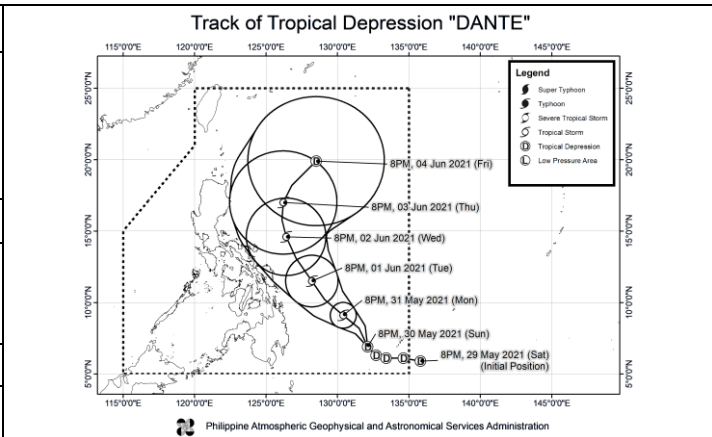
**Tropical Depression "DANTE"**

Issued at 11:00 PM, 30 May 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 AM tomorrow.

**TROPICAL DEPRESSION "DANTE" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH WHILE MOVING NORTHWESTWARD.**

<b>Location of Center (10:00 PM)</b>
The center of Tropical Depression "DANTE" was estimated based on all available data at <b>685 km East of Davao City (6.9°N, 132.0°E)</b>
<b>Intensity</b>
Maximum sustained winds of <b>55 km/h</b> near the center, gustiness up to <b>70 km/h</b> , and central pressure of <b>1000 hPa</b>
<b>Present Movement</b>
Northwestward at <b>15 km/h</b>

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#### HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

##### Heavy Rainfall

- Tonight through tomorrow evening, light to moderate with at times heavy rains will be experienced over Caraga and Davao Region, SOCCSKSARGEN, Bukidnon, and Misamis Oriental due to the outer rainbands of "DANTE".
- Under these conditions, isolated to scattered flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides are possible, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps. Adjacent or nearby areas may also experience flooding in the absence of such rainfall occurrence due to surface runoff or swelling of river channels.

##### Severe Wind

- The present track forecast shows that the hoisting of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) over any land area in the country remains less likely. However, given the uncertainty in its track forecast, any further westward shift in the track forecast may lead to the hoisting of TCWS over the eastern portion of the country.

#### TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the forecast track, "DANTE" will likely remain over the Philippine Sea throughout the forecast period. The tropical depression is forecast to continue moving generally northwestward over the next three days. Afterwards, the tropical cyclone will likely turn generally north northwestward by Thursday and northeastward on Friday.
- "DANTE" is forecast to reach tropical storm category within the next 12 to 24 hours.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 AM tomorrow.
