



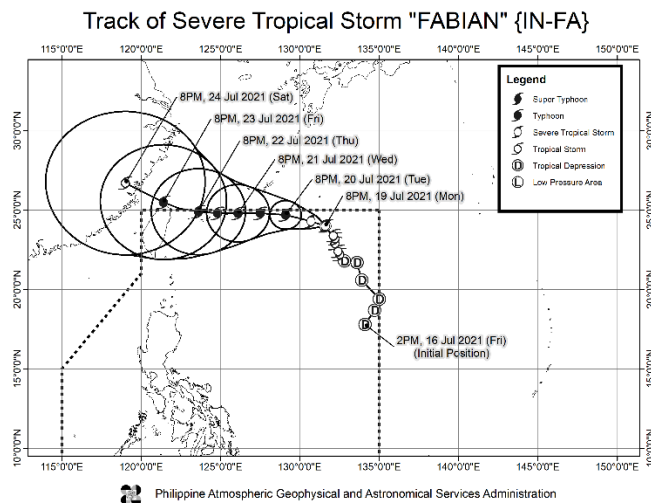
**TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NO. 14**  
**Severe Tropical Storm "FABIAN" (IN-FA)**

Issued at 11:00 PM, 19 July 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 AM tomorrow

**"FABIAN" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH WHILE MOVING SLOWLY WEST NORTHWESTWARD.**

<b>Location of Center (10:00 PM)</b>
The center of Severe Tropical Storm "FABIAN" was estimated based on all available data at <b>1,065 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (24.0°N, 131.6°E)</b>
<b>Intensity</b>
Maximum sustained winds of <b>95 km/h</b> near the center, gustiness of up to <b>115 km/h</b> , and central pressure of <b>985 hPa</b>
<b>Present Movement</b>
<b>West Northwestward slowly</b>
<b>Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds</b>
<b>Strong winds or higher</b> extend outwards up to <b>600 km</b> from the center

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**TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS IN EFFECT**

No Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is currently in effect.

**HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS**

**Heavy Rainfall**

- “FABIAN” is unlikely to bring heavy rainfall in the country throughout the forecast period.
- Under the influence of the Southwest Monsoon that is being enhanced by “FABIAN” and Severe Tropical Storm “CEMPAKA” estimated at 950 km West of Extreme Northern Luzon (outside the PAR) (21.1°N, 112.7°E), monsoon rains will be experienced in the next 24 hours over Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Cagayan Valley, Zambales, Bataan, Occidental Mindoro, and Palawan. For more information, see Weather Advisory #7 for Southwest Monsoon issued at 11:00 PM today.

**Severe Winds**

The latest forecast scenario for “FABIAN” shows that the hoisting of any Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) over any land area in the country remains less likely. However, residents and disaster managers in Batanes and Babuyan Islands are advised to continuously monitor the tropical cyclone bulletins as any further southward shift in the orientation of the track forecast may result in the hoisting of TCWS #1 over these areas.

**HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS**

In the next 24 hours, under the influence of the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by both “FABIAN” and “CEMPAKA”, moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.8 m) may be experienced over the western seaboard of Palawan (including Kalayaan and Calamian Islands) and Occidental Mindoro (including Lubang Islands). Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. Inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating in these conditions.

**TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK**

- “FABIAN” will move generally west northwestward until tomorrow evening, before turning westward beginning on Wednesday. On the forecast track, the tropical cyclone will pass close or over the vicinity of Yaeyama, Miyako, and Senkaku Islands in the Ryukyu Archipelago on Thursday. “FABIAN” may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Thursday evening or Friday morning.
- Outside the PAR, “FABIAN” will turn west northwestward and pass close to or over the northern portion of Taiwan on Friday afternoon or evening before making landfall in the vicinity of southeastern mainland China on Saturday afternoon.
- “FABIAN” is forecast to further intensify and reach typhoon category by tomorrow afternoon or evening. A peak intensity of 150 km/h may be reached by the tropical cyclone on Thursday, followed by a period of gradual weakening by Friday as it begins to interact with the rugged terrain of Taiwan. Rapid weakening post-landfall on Saturday is expected.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 AM tomorrow.
