


## TROPICAL CYCLONE ADVISORY #3A FOR: Tropical Storm SURIGAE

## Issued at 5:00 AM. 14 April 2021

(Valid for broadcast until the next advisory to be issued at 11 AM today)

## THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR) EAST OF MINDANAO INTENSIFIES INTO A TROPICAL STORM WITH THE INTERNATIONAL NAME "SURIGAE"

Location of center (4:00 AM today)	The center of <b>Tropical Storm</b> "SURIGAE" was estimated based on all available data at 1,195 km East of Mindanao (OUTSIDE PAR) (08.1°N,137.2°E)
Maximum Sustained Winds	65 km/h near the center.
Gustiness	Up to <b>80 km/h</b>
Movement	Moving North Northwest at 10 km/h



## **Forecast Positions and Intensities Tomorrow morning** 1,185 km East of Mindanao (OUTSIDE PAR) (08.8°N, 137.1°E) 15 April 2021 Severe Tropical Storm Friday morning 1,120 km East of Mindanao (OUTSIDE PAR) (09.4°N, 135.7°E) 16 April 2021 Saturday morning 775 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.6°N, 132.8°E) 17 April 2021 Typhoon **Sunday morning** 650 km East of Legazpi City, Albay (12.9°N, 129.7°E) 18 April 2021 Typhoon 770 km East of Infanta, Quezon or 510 km East Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes (14.8°N, 128.8°E) Monday morning 19 April 2021

- On the forecast track, "SURIGAE" is forecast to move northward while slightly slowing down today through tomorrow morning (15 April), then turn west-northwestward and gradually accelerate. It is forecast to enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Friday (16 April).
- "SURIGAE" intensified into a tropical storm at 2:00 AM today. It is forecast to continuously intensify throughout the forecast period
  and may reach typhoon category by Friday.
- The domestic name "BISING" will be assigned to this tropical cyclone once inside the PAR.
- "SURIGAE" remains less likely to directly affect the country over the next three days. However, the public and disaster risk reduction
  and management offices, especially those situated over the eastern portions of Southern Luzon and Visayas, are advised to
  continuously monitor for updates on this tropical cyclone. Considering the uncertainty in the track forecast of this storm, a westward
  shift in the current forecast track may result in potentially significant impacts over the aforementioned areas over the weekend (1718 April) and onto Monday (19 April).

The Regional Specialized Meteorological Center-Tokyo Typhoon Center (RSMC Tokyo) has assigned the international name "SURIGAE" to this tropical storm. This name, which is a kind of eagle, was contributed by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea).

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to monitor for updates. The next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM today.

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
