



Tropical Depression "EMONG"

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

- Until tomorrow early morning, "EMONG" may bring light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Batanes and Babuyan Islands.
- Under these conditions and considering antecedent rainfall, isolated flash flooding and rain-induced landslides are possible, especially in areas with high or very high susceptibility to these hazards as identified in hazard maps. Adjacent or nearby areas may also experience flooding in the absence of such rainfall occurrence due to surface runoff or swelling of river channels.

Severe Winds

Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale) will continue to prevail over the areas where Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) #1 is hoisted. Winds will gradually weaken tomorrow as the tropical depression moves away from Extreme Northern Luzon.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

Under the influence of the tropical depression, rough seas (2.5 to 4.0 m) will be experienced over the seaboards of areas under TCWS #1 and the seaboards of mainland Cagayan. Sea travel is risky over these waters, especially for those using small seacrafts. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- The tropical depression is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility tomorrow morning and make landfall over Fujian or Guangdong Province in southeastern China tomorrow afternoon or early evening.
- "EMONG" may still intensify into a tropical storm prior to landfall over mainland China. Post-landfall, "EMONG" is forecast to rapidly weaken into a remnant low.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 2:00 AM tomorrow.
