FOR: SEVERE TROPICAL STORM "BISING" (SURIGAE) TROPICAL CYCLONE: ALERT

ISSUED AT 11:00 PM, 23 April 2021

(Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 11 AM tomorrow)

"BISING" FURTHER WEAKENS AS IT SLOWS DOWN OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA SOUTH OF OKINAWA ISLAND.

Tropical cyclone winds of at least strong breeze to near gale in strength extend outward up to 500 km from the center of the severe tropical storm.

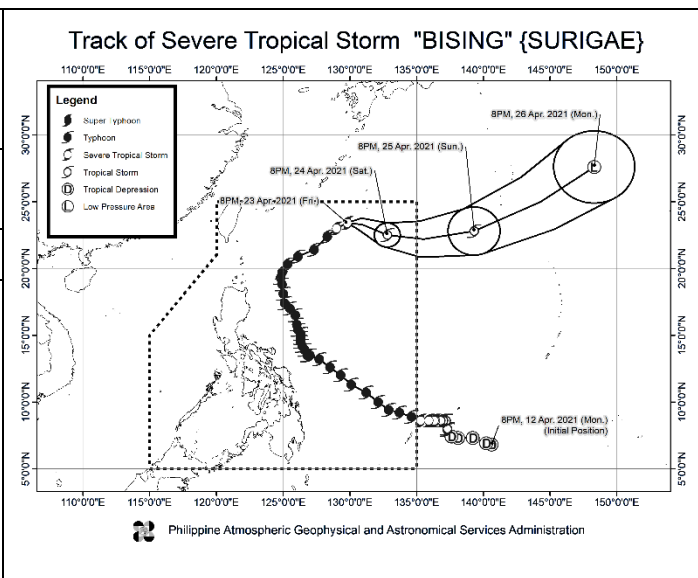
Hazards affecting coastal waters

In the next 24 hours, under the influence of Severe Tropical Storm BISING", moderate to rough seas will be experienced over the northern and eastern seaboard of Northern Luzon (1.5 to 3.5 m). Mariners of small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over these waters. Inexperienced mariners of these vessels should avoid navigating in these conditions.

Track and Intensity Outlook

"BISING" is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility on Sunday (25 April) morning. Further weakening is expected throughout the forecast period due to unfavorable atmospheric and oceanic conditions. This tropical cyclone is forecast to completely transition into an extratropical cyclone outside the PAR on Monday (26 April).

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Severe Tropical Storm "BISING" was estimated based on all available data at 920 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (23.5°N, 130.3°E) .
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of 100 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 125 km/h .
Movement	Moving Northeastward at 10 km/h .
