



SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN #23

FOR: TROPICAL STORM "ROLLY" (GONI) TROPICAL CYCLONE: ALERT

ISSUED AT 11:00 PM, 02 November 2020

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 11 AM tomorrow)

TROPICAL "STORM" ROLLY MOVES WESTWARD TOWARDS THE WESTERN LIMITS OF THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY.

Track and intensity outlook:

On the forecast track, "ROLLY" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tomorrow morning. It is likely to remain as a tropical storm throughout the forecast period. However, there remains the possibility that "ROLLY" will weaken into a tropical depression over the West Philippine Sea due to unfavorable conditions.

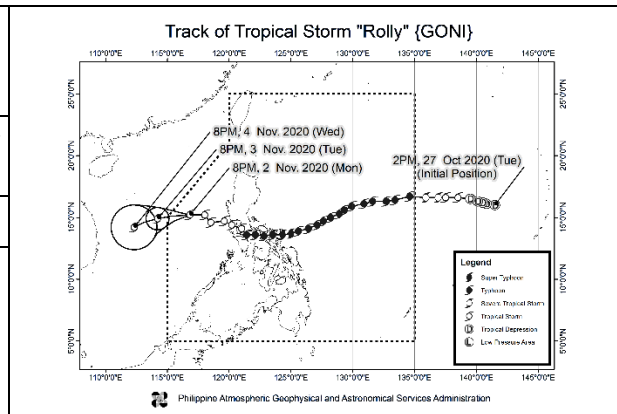
Hazards affecting land areas:

- "ROLLY" is no longer directly affecting the country.
- The northeasterlies enhanced by Tropical Storms "ROLLY" and "SIONY" will bring strong to near gale conditions with higher gusts over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northern portions of Cagayan and Ilocos Norte.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- The combined effects of "ROLLY", "SIONY", and the enhanced northeasterlies will bring rough to very rough seas (2.8 to 4.5 m) over the entire seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon. Sea travel is risky over these waters, especially for those using small seacrafts.
- Moderate to rough seas (1.5 to 2.5 m) will be experienced over the remaining seaboard of Luzon and the eastern seaboard of Visayas and Mindanao. Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. Inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating in these conditions.

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Storm "ROLLY" was estimated based on all available data at 365 km West of Iba, Zambales (15.2°N, 116.6°E) .
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h .
Movement	Moving Westward at 20 km/h .
Forecast Positions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 620 km West of Iba, Zambales (OUTSIDE PAR) (14.9°N, 114.2°E) • 48 Hour (Wednesday evening): 835 km West of Central Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (14.2°N, 112.3°E)
