Man is held over shops bomb hoax

A 35-year-old man has been arrested after a bomb hoax led to much of a shopping centre being closed.

The Orchard Centre in Didcot was evacuated after police were called to a suspicious item at Sainsbury's at around 8am on Monday.

The area remained cordoned off until around midday while police investigated the incident.

Thames Valley Police said at 12.30pm that the suspicious item had been "made safe".

The man from Didcot, who was arrested on suspicion of making a

bomb hoax, has been released under investigation and enquiries continue.

Surrounding streets were sealed off and buildings cleared as police investigated and an explosive ordnance disposal unit attended.

An investigation is ongoing but police said there is no danger to the public.

Inspector Adrian Lewis said: "I would like to thank the community for their patience while police officers secured the immediate area to ensure the public were kept safe.

"I'd like to reassure people the incident is not being linked to the recent terrorism events in Manchester.

"I would like to remind everyone that information from the public is always very important - you are also our eyes and ears, and everyone can play their part in keeping us safe.

"Please remain vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to our 24-hour enquiry centre on 101 or in an emergency call 999."

In a statement on Monday afternoon the Orchard Centre said: "The centre was evacuated as a precaution while the authorities investigated the matter.

"The incident has now been resolved safely and efficiently and the centre is back open and trading as normal.

"The safety of our customers and colleagues remains our number one priority."

Head gets keys to new £19m school

TEACHERS, governors and a curate celebrated the completion of a £19 million secondary school in Didcot after its headteacher was handed the keys.

Named after a hoard of gold coins unearthed in the town 20 years ago, Aureus School, based at Great Western Park, is ready to open its doors to 120 Year 7 pupils in September.

Construction was completed last month and headteacher Hannah Wilson was handed the keys last week.

Miss Wilson said: "Our motto 'nurturing hearts and minds' will inspire students, staff, parents and community partners."

The school will welcome 1,200 pupils when at full capacity in five years.

Troubled health trust gets a new chairman

A NEW chairman has been appointed to a crisis-hit health trust as it continues its 'journey of improvement'.

With almost 40 years public service, Ms Hunt has been working within mental health services in the NHS and has also held a number of clinical and board level roles, including vice chair of Dorset Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust.

Ms Hunt said: "I'm delighted to have been given this opportunity.

"My focus has always been on improving patient care and delivering quality services that fit the needs of all patients and service users, and so I believe my experience and clinical background will be invaluable in building on the good progress already made at the Trust.

"Southern Health has been on a journey in recent years, and I see my appointment as being an important next step

as the Trust continues on this journey of improvement.

"With this new leadership and a board of newly-appointed non-executive directors we can influence and develop a culture of change and improvement that will benefit staff and patients, aspiring for excellence at every opportunity. I look forward to this new role, and the future, with optimism."

Man admits murder in garden

A MAN who stabbed his victim multiple times in broad daylight has confessed to murder.

Egidio Da Silva Alves, 28, admitted murdering 35-year-old Domingos Romalho who died from stab wounds in February.

Mr Romalho, of Wharton Road, Headington, died after being knifed several times in his chest and abdomen.

He was rushed to the John Radcliffe Hospital after he was found injured in Windmill Road, Headington, on February 13.

His condition deteriorated and he died the next day.

Alves was remanded in custody when he appeared at Oxford Crown Court on Thursday last week and is due to appear before the court for sentencing on June 23.

Alves, of The Slade, Oxford, bumped into the victim Domingos Romalho, whom he knew, at a bookmakers' in London Road, Headington, at around 2.30pm on February 13.

The two men had a brief conversation before Alves left the store and went to a nearby hardware shop where he bought a large kitchen knife, before following the victim in to Windmill Road.

There, he made a phone call

asking a friend to look after his child. When asked why, he said: "I am going to kill him."

Members of the public subsequently witnessed an altercation between the pair and Alves attacked Domingos in a garden.

Members of the public intervened and disarmed Alves and provided first aid to Domingos, who had sustained severe injuries.

Alves was arrested at the scene and charged with murder on February 15.

Senior investigating officer Detective Inspector Dave Hubbard, from Thames Valley Police's Major Crime unit, said the public acted courageously

to intervene.

He said: "Alves brutally murdered Romalho in public, during the day time on a busy Oxford street in front of terrified members of the public including children.

"This was a horrific incident and, while we would never advise that members of the public risk their own safety to intervene in such situations, they acted courageously.

"I am pleased that Alves has recognised the severity of his actions and pleaded guilty to the murder of Domingos Romalho to prevent the victim's family from enduring further anguish by having to go through a trial.

Take part in Queen Street experiment

Plan to ban buses and taxis

HAVE your say on a proposed 'experimental' 18-month ban on buses and taxis from using a major city centre route.

Queen Street was used exclusively by pedestrians between June and November last year during part of the Westgate Shopping Centre redevelopment.

And a consultation, launched last Thursday, outlines a plan to close it again to all vehicles to make it safer for cyclists and pedestrians.

A decision is expected in July and the trial could be in place in October.

The Oxfordshire County Council consultation also covers potential improvements to city centre junctions and bus stops, and new arrangements for loading in St Aldates and High Street.

Susan Halliwell, county council director for planning and place, said: "Investment and growth in Oxford means more people coming to the city and using the roads.

"The things we are proposing are designed to improve capacity and safety.

"We recognise that the bus companies had concerns over

what was included in the 2016 proposals and so we have made revisions taking into account what they said and we will remain in discussion with them throughout this process."

She added: "The experimental order for Queen Street is just that - it would be a test of how it works in practice and the opportunity for people to have a say."

Oxford City Council "strongly supports" the proposals and the county council has worked closely with partners impacted by the trial run.

Stagecoach Oxfordshire managing director Martin Sutton added his bus company is "keen to arrive at a solution that will deliver the most suitable arrangements for our passengers in Oxford".

Should the trial get the green light, comments can be made at any time during the first six months.

Phil Southall, managing director of Oxford Bus Company, said his firm has "a strong relationship" with the county council and will feedback their observations.

