

SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN #16

FOR: TROPICAL DEPRESSION "VICKY"
TROPICAL CYCLONE: WARNING

ISSUED AT 2:00 AM, 20 December 2020

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 5 AM today)

TROPICAL DEPRESSION "VICKY" IS NOW OVER THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

Hazards affecting land areas:

- Strong winds: Areas under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS #1) will have strong breeze to near gale conditions during the passage of the tropical cyclone. However, it must be noted that gusty conditions are likely over most of Luzon, especially in coastal and mountainous areas, due to the surge of the Northeast Monsoon.
- Heavy rainfall: The combined effects of the Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear Line) and Tropical Depression VICKY will bring:
 - Today: Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over mainland Cagayan Valley, Apayao, Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Aurora, Quezon, Bicol Region, and the northern portion of Palawan including Calamian and Kalayaan Islands. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Babuyan Islands, the rest of Cordillera Administrative Region, Bulacan, Metro Manila, the rest of CALABARZON, and the rest of MIMAROPA.
 - Tomorrow: Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over Babuyan Islands, mainland Cagayan Valley, the northern portion of Aurora, Apayao, Kalinga, Mountain Province, and Ifugao. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over the rest of Cordillera Administrative Region, the rest of Aurora, Quezon, and Palawan including Calamian and Kalayaan Islands.
 - Flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides may occur during heavy or prolonged periods of rainfall, especially in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards and in localities that received significant antecedent rainfall over the past couple of days or weeks. Adjacent or nearby areas may also experience flooding in the absence of such rainfall occurrence due to surface runoff or swelling of river channels. PAGASA Regional Services Divisions may issue local thunderstorm/rainfall advisories and heavy rainfall warnings in their respective areas of responsibility while the Hydrometeorology Division and River Basin Flood Forecasting and Warning Centers may issue general flood advisories and river basin flood advisories/bulletins as appropriate.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

• In the next 24 hours, the combined effects of the surge of the Northeast Monsoon and the tropical depression will bring **rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 5.5 m)** over the entire seaboards of Northern Luzon, the entire seaboards of Central Luzon, the eastern seaboard of Quezon including Polillo Islands, the seaboard of Camarines Norte, the northern seaboard of Camarines Sur, the northern and eastern seaboards of Catanduanes, and the seaboards of Kalayaan Islands. **Rough seas (2.5 to 4.0 m)** will also prevail over the seaboards of Palawan including Calamian Islands, the eastern seaboard of Albay including Rapu-Rapu Islands, the eastern seaboard of Sorsogon, the seaboard of Zambales, the western seaboard of Bataan, the western seaboard of Batangas, the western seaboard of Occidental Mindoro including Lubang Island, the northern and eastern seaboard of Northern Samar, the eastern seaboard of Eastern Samar including Homonhon Island, the eastern seaboard of Dinagat Islands, the eastern seaboard of Surigao del Norte including Siargao and Bucas Grande Islands, the eastern seaboard of Surigao del Sur, and the eastern seaboard of Davao Oriental. **Sea travel is risky over these waters especially for small sea vessels.**

Track and intensity outlook:

- Track: This tropical depression is forecast to move generally west-northwestward or northwestward over the West Philippine Sea in
 the next 12 hours before turning westward or west-southwestward this afternoon. This tropical depression is forecast to exit the
 Philippine Area of Responsibility this afternoon or evening. Afterwards, the surge of the Northeast Monsoon will bring VICKY to a
 more southwestward heading.
- **Intensity:** VICKY is forecast to intensity into a tropical storm in the next 24 hours. However, it is less likely to reach severe tropical storm category throughout the forecast period due to marginally favorable conditions.


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
