years was practically identical; and it was the deficiency in the autumn rains of 1879 which prevented the total recorded precipitation of that calendar year from being much more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches above the mean, whereas in 1903, with an average fall of 40·6 inches throughout Great Britain, it was $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches above the normal figure. The excess in the year 1879 was greatest in England, while in Scotland a deficiency, indeed, was apparent amounting to nearly 20 per cent. on the west coast. The number of days on which rain fell was greater in 1903 than in 1879, but the average temperature of 1879 was practically throughout the year much lower.

Harvesting operations in 1903 began late, a consideration of the reports received from the Estimators indicating that they commenced throughout Great Britain nearly a week later than in the preceding season, which was itself a late one. But the most important feature was undoubtedly the duration of the harvest, which was exceptionally protracted more or less in every district, and was in some instances not completed when the estimates for the year had to be furnished in November.

In viewing the quantitative results of the crops secured, which alone can be expressed in the tables of estimated yield, the caution given in 1902 must be repeated as regards the quality of the produce in the harvest of 1903. The detailed reports received from the local Estimators fully recognised the serious effects of the wet weather which characterised the past season. Had the time of ingathering been favourable the yield of farm crops generally might have been satisfactory. Apparently wherever the crops were bulky the quality was inferior, the wet weather causing growth but the lack of timely sunshine preventing development; while—as not unusually happens under the diversified agricultural conditions of the British Isles—instances of widely different results, sometimes even in the same neighbourhood, fell to be chronicled. One report, for example, mentions that 16 bushels and 40 bushels per acre of wheat were the two extremes which occurred in a single district.

Owing it may be to the very wet weather, there were few reports of damage from insects. Wireworms and turnip fly were stated to have been troublesome in some places, but the latter,

more particularly, did less damage than usual. On the other hand, potato disease appears to have been seriously prevalent throughout England, and there was no county in which one or more Estimators did not report a large proportion of diseased tubers. As might be expected, the blight was generally worst on heavy lands, and perhaps the southern and eastern districts suffered, on the whole, somewhat more than the north-western. Generally speaking also, the later crop suffered most, although in a few instances the reverse was the case. Finger and toe was frequently mentioned as affecting the turnip crops. Scotland appears to have suffered much less than England from potato disease. On the other hand, north of the Tweed, finger and toe seems to have been a good deal more prevalent.

Comparative Yields.

The following table shows the relation which the yield of the principal crops in Great Britain bore in each of the last eleven years to the average of the decade 1893-1902:—

For the record of particular crops, the following extracts from the Memorandum which was issued with the Produce Returns in March last describe the results and may be here reproduced for reference:—

Wheat.

The yield per acre of Wheat in Great Britain was estimated at 30.13 bushels per acre, or only two-fifths of a bushel less than the average of the preceding ten years, but this, in conjunction with the smaller area from which the crop was taken, reduced the total production to a figure below that of any year since 1895. The decline in the average yield was not everywhere apparent. In several counties the decennial average appears to have been exceeded. But while nearly a third of the area under Wheat in Great Britain lies in the four contiguous counties of Essex, Suffolk, Norfolk, and Lincoln, in only one of

these counties, Norfolk, was the estimated yield of 1903 over the Wheat, decennial mean, and there the Wheat crop was reported to have been on the whole of fair quality although generally harvested in bad condition. Taking the country generally the effect upon the Wheat crop of the unfavourable harvest weather was very marked. The quality of the grain varied very considerably, a large portion of it being damp and quite unfit for market until it had been well dried in stack. In Kent, Surrey and Sussex, as well as in Cornwall, Devon and Dorset, the estimated yield was fairly satisfactory as regards quantity, but it was more or less below the average throughout the Western and Northern counties. On the small area under Wheat in Wales and on the still smaller area in Scotland, the yield was reported as slightly under the average in the one case, and considerably so in the other.