The consultation closes on June 23 and can be viewed online at oxfordshire.gov.uk/consultation or in person at County Hall.



OXFORD University scientists are working on the world's largest optical telescope in a mission to 'explore the unknown' of the universe.

The ELT will have the ability to simultaneously take 4,000 images and will enable scientists to form a detailed picture of the evolution of objects in the universe.

It was unveiled in northern Chile last week near the site of the future project which is set for completion in 2024.

Oxford University scientists designed and constructed an instrument within the device called HARMONI.

Niranjan Thatte, principal investigator for HARMONI and Professor of Astrophysics at Oxford's department of physics, said: "For me, the ELT represents a big leap forward in capability, and that means that we will use it to find many interesting things about the universe that we

have no knowledge of today.

"It is the element of 'exploring the unknown' that most excites me about the ELT. It will be an engineering feat, and its sheer size and light grasp will dwarf all other telescopes that we have built to date."

The ELT (extremely large telescope) will be built by the European Southern Observatory (ESO) and will feature a main mirror that measures 39 metres in diameter - it

will be set atop a 3,046-metre mountain in Chile.

A time capsule, created by members of the ESO team and sealed at the event, will serve as a lasting memory of the research and the 'scale of ambition' behind it.

Contents include a copy of a book describing the original scientific aims of the telescope, images of the staff that have and will play a role in its construction and a poster of an ELT visualisation.

A PSYCHOLOGY teacher has been left devastated after her much-loved pet bolted out of her camper van when she pulled over on to the hard shoulder of the M40. Zoe Meakins, who teaches at a sixth form college in Surrey, was on her way to Wales where she is returning to live at the end of the summer term. Zoe had collected Jangles, the 10-year-old ginger tom she has had since he was a kitten, from her parents in Uxbridge on Thursday, where they had been looking after him. She said: "I put him in his new cat box and my dad and I both checked that it was secure before I set off. Jangles has journeyed between Surrey, Wales and Uxbridge many times before with no problem. "However, when I was nearly at Junction 10 (Cherwell Valley) he somehow escaped from his cat box. I don't know who was more surprised by his Houdini trick. Him or me. "I had to make a quick decision as I knew it would be very dangerous to continue to drive with him loose in the van." Zoe pulled over and prepared to secure him again, quickly sliding



the door open so she could scramble in the back to calm him and get to him more easily. She said: "To my horror – and it only took a split second – he shot out of the door. "Maybe he thought he had arrived home, but, sitting at the top of a steep grassy bank he was clearly as shocked as me as to what had happened and was getting freaked out by the noise of the traffic. I called him and called him but he was frozen to the spot and wouldn't budge." Zoe cannot praise the Highway

Patrol men who arrived to help enough. They alerted the traffic by flashing 'Animal in Road' above the motorway and then tried to coax Jangles back to the van. He became more frightened and eventually bolted in the direction of some woodland. Zoe, her parents, and her in-laws who live in Chalgrove, as well as friends from Amersham, have spent the past few days scouring the countryside around the area, particularly the village of Fritwell where he is most likely to go. Zoe said: "Everyone in the area has been so brilliant and helpful. Jangles is a lovely cat and I miss him so much. He does not have a collar but is microchipped so can be easily traced back to us. My grandad was in the prisoner of war camp Stalag Luft III in World War Two and helped with the Great Escape, so perhaps it runs in the family. "Please please get in touch if you see him or are looking after him. He loves people and is very trusting and friendly but we really, desperately want him home. "Initially, they were very funny and hesitant about

the new boxes in their enclosure. In the end, their father Rana had to show them how it was done but the cubs loved playing with the boxes afterwards."

The pair made history with the birth, as the cubs were the first lion triplets to be born at the park since it opened in 1970.

Rana and Kanha formed an instant bond when they were introduced in 2014.

Last year on May 25, Kanha gave birth to the cubs in the park's birthing den.

Asiatic Lions are one of the world's rarest big cat species, and are considered to be vulnerable to extinction.

'Brain drain' fears at uncertainty of Brexit

BREXIT 'uncertainty' could lead to a 'brain drain' for UK employers, according to immigration experts.

An Abingdon-based firm has revealed that around 40,000 people, mainly EU citizens, left the UK from 2015 to December 2016.

Milton Park firm Migrate UK says this is due to political uncertainty for EU citizens, and warns that some sectors will be experiencing further labour shortage.

Managing director Jonathan Beech said: "Until the Government ends uncertainty among EU citizens by guaranteeing rights to remain in the UK after Brexit we are likely to see a continuation of these trends, and potentially the start of a Brexit 'brain drain' from the UK.

"Sectors like retail, manufacturing, health and food services, are suffering skills and labour shortages, with more than a quarter of employers predicting that their EU workers could leave their jobs and the UK this year.

"A Brexit 'brain drain' is particularly likely in the IT, finance and engineering sectors, but this could be swiftly averted if the new elected government guarantees their approach for EU nationals and their right to work during and

after the Brexit process, while providing a workable solution for employers who rely heavily on skills from outside the UK.

"Political reassurance would reduce panic."

Layla Moran, Liberal Democrat candidate for Oxford West and Abingdon, said: "I have heard specific stories around the constituency of people leaving or actively looking to leave, not least at Joint European Torus (JET) in Culham where there is the double whammy of both the refusal of the government to guarantee EU citizens' rights and the unnecessary decision to leave Euratom."

