

TROPICAL CYCLONE ADVISORY #2 FOR: Tropical Depression

ISSUED AT 11:00 AM, 28 October 2020

THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION EAST OF CENTRAL LUZON MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH AS IT MOVES SLOWLY WEST-NORTHWESTWARD.

Track and intensity outlook:

- **Track:** The Tropical Depression will move generally westward or west-northwestward towards the eastern boundary of the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR), then southwestward tomorrow afternoon through Saturday morning. It may enter the PAR tomorrow morning or afternoon. On the forecast track, the Tropical Depression will begin to move generally westward by Saturday afternoon while moving towards Bicol Region.
- **Intensity:** The Tropical Depression is forecast to intensify into tropical storm within 24 hours. It will continue to intensify while moving over the Philippine Sea and may reach typhoon category prior to landfall.

Hazards affecting land and coastal waters:

• The Tropical Depression is not affecting the weather over any portion of the country at this time.

Other information:

• Once inside the PAR, the Tropical Depression will be given local name "ROLLY".

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to monitor for the next update on this weather disturbance to be incorporated in the Public Weather Forecast at 4 AM tomorrow and in the next advisory at 11 AM Tomorrow.
