



TROPICAL CYCLONE ADVISORY #4 FOR: Tropical Storm SURIGAE

ISSUED AT 11:00 AM, 14 April 2021
 (Valid for broadcast until the next advisory to be issued at 11 AM tomorrow)

TROPICAL STORM "SURIGAE" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES WHILE ALMOST STATIONARY.

- On the forecast track, "SURIGAE" is forecast to move generally north-northwestward or northward while slightly slowing down today through tomorrow morning (15 April), then turn west-northwestward and gradually accelerate. It is forecast to enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Friday (16 April).
- "SURIGAE" may intensify into severe tropical storm in the next 24 hours. It is forecast to continuously intensify throughout the forecast period and may reach typhoon category by Friday.
- The domestic name "BISING" will be assigned to this tropical cyclone once inside the PAR.
- "SURIGAE" remains less likely to directly affect the country over the next three days. However, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices, especially those situated over the eastern portions of Southern Luzon and Visayas, are advised to continuously monitor for updates on this tropical cyclone. Considering the uncertainty in the track forecast of this storm, a westward shift in the current forecast track may result in potentially significant impacts over the aforementioned areas over the weekend (17-18 April) and onto Monday (19 April).
- The international name "SURIGAE" was contributed by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea) which means a kind of eagle.

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to monitor for the next update on this weather disturbance to be incorporated in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast at 4:00 PM today and 4:00 AM tomorrow
The next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.