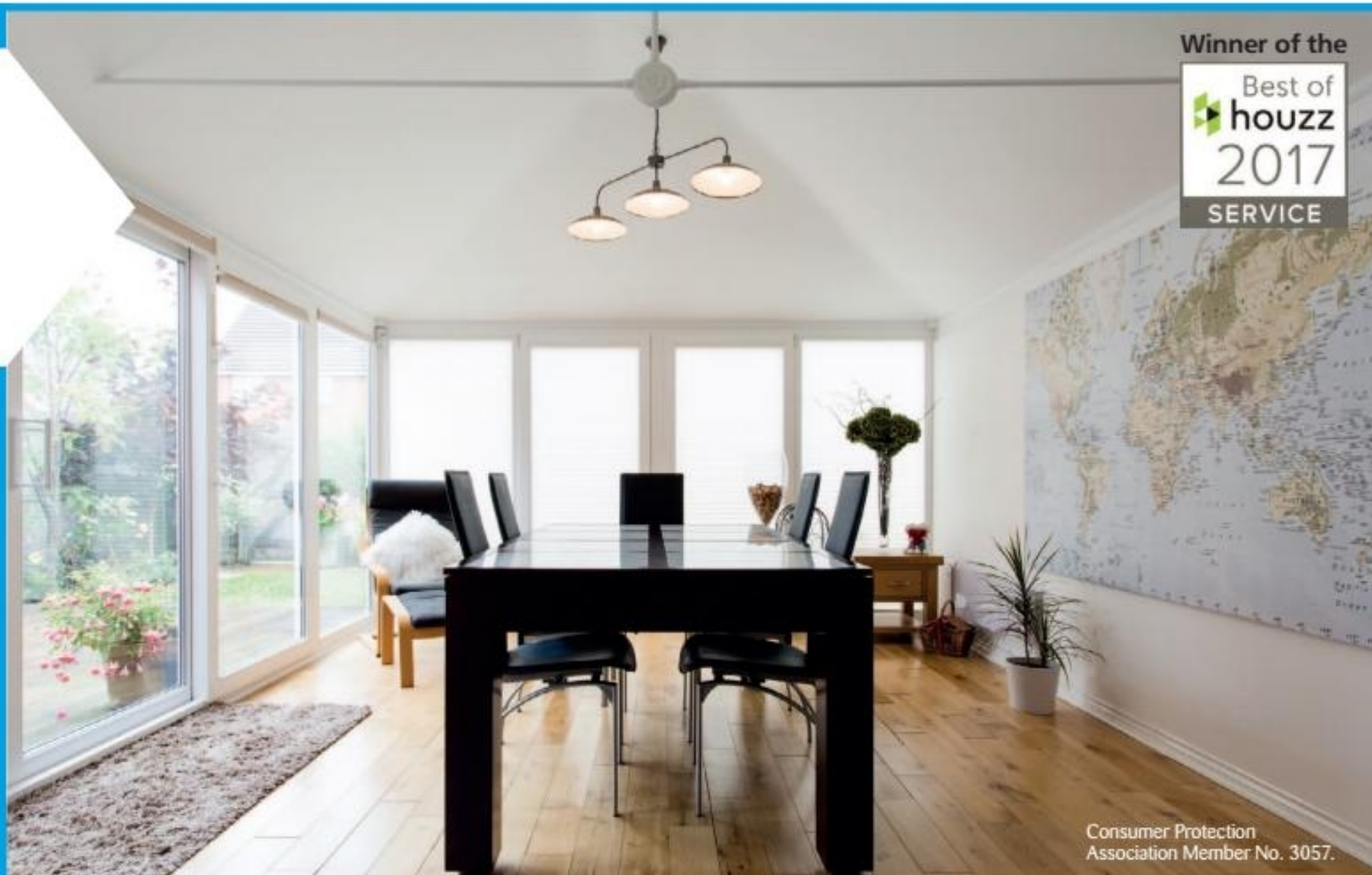

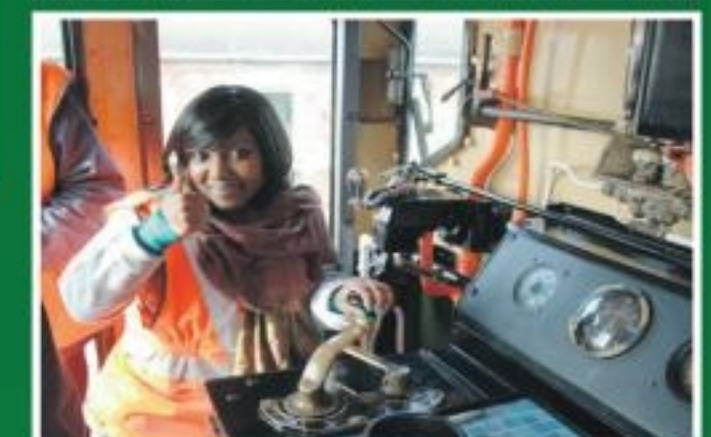

Ellie helps pupils to keep active

PARALYMPIC swimmer Ellie Simmonds visited school children to lead a very special PE lesson.

She spent the morning at Heyford Park Free School talking to youngsters about the importance of being active and eating healthily.

Ellie, a five-time Paralympic Champion and world record holder, also passed on tips about being active and showed-off her gold medals.

The school at Heyford Park, near Bicester, won Ellie's visit as part of a competition prize through the Sainsbury's Active Kids scheme.

Before she started the PE lessons, Ellie, who has Achon-

droplasia dwarfism, was the guest of honour in school assembly.

She talked to children about her life, the importance of healthy lifestyles and answered questions from both primary and secondary students.

Ellie, who is an Active Kids ambassador, then ran a "tough PE lesson" with 20 pupils and taught them a range of skills to help them keep active.

She said: "It's a privilege to be able to go into schools across the UK, as part of my role as Sainsbury's Active Kids ambassador, and speak to them about the importance of good nutrition and keeping active.

"I loved hosting the PE lesson and showing the pupils some of the fun and different

exercises they can do to keep active inside and outside of school time."

Ellie won her first Paralympic medal when she was 13 and became the youngest person to win the BBC Young Sports Personality of the Year in 2008 and then the youngest recipient of an MBE at the age of 14.

She started swimming at the age of five and competing against able-bodied children at the age of eight.

When she was 10 she was spotted by a talent scout and joined the British Swimming talent programme.

Now in its 12th year, Sainsbury's Active Kids programme donates money to schools and clubs across the UK for sports and cookery equipment.

campaign inspired by Labour MP Jo Cox's commitment to bringing communities together, and is being held on the anniversary of her death.

