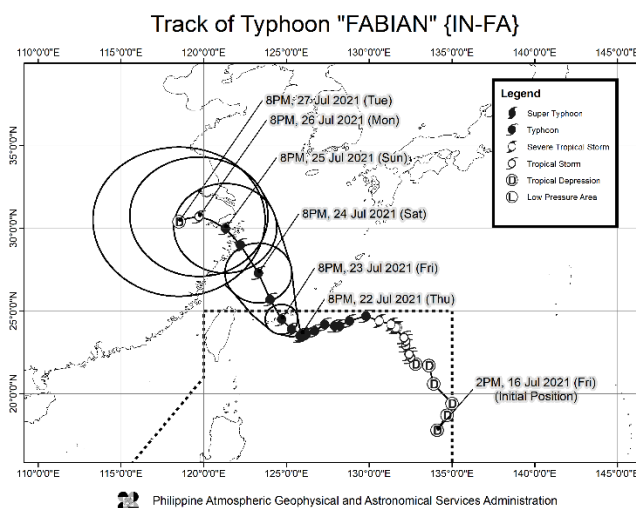
Typhoon "FABIAN" (IN-FA)

Issued at 11:00 PM, 22 July 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 AM tomorrow

TYPHOON "FABIAN" CONTINUES TO MOVE SLOWLY NEAR MIYAKO ISLANDS.

Location of Center (10:00 PM)
The center of the eye of Typhoon "FABIAN" was estimated based on all available data at 515 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (23.6°N, 125.8°E)
Intensity
Maximum sustained winds of 150 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 185 km/h , and central pressure of 955 hPa
Present Movement
Northwestward Slowly
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds
Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 630 km from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS
<p>Heavy Rainfall</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> "FABIAN" is unlikely to directly bring heavy rainfall in the country throughout the forecast period. Under the influence of the Southwest Monsoon being enhanced by "FABIAN", scattered to widespread monsoon rains will be experienced in the next 24 hours over Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Metro Manila, most of CALABARZON and Central Luzon, and portions of MIMAROPA. For more information is provided in the Weather Advisory #13 for Southwest Monsoon issued at 11:00 PM today. <p>Severe Winds</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale conditions) will be experienced over Batanes and Babuyan Islands throughout the passage the typhoon. Occasionally gusty conditions associated with the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Visayas and the rest of Luzon, especially in the coastal and upland localities of these areas.
HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS
<p>In the next 24 hours, under the influence of the enhanced Southwest Monsoon and Typhoon "FABIAN", rough to very rough seas will be experienced over the seaboard of Luzon (including the areas under TCWS #1) and Visayas. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor. For more information, see the Gale Warning #6 issued at 5:00 PM today.</p>
TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> "FABIAN" is forecast to move generally northwestward over the next 72 hours towards the southern portion of the Ryukyu Islands and the eastern portion of mainland China. Although the typhoon will continue moving slowly in the very near term, a gradual acceleration is expected beginning tomorrow evening. On the forecast track, "FABIAN" is forecast to pass close or make landfall in the vicinity of Miyako, Yaeyama, and Senkaku Islands tomorrow (23 July) evening. This typhoon is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between tomorrow late evening and Saturday (24 July) morning. After traversing the East China Sea, "FABIAN" is forecast to make another landfall over the eastern portion of mainland China on Sunday morning or afternoon (25 July). "FABIAN" is forecast to gradually intensify in the near term and reach its peak intensity (155-165 km/h) tomorrow. A weakening trend in its intensity may begin on Saturday and may accelerate by Sunday as the typhoon makes landfall over mainland China. "FABIAN" is forecast to degenerate into a tropical depression by Tuesday (27 July).

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 AM tomorrow.
