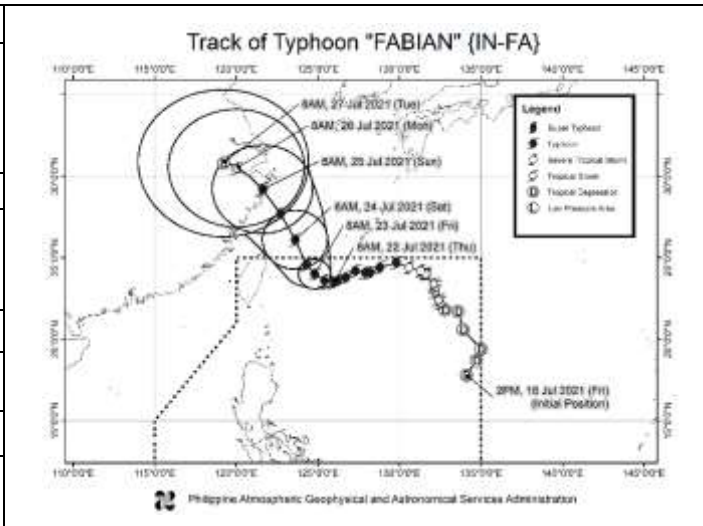
**Typhoon "FABIAN" (IN-FA)**

Issued at 11:00 AM, 22 July 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 PM today

**TYPHOON "FABIAN" MOVES SLOWLY WEST SOUTHWESTWARD WHILE MAINTAINING ITS STRENGTH.**

<b>Location of Center (10:00 AM)</b>
The center of the eye of Typhoon "FABIAN" was estimated based on all available data at <b>525 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (23.5°N, 126.0°E)</b>
<b>Intensity</b>
Maximum sustained winds of <b>150 km/h</b> near the center, gustiness of up to <b>185 km/h</b> , and central pressure of <b>955 hPa</b>
<b>Present Movement</b>
<b>West Southwestward Slowly</b>
<b>Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds</b>
<b>Strong winds or higher</b> extend outwards up to <b>630 km</b> from the center

**HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS**

**Heavy Rainfall**

- "FABIAN" is unlikely to directly bring heavy rainfall in the country throughout the forecast period.
- Under the influence of the Southwest Monsoon being enhanced by "FABIAN", monsoon rains will be experienced in the next 24 hours over Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Zambales, Bataan, Tarlac, Pampanga, Bulacan, Metro Manila, Cavite, Batangas, southern Quezon, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, and the northern portion of Palawan including Calamian and Kalayaan Islands. For more information, see the Weather Advisory #12 for Southwest Monsoon and the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast issued at 11:00 AM and 4:00 AM today, respectively.

**Severe Winds**

Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale conditions) will be experienced over Batanes and Babuyan Islands throughout the passage the typhoon. Occasional gusty conditions will prevail over the rest of Luzon especially in coastal and mountainous areas due to Southwest Monsoon.

**HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS**

In the next 24 hours, under the influence of the enhanced Southwest Monsoon and Typhoon "FABIAN", rough to very rough seas will be experienced over the northern, western, and eastern seaboard of Luzon (including the areas under TCWS #1). Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor. For more information, see the Gale Warning #5 issued at 5:00 AM today.

**TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK**

- "FABIAN" will move generally westward in the next 12 hours. Afterwards, the tropical cyclone will move generally northwestward until tomorrow evening then will turn north northwestward until Sunday (July 25) morning. By Monday morning (July 26), "FABIAN" will move northwestward before turning west northwestward by Tuesday (July 27). On the forecast track, the typhoon will pass close or make landfall in the vicinity of Miyako, Yaeyama, and Senkaku Islands in the southern Ryukyu Archipelago on tomorrow (23 July). "FABIAN" is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility tomorrow evening or Saturday (24 July) morning.
- After traversing the East China Sea, "FABIAN" is forecast to make another landfall over the eastern portion of mainland China on Sunday morning (25 July).
- "FABIAN" is forecast to further intensify and reach its peak intensity (155-165 km/h) tonight. A weakening trend in its intensity may begin on Sunday as the typhoon makes landfall over mainland China.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 PM today.