According to Oxford-based charities Aspire and Cutteslowe Community Association, thousands of elderly people live alone and loneliness is a major risk to their health and wellbeing.

Paul Roberts, chief executive officer at Aspire, described isolation in the elderly as a "critical issue for our community".

The charities help take elderly residents for shopping, social and hospital trips.

Aspire's Our Community Transport service currently helps 149 elderly passengers.

Mr Roberts said: "Ninety-

two per cent of our own community transport passengers live alone, and 58 per cent of them wouldn't be able to leave their homes without our bus service.

"But these local transport services are under threat of closure in the coming months, leaving elderly people extremely vulnerable.

"So this event is a vital

opportunity to come together as a community and raise both funds and awareness to keep these local transport services going."

Funds raised will go towards maintaining the charities' community transport services which "are a lifeline for local elderly passengers suffering from loneliness".

at Cutteslowe Community Centre from 1pm to 3pm.

A BANBURY charity that supports disabled children has launched a £70,000 fundraising appeal.

The Let's Play Project want to raise the money to renovate their new centre in Twyford, near Banbury.

It is now urging residents to get behind the Big Build appeal and help raise the cash.

The charity currently supports 100 disabled young people, aged five to 25, and their families across the region by providing play and leisure sessions enabling them to join in activities like their non-disabled peers, make new friends; develop key social skills and access opportunities.

Let's Play has recently acquired a new bigger premises allowing them to welcome even more disabled children

"We also want to extend our service to support families of younger pre-school children and those over 18, creating a safe, inspiring, fun and nurturing environment that can be enjoyed by all, those we currently support and those we wish to in the future, is crucial.

"But we need help to do this and we are really hoping the local community will sup-

port the 'Let's Play Big-Build' Appeal and help us realise our dreams.

"With a bigger and better space, we will be able to offer the youngsters so much more."

One parent, who did not want to be named, has added her voice to the appeal. She said: "Our kids can't join in with any of the regular activities that other children enjoy, so Let's Play is their whole social life.

"It is where Ed can meet and play with the other children he knows and gives him a chance to make new friends. It is so precious to see him take part in something other than at home or school."

People are urged to help raise cash or donate materials, particularly from the building, construction and DIY industry.

On Friday, July 14, The Mills Art Centre will host Stand Up For Let's Play, a night of comedy to raise cash for the charity's appeal.