The yield of Barley was relatively more unsatisfactory than that of Barley. Wheat, being four-fifths of a bushel below the average, while the quality was prejudicially affected by the weather to an even greater degree. Here again the results in the Eastern counties appear to have been variable, but out of 797,000 acres under Barley in this division only about one-fourth bore a crop which was estimated above the average. The counties thus favourably circumstanced were Bedford, Cambridge and Suffolk, but even in these counties much of the crop was reported as damp and discoloured and fit only for feeding purposes. The influence of the weather may be traced in the fact that the districts from whence the most favourable reports of the Wheat crop were received were also those wherein the yield of Barley was most satisfactory. Thus Cornwall reports a Barley crop considerably above its normal average, while Devon and Dorset in the South-West, and Kent and Sussex in the South-East, seem to have been favoured in comparison with the Northern and Western counties generally. In Northumberland, where Barley occupies 33,000 acres, the estimated yield was only $26\frac{1}{2}$ bushels per acre, as compared with a local decennial average of $36\frac{1}{2}$ bushels, and in Wilts, where a similar area is grown, the deficiency was 5 bushels per acre. The Welsh crop of Barley was generally poor, notwithstanding the fact that Pembrokeshire, where more Barley is grown than in the remaining Welsh counties, seems to have obtained over-average results. In Scotland the yield generally fell below the average by the same amount as in England.

Oats now occupy by far the largest portion of the area under cereals Oats. in Great Britain, and the yield of this crop in the past year was much more abundant than that of either wheat or barley, being $39\frac{1}{2}$ bushels per acre, or about one bushel in excess of the decennial average. In England the estimated yield was about 42 bushels per acre, or two bushels above the average. In five counties an average yield of over 50 bushels per acre was indicated, viz.: Lincoln, Norfolk, Cambridge, Sussex and Dorset. Generally the wet summer was not so injurious to the growth of this cereal as to that of wheat and barley, although the quality and condition were of course seriously affected. In the Northern counties the crops were generally under average. The position in Wales was exactly the reverse of that in England, the estimated yield being $2\frac{1}{2}$ bushels below the average, Pembrokeshire alone rising above the mean. In Scotland an average of $36\frac{1}{2}$ bushels per acre was obtained as the result of moderately bulky crops in the Eastern counties, set off by under average returns from the Northern and Western divisions.

Beans.

The area under Beans in Great Britain was 238,861 acres, and the estimated yield was 4·12 bushels above the average. In Suffolk and Lincoln, where comparatively large areas are devoted to this crop, good results were obtained, and it was reported to be the only grain crop that did well in the latter county. Beans are but little cultivated in Scotland, and the small area yielded crops 1½ bushels below the average. A similarly unsatisfactory result was obtained in the North of England generally.

Peas.

The acreage under Peas, like that of beans, is nearly all in England, where the production was above the average, but poor results were recorded in Lincoln, Essex and Norfolk, counties which comprise more than one-third of the English area.

Potatoes.

The Potato crop of the past year was very indifferent, the estimated average being only 5·16 tons as against 5·57 tons in 1902. In only four counties of England and Wales was the crop reported as exceeding the decennial average. The main crop in the important potato-growing county of Lincoln was much diseased, and badly harvested owing to the wet condition of the land. In Lancashire a large extent of land was reported to be unproductive from the same cause, the tubers rotting in the ground. One result has been to create an active demand for disease-resisting sorts for seed. In Scotland the position appears to have been somewhat more satisfactory than South of the Border, though a good deal of disease is reported in the crop. In the Southern counties the results were summarised by one estimator as follows : "The crop was a partial failure owing to cold, too much wet and want of sun. Growers began to lift the crop late in the autumn under unfavourable conditions, and on heavy soils it was thought that an appreciable proportion of the crop would be unfit for table use."

Turnips and
Swedes.

The estimated yield per acre of Turnips and Swedes in 1903 coincides precisely with the average of the preceding ten years for England. In Norfolk, which contains the largest acreage of any county in England, the yield was more than 2 tons below the average, the growth being retarded by the absence of sun. In Lincoln, where the area is nearly as great, the results were better, though similar conditions interfered to some extent with the maturing of the crop, and the feeding properties of the roots are said not to be so good as last year. In Wales the crop was half a ton, and in Scotland 1½ tons, below the average.

Mangolds.

Mangolds were estimated at 18 tons per acre in England, or rather more than the decennial mean. In most of the Eastern counties the yield was unsatisfactory, but in the Western and Southern districts the crop did fairly well.

