



## TROPICAL CYCLONE ADVISORY #5 FOR: Severe Tropical Storm "SURIGAE"

**ISSUED AT 11:00 AM, 15 April 2021**

(Valid for broadcast until the next advisory to be issued at 11 AM tomorrow)

### "SURIGAE" INTENSIFIES INTO SEVERE TROPICAL STORM AS IT SLOWLY MOVES WESTWARD.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>"SURIGAE" is forecast to gradually accelerate while moving west-northwestward until Sunday (18 April), then will turn northward by Monday (19 April). It is forecast to enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between tonight and tomorrow morning.</li> <li>"SURIGAE" intensified into severe tropical storm at 8:00 AM today. It is forecast to reach typhoon category in the next 36 hours and may continuously intensify.</li> <li>The domestic name "BISING" will be assigned to this tropical cyclone once inside the PAR.</li> <li>As of this moment, "SURIGAE" has no direct effect yet in any part of the country. However, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices, especially those situated over the eastern portions of Southern Luzon and Visayas, are advised to continuously monitor for updates on this tropical cyclone. Considering the uncertainty in the track forecast of this tropical cyclone, a westward shift in the current forecast track may result in potentially significant impacts over the aforementioned areas over the weekend (17-18 April) and onto Monday (19 April).</li> <li>The international name "SURIGAE" was contributed by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea) which means a kind of eagle.</li> </ul>		
<p>The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to monitor for the next update on this weather disturbance to be incorporated in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast at 4:00 PM today and 4:00 AM tomorrow. The next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.</p>		

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