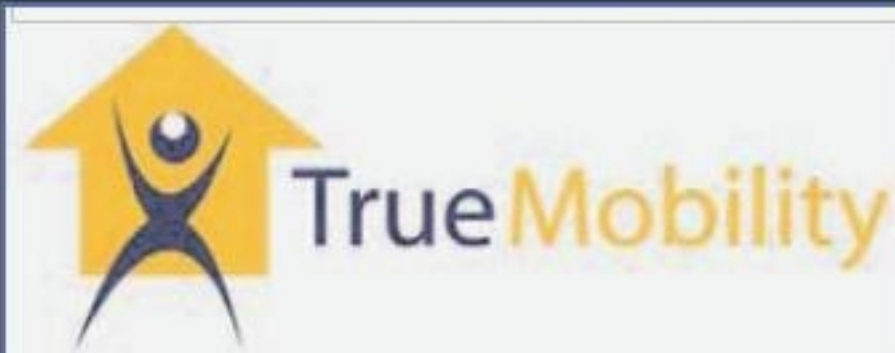

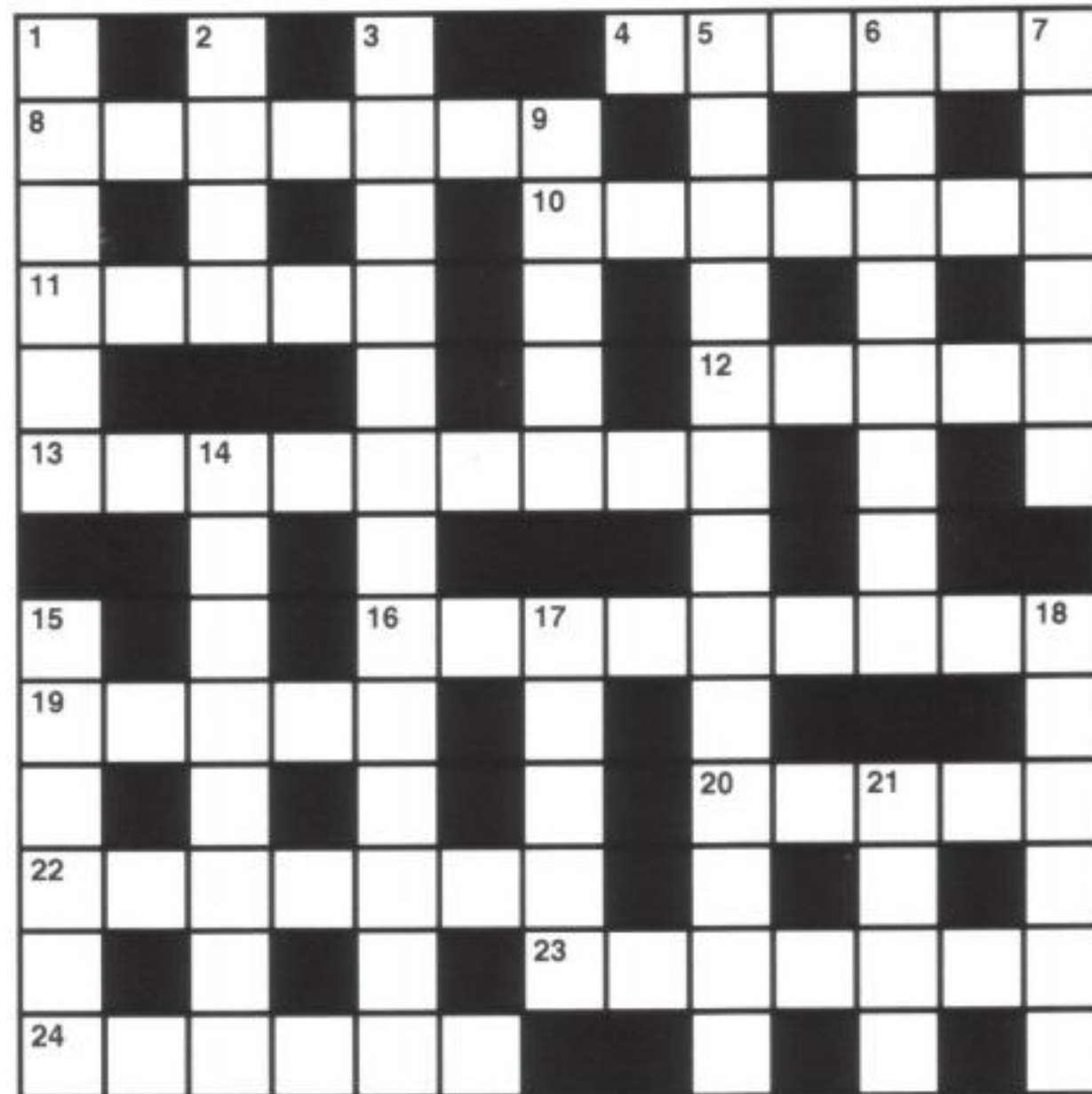

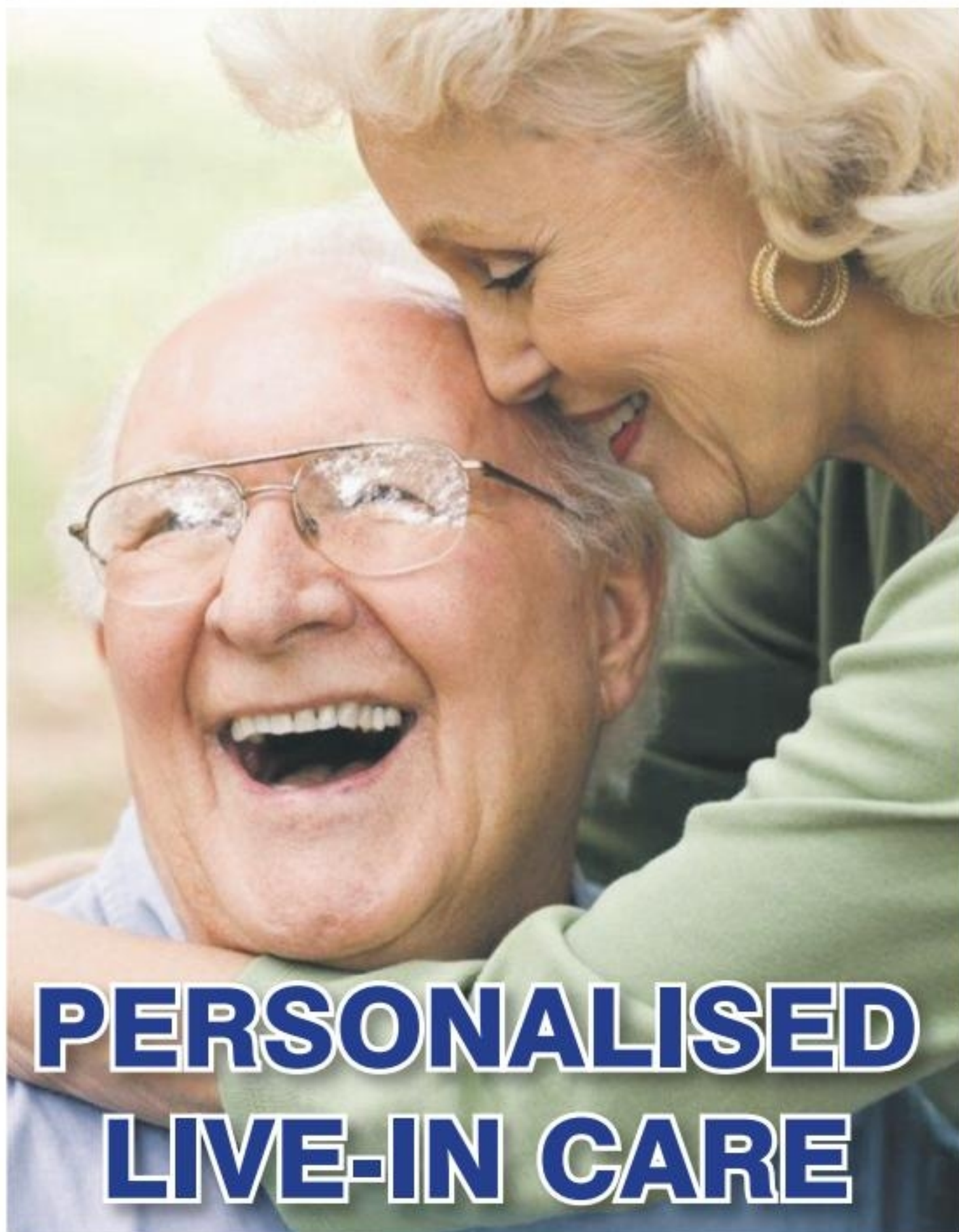

Simple steps homeowners can take now to protect their assets.

Head of April King Legal Paul King explains why some homeowners are doing **too little, too late** to protect their hard-earned assets.

Care Cost Fees

"A lot of people are still unaware that if they need care in later life, their assets will be means-tested by the Local Authority to help pay for these services."

"The Local Authority will look to use the assets of a person until they get down to a lower limit of £14,250, when the Local Authority will take over the fees."

"For instance, my own grandmother sadly passed away recently at the age of 92. My grandfather had died many years earlier and left everything to her."

"When she needed care in the last six years of her life, because my grandfather had left everything to her, the house and all the estate was counted in the Local Authority's means test."

"Our clients tell us, 'We've worked hard all our lives, why should the Local Authority get it all?'"

"Just as she died, she had gone down to that lower limit of £14,250 and that's all her children inherited."

"There are many myths about the steps people can take to protect their assets from being used like this."