Hay.

Some compensation for the generally unsatisfactory harvest of other crops was obtained by the comparatively successful ingathering of the hay from clover, sainfoin, and other seeds, which yielded about 4 cwts. per acre in excess of the average in England. All the English counties showed good results except the Northern group comprising Lancaster, Cumberland, Westmorland, Northumberland and Durham. Fair weather during the latter part of June and the beginning of July enabled the first cut of "seeds" to be secured in good order, but the second cut was much damaged by the wet weather, and in many cases completely spoilt. In Wales the crop was four-fifths of a cwt. below the average. In Scotland the cold spring retarded the growth of the crop which yielded less than 29 cwts. per acre as compared with an average of nearly 32 cwts.

The result in the case of Hay from permanent pasture in England Hay, was very similar to that of Clover Hay, a yield of nearly 26½ cwts. being secured, and where harvested early got in good condition. Low-lying lands suffered much from floods and consequent damage to the crops. In Scotland the yield fell below the average by 1·4 cwts. per acre, and the crop, in addition to being generally light, was not secured in good condition.

The yield of Hops, 8·78 cwts. per acre, showed an increase of 2·30 Hops. cwts. over the low yield of the previous year, a result which fell short of the decennial average by only 0·18 cwt. The yield of the county of Kent is now separately shown for each of the three divisions, East Kent, Mid Kent, and the Weald. In the Mid Kent district a crop averaging 11 cwts. per acre was estimated.

By the addition of the figures for Ireland to those previously referred to, the total production of the chief crops in the United Kingdom as a whole may be shown side by side for the past three years. Further and more detailed comparisons are available for the United Kingdom and for each of its divisions in the columns of Table XXII.

NUMBERS OF LIVE STOCK.

The following observations on the numbers of live stock Live Stock, in Great Britain reported on June 4, 1903, were contained in the Memorandum issued as a Departmental Paper in October last, and, as in the case of the Memorandum on acreage changes, may be usefully reproduced in this Volume:

A larger number of horses was returned in every county, with only Horses, four exceptions, in Great Britain, and the increase by nearly 3 per cent. in those under one year probably indicates some extension of breeding.

Cattle.

The increase by 149,000 in the number of cattle repairs to a considerable extent the loss sustained last year, though the total is still smaller than in the three years prior to 1902. In every county in England, except Derby, an increase was this year recorded, and in Scotland, although there was more diversity, there was on balance a gain of 25,000 head. In Wales, on the other hand, there was a decline. The greatest increase occurred among the cattle of two years old and upwards, and this was attributed in some parts—and particularly in Norfolk, where the increment was much the largest—to the plenitude of keep in the spring of this year, in marked contrast to the spring of 1902. The increase by 32,000, or 1·3 per cent., in cows and heifers, although not considerable, is to be welcomed as reversing the tendency to decline, which has been apparent each year since 1899. Wales and Scotland, and the Eastern counties of England—with the exception of Lincoln and the East Riding—did not share in this improvement; but in the Midlands, to some extent, and in the Northern, Western, and South-Western counties particularly, an appreciable augmentation of the cow stock was evident. The counties in which this was most apparent were the West Riding, Somerset, Devon, Lancashire, Cheshire, Dorset, Stafford, and Wilts.

Sheep.

The number of sheep again declined, and the loss of 120,000 ewes and 64,000 other sheep over one year was very inadequately set off by an increase of 58,000 in the number of sheep under one year. In this case Wales was more fortunate than England or Scotland. The flocks of the Principality again increased by 49,000, of which more than half were breeding ewes, while in England the total loss was 133,000, and the loss of ewes still greater. The Scottish flocks were depleted by 41,000, one-fourth of which were ewes. In the great majority of the English counties the ewe flock decreased, but in a few counties there was a considerable increase among other classes of sheep, particularly in Yorkshire, in Devonshire, and in Cumberland.

Pigs.

Pigs showed an increase of nearly 17 per cent., or 337,000, and the tendency appears to have been practically universal, except in a few Scottish counties. Greater freedom from disease and remunerative prices are the chief causes assigned for this improvement in pig-breeding.

