

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HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

• A Gale Warning remains in effect over the northern and western seaboards of Northern Luzon (2.5 to 4.5 m) due to rough to very rough seas. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #2 issued at 5:00 PM today.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- "DANTE" is forecast to move generally north northeastward or northeastward in the next 24 hours. The storm is forecast to pass very close or make landfall in the vicinity of southern Taiwan (i.e., Pingtung County area) tomorrow evening. Afterwards, the storm will continue moving northeastward towards the East China Sea.
- "DANTE" will likely maintain its strength until its landfall or close approach over the southern portion of Taiwan tomorrow evening. Afterwards, the resulting land interaction will weaken "DANTE" into a tropical depression. This tropical cyclone is forecast to transition into an extratropical cyclone on Saturday while over the East China Sea.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 AM tomorrow.
