FOR: TROPICAL STORM "ROLLY" (GONI)

TROPICAL CYCLONE: ALERT

ISSUED AT 11:00 AM, 02 November 2020

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 11 PM today)

"ROLLY" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH WHILE MOVING WESTWARD OVER THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

Track and intensity outlook:

On the forecast track, **"ROLLY" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tomorrow morning.** It is forecast to remain as a tropical storm throughout the forecast period. However, there is an increasing likelihood that "ROLLY" will weaken into a tropical depression due to increasingly unfavorable conditions.

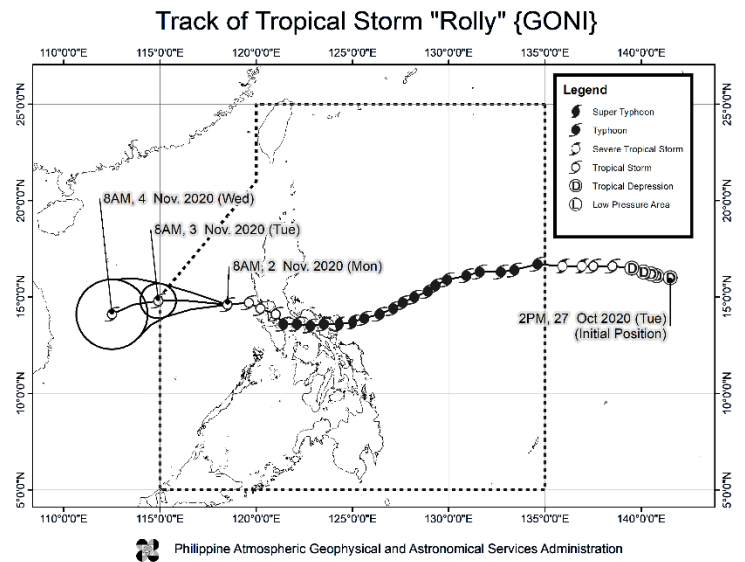
Hazards affecting land areas:

Areas under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) #1 are now lifted. However, occasional gusts will be experienced over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, and the northern portions of mainland Cagayan and Zambales.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- Rough to very rough seas (2.8 to 4.5 m) will prevail over the seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon. Sea travel is risky over these waters, especially for those using small seacrafts.
- Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.5 m) will be experienced over the remaining seaboard of Luzon and the eastern seaboard of Visayas and Mindanao. Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. Inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating in these conditions.

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "ROLLY" was estimated based on all available data at 195 km West of Subic, Zambales (14.8°N, 118.5°E).
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h.
Movement	Moving Westward at 20 km/h.