PRICES OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE.

Prices of Corn.

The average prices of British corn in 1903, as ascertained under the Corn Returns Act, were: wheat, 26s. 9d.; barley, 22s. 8d.; and oats, 17s. 2d., per quarter. The price of wheat was thus slightly below the higher value attained in 1902, and was identical with that of the previous year, 1901. The fall in the prices of barley and oats was more marked; and the average of the former grain has only once, in 1895, been lower than in 1903 during the period of 52 years covered by Table XXXIX. Some explanation of this deterioration in value may be found, as in last year's Report, in the relatively low quality of the grain yielded by the harvest of 1903, and this view is borne out by the tables shewing the import values of foreign grain, for as compared with a fall in the value of home product of 1s. 4d., the

average value of imported wheat rose by 5d. per quarter in 1903. The decline in the value of foreign barley also amounted to but 10d., while British barley fell by as much as 3s. per quarter.

From the Table (XXXVII.) shewing the Gazette average price week by week, it may be noted that the price of British wheat remained practically stationary at a little over 25s. for the first four months of the past year. It began to rise at the beginning of May, and continued to improve gradually until the end of August, touching a maximum of 30s. 3d. in the week ending September 5th. From this point, under the influence of harvest results, it fell somewhat abruptly, and for the last two months of the year remained steady between 26s. and 27s. per quarter.

The quantities of British wheat and barley returned as sold at the markets in 1903, viz.;—2,296,723 and 2,875,749 quarters respectively, were only slightly in excess of the amounts recorded in 1902; but the returns of oats sold, which have shown a considerable increase of late, reached 1,049,995 quarters. A million quarters of the latter cereal have not previously been returned as sold in the English markets since 1848. The amounts sold monthly afford an indication of the lateness of the last two harvests in 1902 and 1903, the minimum of recorded sales of wheat occurring in August instead of July in both those years.

A new table (XLVI.), which will be found of some interest, has been added showing the price of bread in various parts of the United Kingdom during the past three years; and in deference to enquiries addressed to the Department, an endeavour has been made to obtain from various sources—some of them altogether unofficial—quotations stated to represent the prices of specified grades of wheat (XLV.) at some of the principal markets in the world during the past quarter of a century.

The returns made under the Markets and Fairs (Weighing of Cattle) Act, 1891, show that although somewhat fewer cattle entered the 21 scheduled markets in Great Britain in 1903 than in the previous year, the decline in the numbers weighed was so slight that there was no interruption to the progressive increase in the proportion passing over the weighbridge. The number of sheep entering these markets was considerably less than in 1902, but the swine were much more numerous.

At thirteen of these markets (seven in England and six in Scotland, where the practice of weighing is much more general than south of the Border) the records of prices paid for fat cattle were sufficiently numerous to form a fairly trustworthy guide to the course of prices; and the following table shews the average price obtained for cattle of first and second quality in the past five years, together with the number of animals embraced in the transactions upon which the averages are based:—

In 1903, the average prices of prime or first quality animals would thus appear to have declined by 1s. 8d. per cwt., and of second quality by 1s. 6d. per cwt. compared with 1902.

Figures ascertained monthly in a similar manner to the above are also available. These shew that while in December, 1902, the price recorded for the best beasts in the markets named in Table XLIX. was 38s. per cwt., in the following month it fell to 37s. 8d., and remained comparatively steady, though with a falling tendency, until July. In August a marked decline became apparent, and in September the price was 35s. 4d. In November an average of 34s. 10d. per cwt. represented the lowest point, not only of the year, but of any month since October, 1899. The usual rise in the price of fat stock occurred in December, but it was much less in amount than in the two preceding years, and the year closed with values at 35s. 2d. per cwt. for first quality, and 33s. 4d. for second quality animals.

The average values of cattle imported for slaughter shew changes similar to those of home values on the year: oxen and bulls being estimated, on the average, at £17 12s. 7d. per head, as compared with £18 12s. 10d. in 1902.