"The main one is that a parent should simply sign their house over to the children now, so it won't be taken into consideration for means testing. That's just not true."

"Local Authorities will actually look to see if you've 'deliberately deprived' yourself of an asset by giving property away, going back over any period in time."

"Sometimes people think that if the gift is made seven years prior then the house is safe. This is not so as the seven-year rule only applies to Inheritance Tax and not Local Authority care."

"The solution is for couples to simply not leave everything to each other in the first place."

"What my grandfather could have done is leave his half of the house in trust to his children, stating that they couldn't have it while his wife, my grandmother, was still alive. We call these Property Trust Wills."

"If my grandfather had left his half of the house in trust to the children then when my grandmother subsequently received care in her later life she would only have been means tested on her own half of the house, but my grandfather's half would have been safe."

"Why should he have to contribute his half when he didn't receive any care?"

"The important factor is that couples need to act in advance. Once one party dies or loses mental capacity, through a stroke for example, then they are no longer in a position to do this legitimate and straightforward type of planning."

"It is therefore important for couples to act now even if they may not foresee care fees being an issue."

Paul goes on to explain that most clients he sees are surprised to learn remarriage usually cancels a Will and makes the spouse next in line to inherit, ahead of their own children! Protecting your half of the house in this way, he suggests, ensures that your children ultimately inherit when the survivor dies.

"Had my grandmother remarried after the death of my grandfather the whole estate could have passed sideways out of the family," says Paul.

Lasting Power of Attorney

Paul explains how people often get confused thinking that, because they have made a Will, their executors can also deal with assets if there is illness, stroke or some other form of incapacity while they are still alive.

"Everyone should actually have two documents – a Will that deals with their estate on death, and a Lasting Power of Attorney that deals with their estate during their lifetime," he says.

"There are two types of Lasting Power of Attorney – one deals with finance, the other deals with health and welfare."

"In many ways it's similar to a passport; a document that's registered now and one which can be physically handed to the attorneys should the need arise."

"It allows the attorneys, perhaps the children, to deal with the banks and pension companies etc should their parent become incapacitated, but also to deal with matters such as where the parent should be living and how they should receive care."

"Your attorneys, again perhaps your children, must legally act in your best interests at all times."

"You can choose a number of attorneys to act, either jointly or independently, and April King advises on the various options available."

"Couples are often surprised to discover that even joint bank accounts can be frozen until the bank sees sight of a Lasting Power of Attorney document."

"Having a Lasting Power of Attorney removes the burden on children should ill health happen further down the line."

"It helps a family deal with bank accounts and so on during a parent's lifetime and ceases on death."

"Crucially, you have to complete a Lasting Power of Attorney while you are still in good mental health."

"If someone becomes ill through say, a stroke or dementia, this option is lost and the family would have to apply for a Deputyship Order from the Court of Protection – a drawn out and expensive process."

"It is therefore a good idea for clients to plan ahead and remove any future burden from the family."

"Once again, all adults should be thinking of this, particularly when there are children or a business involved."

"It's not just something to think about when you get older, that's the challenge for us."

"People think, 'I'm not ill, why do I need to make a Power of Attorney?' But they're missing the point. This is a document that has to be done in advance."

"The Lasting Power of Attorney remains in place until you die unless you want to cancel it."

"Once it's registered, you don't have to worry if you then develop some debilitating illness. A burden has been removed from the family at an already difficult time."

Bloodline Trust Wills

The majority of April King's clients have already made standard 'Mirror Wills' with other firms before approaching the Firm. A Mirror Will is when a couple leave everything to each other on the first death, then to the children when the second partner dies. But modern family life means these type of Wills leave a lot to chance.

Explains Paul: "If I have a Mirror Will leaving everything to my wife and she remarries or goes into care after my death then either the new husband or the Local Authority are likely to inherit most, if not all, of my estate ahead of my children."

"Even if my children are named in my Mirror Will, it is by no means certain that they will inherit anything."

"Once again, this is because a remarriage would cancel the Will my wife had previously made with me and make the new husband next-of-kin."

"This often comes as a big shock to my clients who had perhaps thought that all was in order and that the family bloodline would one day inherit."

"The same is true for thinking that their children and/or grandchildren will one day benefit under a Mirror Will."

"If any of your children should die leaving everything to their husband or wife and that son-in-law or daughter-in-law should then remarry, then your grandchildren would be the ones to lose out under the line of inheritance."

"Worse still, someone else's grandchildren would be in line to receive the benefit of all your years of hard work."

"I've experienced this in my own family and I'm sure most people have had similar experiences or heard of someone who has."

"Bloodline Trust Wills give greater protection to your children."

"These type of Wills not only give your children complete control and access to the inheritance they receive from you, they also grant added protection from the twists and turns of modern family life."

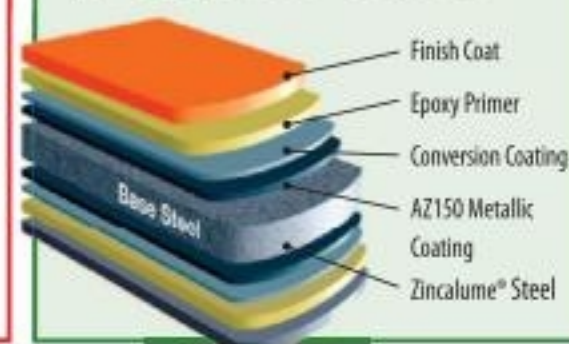



Out of this world medical drama

PSYCHOLOGICAL thriller and heart-rending medical drama *Out of This World* explodes onto the Oxford stage this month.

Creating this production also took Mark to a neurosurgical operating room and aerial rehearsal rooms in Buenos Aires.

In recent years, he has led ambitious, large-scale outdoor events and international ceremonies for audiences in excess of 70,000.

These included the closing ceremony for the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games, which featured 1,500 Glaswegians alongside stars including Kylie Minogue, Lulu and Deacon Blue.

ROCK band Hunter & The Bear are making a return to the city - this time to headline the Oxford O2.

