



## SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN #32

### FOR: TROPICAL STORM "BISING" (SURIGAE)

#### TROPICAL CYCLONE: ALERT

**ISSUED AT 11:00 PM, 24 April 2021**  
 (Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin to be issued at 11 AM tomorrow)

**"BISING" FURTHER WEAKENS AS IT CONTINUES TO APPROACH THE NORTHEASTERN LIMIT OF THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR).**

Tropical cyclone winds of at least strong breeze to near gale in strength extend outward up to 500 km from the center.

**Hazards affecting coastal waters**

In the next 24 hours, under the influence of Tropical Storm BISING", moderate to rough seas will be experienced over the northern and eastern seaboard of Northern Luzon (1.5 to 3.5 m) and the eastern seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon (1.2 to 3.0 m). Mariners of small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over these waters. Inexperienced mariners of these vessels should avoid navigating in these conditions.

**Track and Intensity Outlook**

"BISING" is forecast to exit the PAR tomorrow (25 April) morning. Furthermore, it is forecast to completely transition into a gale-force extratropical cyclone outside the PAR between tomorrow evening and Monday (26 April) morning.
