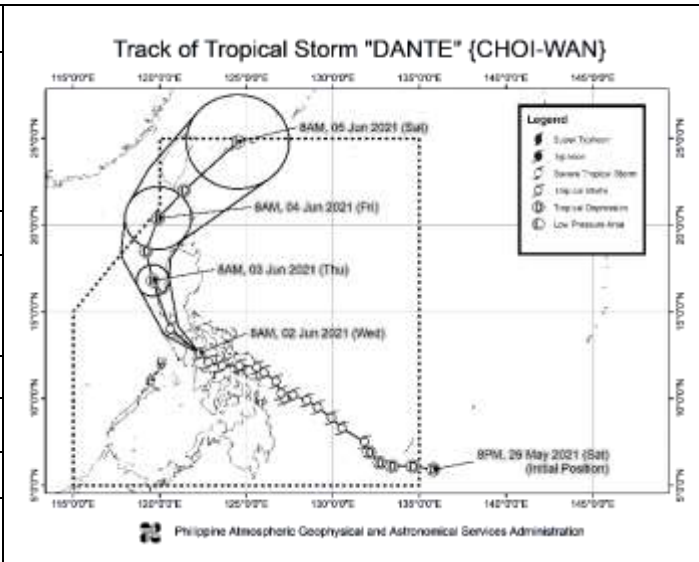
**Tropical Storm "DANTE" (CHOI-WAN)**

Issued at 11:00 AM, 2 June 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 2:00 PM today

**TROPICAL STORM "DANTE" IS NOW MOVING NORTHWESTWARD AND IS APPROACHING THE EASTERN COAST OF ORIENTAL MINDORO.**

<b>Location of Center (10:00 AM)</b>
The center of Tropical Storm "DANTE" (CHOI-WAN) was estimated based on all available data over the northwestern coastal waters of Romblon, Romblon or 115 km Southeast of Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro (12.8°N, 122.0°E)
<b>Intensity</b>
Maximum sustained winds of <b>65 km/h</b> near the center, gustiness up to <b>90 km/h</b> , and central pressure of <b>1000 hPa</b>
<b>Present Movement</b>
<b>Northwest at 25 km/h</b>
<b>Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds</b>
Gale-force winds extend outward up to <b>50 km</b> from the center.

<b>HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS</b>
<p><b>Heavy Rainfall</b></p> <p>Today through tomorrow morning, Tropical Storm “DANTE” is forecast to bring:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over CALABARZON, Romblon, Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Aklan, Antique, Capiz, Iloilo, Guimaras, Zambales, and Bataan.</li> <li>Moderate to heavy rains of Tarlac, Pampanga, Bulacan, Metro Manila, the northern portion of Palawan including Calamian, Cuyo, and Cagayancillo Islands, and Negros Occidental.</li> <li>Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over the rest of Central Luzon, Benguet, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, the rest of MIMAROPA, Negros Oriental, and Cebu including Camotes and Bantayan Islands.</li> <li>Under these conditions and considering antecedent rainfall, scattered to widespread flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides are expected, especially in areas with high or very high susceptibility to these hazards as identified in hazard maps. Adjacent or nearby areas may also experience flooding in the absence of such rainfall occurrence due to surface runoff or swelling of river channels.</li> </ul> <p><b>Severe Winds</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Strong winds to gale-force winds are possible over the areas where Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal #2 is hoisted. Such conditions may bring generally light to moderate damage to structures and vegetation.</li> <li>Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale) which may cause generally very light damage to structures and vegetation may be experienced in areas where TCWS #1 is in effect.</li> </ul>
<b>HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In the next 24 hours, rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.0 m) will be experienced over the seaboard of areas where TCWS #2 is in effect and the remaining seaboard of Bicol Region. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor.</li> <li>Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.0 m) over the seaboard of areas where TCWS #1 is in effect, the remaining seaboard of Bicol Region, the remaining seaboard of Visayas, the seaboard of Caraga, the northern seaboard of Northern Mindanao, and the eastern seaboard of Davao Oriental. Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. Inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating in these conditions.</li> </ul>
<b>TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Landfall: 1<sup>st</sup> landfall over Sulat, Eastern Samar (8:30 PM, 1 June), 2<sup>nd</sup> landfall over Cataingan, Masbate (1:00 AM, 2 June), 3<sup>rd</sup> landfall over Balud, Masbate (3:30 AM, 2 June), 4<sup>th</sup> landfall over Romblon, Romblon (8:00 AM, 2 June), 5<sup>th</sup> landfall over San Agustin, Romblon (8:50 AM, 2 June).</li> <li>“DANTE” will continue moving generally northwestward and may pass near or in the vicinity of Oriental Mindoro or the southwestern portion of Batangas before turning north northwestward making another landfall over Bataan tonight. It will then traverse the Zambales and Pangasinan area and emerge over the West Philippine Sea tomorrow morning.</li> <li>This tropical storm is forecast to maintain its strength until it makes landfall over mainland Luzon. Further land interaction with the rugged terrain of mainland Luzon will weaken “DANTE” into a tropical depression tomorrow.</li> </ul>

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 2:00 PM today.