"We've been on a steep learning curve since we started and our writing has been improving. "We had to wait until we had the

right songs to showcase what we're all about.

"We feel the time is right. We've been totally blown away with the response from both the public and press. We're pinching ourselves."

And it really is a proud moment for them. Will said: "When we started this journey five years ago, I never anticipated getting this far."

"We hit number 8 in the iTunes rock charts."

"Things like that seem totally ridiculous to me but it just shows that people are listening and the support is growing. That's what I'm most proud of."

Another highlight was working alongside Eric Clapton, Will said: "It was equal parts amazing and terrifying."

"We went from playing pubs to arenas over night and there's nothing you can do to prepare for that. "Having his backing was a huge confidence boost and we'll be forever grateful to him for taking a chance on us."

"He's one of the all time rock legends and learning from him was so valuable to us as a band. Getting to watch him play guitar every night wasn't bad either."

Suzuki Vitara S 1.4 Boosterjet

Is this the SUV we've been looking for?

THE so-called Sports Utility Vehicle (SUV) or Crossover has been selling particularly well for a while now, thanks to buyers looking for a car that can tick all the boxes such as; space, practicability, economy and performance.

So, this week I have the rather good looking Suzuki Vitara S on test and I have to say, it's putting on a pretty good show in convincing me that maybe this is the one we really should all be looking at.

Power and efficiency

The Vitara 'S' is powered by a four-cylinder direct injection turbocharged petrol engine that produces 140ps at 5500rpm and 220Nm of torque between 1500-4000rpm. 0 to 62 mph is dealt with in 10.2 seconds - moving onto a top speed of around 124 mph.

The official fuel economy figures from Suzuki are; 52.3 mpg (combined) with a CO2 rating of 127 g/km - although the best I could get was around 44mpg, but then I was not really trying to get near

what Suzuki had said was possible.

On the road

I like the way the Vitara handles - but I do feel the suspension needs to be a little stiffer - saying that, when the road gets twisty - it is more than capable of holding it's own thanks to the ALLGRIP 4-wheel drive system which in real terms performs well. You also get a lot of information through the steering as to what the wheels are doing on the surface of the road - which all helps in giving you a lot of confidence into the corners.

If you do decide to take the Vitara onto a muddy field - or a slippery surface - you can be assured it will do its best to move you along at a reasonable pace, whilst keeping you on the straight and narrow.

Design & technology

My test car was fitted with suede seating and red interior accents which lifts even the most boring of interiors - Not that the inside is boring, but you do sense the Vitara was set out to be more

practical than luxurious.

Space - well let's just say it has bags of it - along with a decent driving position and plenty of room in the back for three adults - even people who are 6ft plus would have no problem fitting in. The boot is pretty good too with luggage capacity coming in around 710 litres.

Some of the standard features on the Vitara S include; LED daytime running lights, LED projector headlamps, ALLGRIP 4-wheel drive system, adaptive cruise control, DAB digital radio with 6 speakers, USB, Bluetooth and iPod, driver and passenger front, side and curtain airbags, ABS with EBD, Electronic Stability Program, Hill Hold Control and Hill Descent, front & rear parking sensors and rear parking camera.

To sum up

Suzuki have done a fantastic job here - and I expect the Vitara S to sell well in what is now a fast paced SUV market.

Massa takes advantage to score points

DESPITE being their weakest track in recent years, Williams managed to score two points from Sunday's Monaco Grand Prix.

Felipe Massa gained five positions during the race to end up ninth, making the most of incidents ahead of him to move up the order.

He was running 12th in the late stages, but took advantage of Stoffel Vandoorne hitting the wall and a collision between Sergio Perez and Daniil Kvyat to get into the points.

"I'm very happy with the result and scoring points," said Massa.

"At the end, I could see Perez trying to pass me on his fresh tyres and I thought 'stay here and just try to get some points', which is exactly what happened.

"My experience as a driver definitely helped me to get points, so I'm very happy."

It was another difficult day for Lance Stroll however, who had to retire with cooling issues six laps from the end.

He was running 15th at the time, having made up two places from his starting position.

Stroll said: "I was driving OK but then we had an issue at the end so we had to stop."

"Unfortunately these things happen, especially at Monaco."

Williams are sixth in the standings with 20 points, all of them coming from Massa, who is ninth in the drivers' table.

FOR the first time in their short Formula One history, Haas managed to get both cars into the points as they finished eighth and 10th at Sunday's Monaco Grand Prix.

In their 27th race since joining the sport at the start of last year, Banbury-based Haas were finally able to secure their first double-points finish, although they may have been hoping for a little bit more.

Romain Grosjean was the car in front as he held eighth position for the majority of the race in what was a relatively trouble-free afternoon for

the Frenchman.

He lost a spot to the Mercedes of Lewis Hamilton through the pitstops, but benefited from problems hitting Sergio Perez's Force India.

"It's the first time we've had two cars in the top 10, so that's really good, especially in Monaco," said Grosjean.

"Lewis got some free air and then managed to jump us at the pitstop, but it's great to have the two cars in the points."

He continued: "We managed to stay out of trouble and I drove as fast as I could. There's a lot more we need to analyse and understand, but we're

growing as a team."

Kevin Magnussen managed to get one point for his efforts on Sunday, but would have been hoping for a bit more before picking up a puncture.

Magnussen started 11th but moved up to ninth off the start and was running eighth when he made his one scheduled pitstop.

But he was forced back into the pits a few laps later with a puncture, dropping him down to 13th.

It would then take crashes for Stoffel Vandoorne, Daniil Kvyat and Perez in the latter stages for him to salvage a point from the weekend.

Magnussen said: "Personally I had

a very disappointing race, but to still finish in the points with both cars is a really good job from the team.

"Even though it's a point, it could have been a lot more and I feel like I've had the most unlucky season of my life.

"It's Monaco and a lot of things can happen. There's no reason to give up, you still push – and that's what I did. I kept pushing."

Haas are eighth in the constructors' championship standings on 14 points, having drawn level with Renault after Sunday's race.