The prices of dead meat, so far as reported from the markets indicated in Tables L. and LI., show that the fall in the price of live cattle was reflected in the current values of beef; but that mutton prices were maintained at slightly higher values alike

in London, Liverpool, and Glasgow. The average import values of meat and provisions received in all the ports of the Kingdom likewise show decreases in the value of beef, and increases in the value of mutton, while the values of imported ham have not reached so high a figure since 1893, and those of cheese ranged higher than in any year since 1883. In wool some recovery from the very low prices recorded in 1902 may be observed, and this is most notable in the case of Southdown and White Highland wools, and in this connection it may be noted that owing mainly to a shortage of nearly 46,000,000 lbs. in the imports from Australia (mostly from Victoria) our total imports of wool amounted to 604,961,000, as against 648,298,000 lbs. in 1902, the re-exports being almost identical in the two years.

AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS.

Before noticing the leading movements in the quantities of agricultural produce imported from abroad into the United Kingdom, it may be observed that the particulars of the live stock imported into Great Britain from Ireland in Table LIX., again show a large number of store cattle received. The total, 554,500 head, is almost identical with that reported in 1902, and the receipts of each of these years exceed by nearly 100,000 head, or over 20 per cent., the highest number recorded in any of the preceding twenty years. It may be remarked that exports of horses, cattle, and sheep, from Great Britain to Ireland, have of late years shewn a considerable increase : the number of horses thus shipped in 1903 having only been surpassed in 1901, during the previous twenty years, while the numbers of sheep have never been exceeded in that period.

The complete statistics supplied in the comparative tables of imports of all varieties of agricultural produce into the United Kingdom, as a whole, furnished by the Board of Customs, make it evident that the peculiar conditions of 1902 were not continued in 1903. Importations of both cattle and sheep once again increased. It is impossible, of course, with any statistical propriety, to consider these figures apart from the imports of beef and mutton, subject as the trade in live animals must always be to the necessary checks on this form of importation imposed by outbreaks of foot and mouth disease abroad, such as led to interruptions in the trade from Argentina, and afterwards from certain of the United States, with the subsequent re-admission of

Meat. cattle from those countries. While dead meat of all kinds received from the United States in 1903, exhibited some falling off; the amount from Argentina again shewed a large increase, the stoppage of the live stock exports having led, as shewn last year, to the conversion of a large number of cattle into beef prior to shipment. With the view of shewing the changes in the sources of our beef supplies during the past few years, the following table has been prepared, shewing approximately, in equivalent weight of meat, the amount of beef received (alive or dead) from the chief exporting countries during the five years 1899—1903.

Of the various kinds of dead meat, the amount of beef imported in 1903 was greater than in the previous year. Imports of fresh mutton were heavier by 18,000 tons than in the previous year—hitherto the highest recorded—and it may be noted that the total amount now for the first time exceeds 200,000 tons. The quantity of pig-meat received has declined for some years past, and this appears to be attributable in the main to the reduced import of hams, of which we received in 1903 but little more than half the amount of five years ago.

Dairy Produce. Of provisions, there were imported over 200,000 tons of butter in 1903, the highest aggregate receipts on record. It may be noted that as much as 55 tons are this year credited to Iceland or Greenland, while Uruguay appears in the list of butter-exporting countries with over 28 tons. The imports of margarine, which after a notable decline had shown some recrudescence in the past few years, fell off very markedly, and our total receipts (44,000 tons) were the smallest entered since this commodity was separately distinguished in the Trade Returns. Cheese imports slightly increased; but the quantity of milk, whether fresh or condensed, was practically identical with that recorded

in the previous year. The supplies of eggs were again larger, Eggs, Russia still further increasing her pre-eminence as an exporter, and contributing more than a third of the total importation into this country.

The chief item calling for notice in the importation of cereals Wheat and Flour, is the remarkable increase in the imports of wheat, which distinguished the calendar year 1903. The total received in the form of grain alone amounted to as much as 4,407,000 tons. This is 356,000 tons more than in 1902, and nearly one-third greater than the average supply of wheat in grain for the previous decade. The amount of wheat-flour, although rather above the figures of 1902, was slightly less than in some of the immediately preceding years. The aggregate of wheat and flour (the latter being estimated at its equivalent weight in grain) amounted nevertheless to 5,837,000 tons in the past calendar year—a figure which is 441,000 tons more than has been received on the shores of the United Kingdom on any previous occasion.

