



## SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN #25

### FOR: TYPHOON "BISING" (SURIGAE)

### TROPICAL CYCLONE: ALERT

**ISSUED AT 5:00 PM, 22 April 2021**

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 11 PM today)

**TYPHOON "BISING" ACCELERATES AND CONTINUES TO MAINTAIN ITS STRENGTH AS IT MOVES NORTH-NORTHEASTWARD AWAY FROM THE LANDMASS.**

**Hazards affecting land areas**

**Severe Winds:**

- **Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal in all areas is hereby lifted.**
- Tropical cyclone winds of at least strong breeze to near gale in strength extend outward up to 370 km from the center of the typhoon. Destructive typhoon-force winds extend outward up to 90 km from the center of the typhoon.
- In the next 24 hours, the northeasterly wind flow enhanced by the typhoon will also bring strong breeze to near gale conditions with higher gusts over the coastal and mountainous areas of Ilocos Norte, Apayao, and Cagayan.

**Hazards affecting coastal waters**

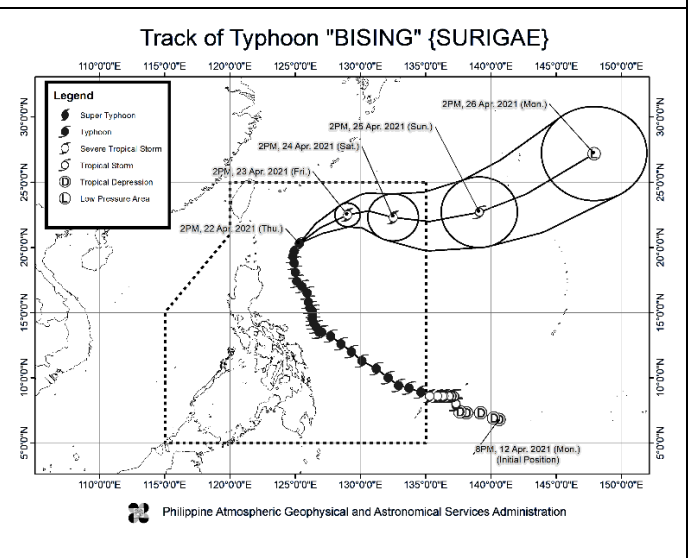
In the next 24 hours, under the influence of Typhoon "BISING" and an enhanced northeasterly wind flow, the following sea conditions will be experienced over the coastal waters of the country:

- Rough to high seas will be experienced over the northern and eastern seaboard of Northern Luzon (2.5 to 7.0 m). Sea travel is risky for all types of seacrafts over these waters.
- Rough seas over the seaboard of Aurora and the seaboard of extreme northern Quezon including the northern and eastern seaboard of Polillo Islands (2.5 to 4.0 m). Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor.
- Moderate to rough seas over the eastern seaboard of Bicol Region and the western seaboard of Northern Luzon (1.5 to 3.0 m). Mariners of small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over these waters. Inexperienced mariners of these vessels should avoid navigating in these conditions.

**Track and Intensity Outlook**

- On the forecast track, Typhoon "BISING" will move generally northeastward today away from the landmass of Luzon until Friday morning (23 April) before turning generally east southeastward or eastward on Friday afternoon. Afterwards, it will turn generally northeastward on Sunday early morning (25 April). The typhoon is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility on Saturday evening or Sunday (25 April) early morning.
- "BISING" will gradually weaken throughout the remainder of the forecast period. It is forecast to be downgraded to severe tropical storm category by tomorrow and tropical storm category by Saturday before transitioning into an extratropical cyclone outside the PAR on Monday (26 April).

<b>Location of eye/center</b>	At 4:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon "BISING" was located based on all available data at <b>390 km East of Basco, Batanes (20.5°N, 125.7°E).</b>
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of <b>150 km/h</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>185 km/h.</b>
<b>Movement</b>	Moving <b>North Northeastward</b> at <b>15 km/h.</b>
