AMERICAN WAR OF INDEPENDENCE.

Orderly Book used during the War, and containing the general orders and detailed instructions for the troops under LORD CORNWALLIS, from 28th June 1781 to 19th October of the same year; the latter date being that of his final defeat at YORK TOWN. It contains, among other interesting details, thanks to officers (whose names are given) and men for gallant conduct upon various occasions; promotions made by the Commander-in-Chief; notification to the inhabitants of Elizabeth City to lay down their arms and bring provisions for the troops, &c., &c. On August 15th, the Commander-in-Chief expresses, through Lord Cornwallis, his "high sense" of the "good behaviour" of the troops during the campaign in Virginia, thanking "particularly LIEUT.-COL. DUNDASS for his conduct and gallantry in the action of JAMES TOWN, and LIEUT.-COLONELS SIMCOX and TARLETON, for their active on the march and throw the contry." The volume concludes with the following entries:—

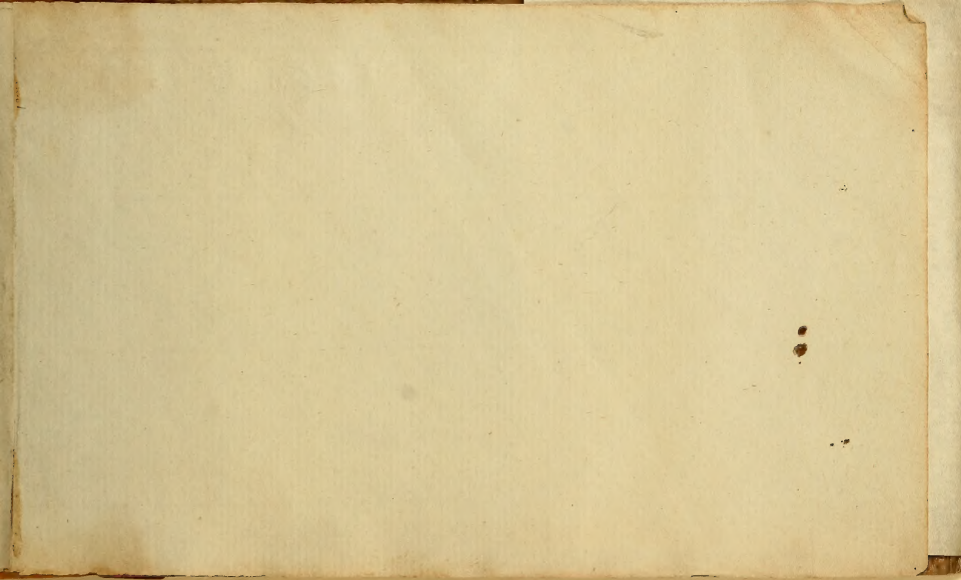
"LIEUT.-COL. ABERCROMBIE, with infinite regret, quits the Lt. Inf., a corps who always distinguished themselves with good behaviour since the commencement of this War—particularly in bearing the hardships of a murdering seige. He most ardently wishes that their captivity may be of a short duration, that he once more may have the honour to command a corps with whom his heart will ever remain."

Lord Cornwallis did every thing in his power to procure for the soldiers the Terms of being sent to Europe; since these could not be obtained, he has taken every means to secure to them good treatment dureing their captivity, and will pay the greatest attention to their being supplied constantly with necessaries until their liberty can be procured."

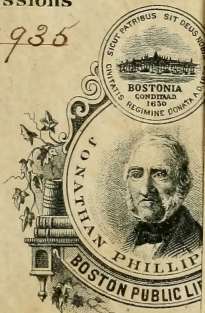