The relative proportions of the supplies of breadstuffs received from British Possessions, as well as their striking fluctuations in recent years, may be again conveniently shown as follows:—

These figures enforce the lesson of the extent to which the variability of harvest conditions must change from year to year the sources of our wheat supply, and the difference in this respect is even more notable than usual, comparing 1903 with 1902. The United States, which sent upwards of 3,200,000 tons of wheat (in grain or flour) in 1902, furnished us with only 2,336,000 tons last year; while the Australian contribution dropped from 211,000 tons to the practically negligible amount of 3 tons. On the other hand, Argentina furnished 712,000 tons to this country, as compared with only 227,000 tons in 1902; and our Indian possessions nearly doubled their exports to us. The 853,000 tons received from this quarter, indeed, far exceeded the large totals imported nearly twenty years ago, when Indian wheat supplies were being anxiously watched by our producers for their effect on the prices here. The Canadian quota was also again increased, although not in the same ratio as in 1902. It may be of interest to show here the proportional variations in the origin of our supplies of wheat and flour (expressed as grain), the amount from the principal countries being given as a percentage of the total imports.

Under the other groups of cereal imports it may be noted that Barley, in 1903 there was a further slight increase on the relatively large total of barley imported in 1902. Only a small proportion of this cereal (25,000 tons) was drawn from British Possessions, and it may be noticed that of this amount as much as seven-tenths came from Cyprus. The changes in the imports of maize, if examined in detail, are perhaps even more striking than those of wheat. Owing to the extreme shortness of the crop of 1901 in the United States, the imports from that country in 1902 amounted to less than 100,000 tons. In 1903 a recovery to 934,000 tons is recorded, but even this amount was only half the quantity from the same source in 1899 and 1900. Canada sent 169,000 tons as compared with 5,000 tons in the previous year: the Roumanian supply dropped from 930,000 tons to 212,000 tons, and the Russian from 330,000 tons to 178,000 tons. On the other hand the relatively heavy Argentine shipments of 1902 were still further augmented last year, with the result that the contribution from that country in 1903, viz., 936,000 tons, just exceeded that from the United States, so that Argentina ranked for the first time as the chief source of our supply of maize. With all these changes of origin, however, the total amount of maize received here was but little more than 10 per cent. above the figures for 1902.

The imports of fruit in 1903 were very heavy, as a result, doubtless, of the great shortness of the home crop. Owing to the change in registration of the arrivals, under which the entries of raw fruit have been recorded in cwts. instead of bushels since 1899, it is not possible to compare with more than the three preceding years; but it may be noted that the imports of apples (4,570,000 cwts.) were over 60 per cent. heavier than in the preceding year, and probably represent the largest quantity ever received. Large quantities of potatoes and onions are also to be remarked as appearing in this section of the appended tables among the vegetable imports of the year.

The form in which the tables of imported produce are presented enables a ready comparison to be made between the proportions contributed by British Possessions and by Foreign Countries respectively to the supply of the United Kingdom, and reference has already been made above to the varying colonial share in the supplies of live cattle and of bread corn. All such

calculations as to the countries of origin must of course be accepted subject to the limitations which are imposed by the feature of our import returns, in which, for the most part, commodities must of necessity be credited to the country from whose ports they were actually shipped on their way to our shores. The variations from year to year in the contributing countries must also be borne in mind in basing large conclusions on the statistics of any single year.

It may, nevertheless, be of interest to gather together here the following leading items making up the bulk of the sea-borne food of our population, and exhibit the percentage contributed under each head by British Possessions during the year 1903.

COLONIAL AND FOREIGN STATISTICS.

Endeavours have been made, as in former years, to complete and extend the detailed information available for comparing with our own Agricultural Statistics, those relating to Colonial and Foreign Agriculture. For these data reference must be made to Tables CIV. to CLII. Although in comparatively few instances are foreign statistics for 1903 available at the time

when these figures are sent to press, the present position and the Foreign Agriculture varying character of the agriculture of the several sections of the British Dominions, and of those Foreign States whose returns were officially transmitted to the Board, may be gathered from the tables now compiled.