Montreal is the next stop for the Canadian Grand Prix on June 11.

Palmer just a second away from glory

JOLYON Palmer came within 1.3 seconds of scoring his first point of the season after finishing 11th in Sunday's Monaco Grand Prix.

The Englishman, who has had a difficult season for Enstone-based Renault, took advantage of problems for other cars to move up from 16th on the grid.

He was still just shy of getting into the top 10, but overall was pleased with his performance around the streets of the principality.

"I'm happy with the race. The pace

was pretty good and there were no mistakes," he said.

"To hustle the car around Monaco for 78 laps was great and the tyres were hanging on, so you could really push the whole way through.

"It's pretty hard to overtake here, so 11th from P16 was it, and just one second away from getting the first point of the year."

There were terminal problems for Nico Hulkenberg early on, as he retired with gearbox failure on lap 15.

Hulkenberg said: "It was pretty

sudden. I saw smoke coming out from the back and the team told me to stop the car.

"As a driver it's disappointing but it certainly doesn't detract from our potential."

Renault are seventh in the constructors' championship with 14 points.

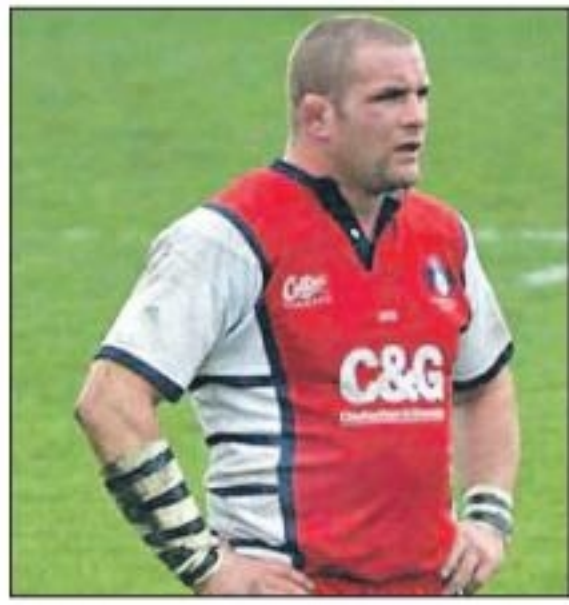

GOALSCORING midfielder Liam Sercombe has left Oxford United to join SkyBet League One rivals Bristol Rovers.

The midfield maestro's departure is hardly a surprise after he was frozen out of the United squad in the final month of the season for unknown disciplinary reasons.

This left United boss Michael Appleton keen to cash in on the 27-year-old, who scored 22 goals in 101 appearances for the U's following his move from Exeter City two years ago.

The deal for Sercombe is believed to be a six-figure fee of around £150,000.

Sercombe, who scored five goals in 43 games in the 2016/17 season, said he was pleased to have signed for the West Country club.

He told Rovers' official website: "As soon as I knew of Rovers' interest,

there was only one place I wanted to go.

"People who know me will also know how much I wanted to come here. I'm very happy and can't wait to get started.

"I want to help this club go forward because in my eyes it's a big club and one that can definitely go places and I want to be part of it."

Scottish side Hibernian, Charlton Athletic, Luton Town and former club Exeter were all linked with the Devon man who opted for Rovers, who finished two places and three placed below the U's.

Gashead boss Darrell Clarke said the midfielder was one of his top summer targets.

He added: "I was interested in signing him a couple of years ago as he is a quality attacking midfielder and I am delighted that he has agreed to join us.

"I'm sure that our supporters will remember him from his time at both

Exeter and Oxford and will welcome and appreciate the way he plays the game."

Appleton suggested Sercombe would have struggled to edge out his midfield competition next season.

He said: "With John Lundstram, Joe Rothwell, Ryan Ledson and Josh Ruffels all fighting for a central midfield place we have plenty of competition in that area of the field."

Another player potentially leaving the U's is centre back Chey Dunkley, who, according to chairman Darryl Eales, has rejected a new deal.

The 25-year-old has been with the club since November 2014 after joining from Kidderminster Harriers but could have had his head turned by Championship admirers.

Speaking at the club's annual meeting last week, Eales revealed a new deal had been offered to Dunkley six months ago.

One player to definitely leave the

club is left back Joe Skarz, who had his contract terminated by mutual consent yesterday.

The 27-year-old made 107 appearances for the U's after joining from Rotherham United in January 2015.

He said: "There are some fantastic people around the club and there are people I have played with who I know will be friends for life."

The defender enjoyed a positive relationship with head coach Michael Appleton, who brought him to the Kassam Stadium halfway through the 2014/15 campaign.

He said: "If it wasn't for the manager I wouldn't have enjoyed the last two-and-a-half years as much as I have. Our relationship has always been good and we had an honest chat just before Wembley in which we agreed on the future."

Appleton said: "I can't speak highly enough of Joe. He is the ultimate professional and a pleasure to work with."

Carroll puts pen to paper

The 18-year-old right back, who has also appeared in midfield, made a big impression in four league appearances during the final month of the season.

The Irish youth international from Oxford said it was a "very easy decision" to extend his deal at the club.

He said: "I have loved my time at the club. The gaffer, coaches and senior players have been fantastic and I want to be part of what is happening at Oxford United.

"I was quickly made to feel part of the first team last season and now it's a case of coming back in pre-season, working hard and listening to the people around me here on how to improve my game.

"I'm a local lad and it means the world to me to hear the fans singing my name and encouraging me.

"I can't wait to get back for the new season now."

Carroll, who has been at the club since he was seven, made seven appearances in all competitions – three of which were league starts.

He made his club debut as a substitute in a 3-0 FA Cup replay win over Macclesfield in December.

The defender hasn't looked back and his determination hasn't gone unnoticed by boss Michael Appleton.

He said: "Canice has so much potential. He is clearly very good player but he also has such enthusiasm and a real winning mentality and we think he has a very bright future.

"He was in and around the first team in the second half of last season and is very much part of our plans, not just for next season but also for the longer term."
