- On the forecast track, the Tropical Depression is forecast to move northward or northwestward until tomorrow before slowing down to almost stationary status on Wednesday. Afterwards, it is forecast to accelerate west-northwestward and enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Friday or Saturday.
- This tropical cyclone is forecast to intensify into tropical storm in the next 24 hours.
- The domestic name "BISING" will be assigned to this tropical cyclone once inside the PAR.
- Over the next five days, this tropical cyclone is unlikely to affect any portion of the country. •

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to monitor for the next update on this weather disturbance to be incorporated in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast at 4:00 PM today and 4:00 AM tomorrow. The next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.

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