The grain crops of the countries enumerated in Table CXLV. are compared as to the latest official reports of their respective acreage, production, and yield per acre, with the mean of a group of earlier years, while in the final tables of the volume the recorded numbers of the horses, cattle, sheep and swine of numerous countries have been placed side by side.

The quinquennial averages of the yield of grain continue to Grain. show the pre-eminent position still held by our own country as regards the cereal produce of the soil, compared with the record of any European competitor whose crop areas are of sufficient dimensions properly to compare with our own. On the minor areas of countries like Belgium and Holland, no doubt, where larger results are claimed, comparison with equally small and select surfaces in particular parts of our own territory might, perhaps, prove favourable to the achievements of the British producer under like conditions. As frequently shown also, the comparative statistics afford a useful reminder of the low yields attributed to the wide grain areas of great producing countries like the United States, India, Russia and Argentina, whence so large a proportion of our bread corn is imported.

The paucity of consecutive annual records of the live stock Live Stock. of other lands than our own is once again emphasised by these tables, for beyond the British and Irish figures and those supplied by one or two of our colonies, data for so late a year as 1903 are not usually available elsewhere than in the United States of America, where annual estimates of a somewhat uncertain character are attempted. From Russia, indeed, on this occasion—which is only the second since 1888 on which the attempt has been made to revise the earlier data—a new official estimate has been lately furnished and except as regards horses, all classes of live stock in Russia proper show some diminution. The annual American figures show an increased number of horses, of milch cows and of swine, in 1903, but the latest data furnished by the

Washington Department of Agriculture exhibit a diminution in the numbers of cattle, other than cows, and still more notably a reduction in the flocks of sheep, which bring the aggregate of these important sections of the live stock of that great meat-producing country very considerably below the census enumeration of 1900.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

HOW TO SAVE MONEY, HOW TO INSURE, AND HOW TO PROVIDE FOR OLD AGE.

More than 11,000 Post Offices are open all day to receive savings, and an account can be started with as little as a shilling. Pennies can be saved by getting a form for the purpose at any Post Office, and buying a penny stamp and putting it on the form; when the form contains twelve stamps it can be taken to a Post Office Savings Bank, and it will be received as a deposit of one shilling.

As much as 50*l.* can be saved every year so long as there is not more than 200*l.* in the account.

Beyond saving 50*l.* a year, Government Stock can be bought to the amount of 200*l.* a year and 500*l.* altogether. A small commission is charged for buying and selling Stock.

Interest is allowed at the rate of 2½ per cent. a year on each £ deposited, that is, a halfpenny a month on every £.

Money can be withdrawn from an Account at any Post Office Savings Bank without delay, by sending the proper notice to London. The Order for the money will be sent by return of post.

Depositors in the Post Office Savings Bank have perfect security. The Government is bound by law to repay deposits and interest.

ANY PERSON BETWEEN 14 AND 65 YEARS OLD CAN INSURE HIS LIFE for sums from 5*l.* to 100*l.* Children between 8 and 14 years old can be insured for 5*l.* If the payments cannot be kept up after a life has been insured for two years a fair portion of the money paid is returned. For 4*s.* 4*d.* a year (a penny a week), a person aged 24 can insure 10*l.* at his death.

OLD AGE PAY to begin at any age can be bought. When the pension does not begin at once it can be arranged that the money paid for it shall be returned, if the payments cannot be kept up, or if the Depositor should die. A woman aged 24 can buy a pension of 1*l.* a year, to begin at 60, for 4*s.* 4*d.* a year (a penny a week). If at any time before she is 60 she cannot keep up the payments, the money paid will be returned to her, and if she should die it will be paid to her representatives.

A Depositor who insures or buys a pension is put to very little trouble. All his payments are made through his Savings Bank account, and when there is enough money in the account he is not asked for anything when a payment is due.

Further and fuller information about depositing money, buying Government Stock, insuring lives and buying pensions can be had at any Post Office Savings Bank, or by writing direct to the Controller, Savings Bank Department, General Post Office, London. There is no charge for giving information, and letters to and from the Controller are sent free through the post.
